

**Minutes of the Meeting of the State Highway
Commission of Virginia, Held in the
Court House at Harrisonburg,
August 9, 1933.**

On the morning of August 9, 1933, the State Highway Commission met in the Court House in Harrisonburg, Virginia. Those present were Messrs. H. S. Shirley, Wade H. Massie, Secretary, and Wm. H. East.

A hearing was given to the people of the counties comprising the Staunton District, on the classification of the roads in the Secondary System. After all counties present had been heard, the Commission transacted the following business.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. East, that the bids for 105,000 barrels of cement requirements of the Department until June 30, 1933, be awarded to the following companies -

Lehigh Portland Cement Company, of Virginia	30,000 barrels.
Low Star Cement Company, of Virginia	50,000 "
Penn-Dixie Cement Company, of Tennessee	5,000 "

at their prices submitted, delivered at points specified in proposal. Motion carried.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned, subject to the call of the Commissioner.
