

Minutes of the Meeting of the State Highway  
Commission of Virginia, Held in  
Richmond, August 18, 1932.

On the morning of August 18, 1932, the State Highway Commission, consisting of Messrs. H. G. Shirley, Wade H. Massie, Secretary, L. Malke Truxton, H. G. Gilmer and Mr. H. Hart, met in their office, State Office Building, Richmond, Virginia.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the minutes of the meeting of July 27th, 28th and 29th be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the Commission award the contract for the construction of 6,350 miles of soil road on Routes 11 and 36, Project 2672 AMI, C.R., Brandy Station-.12 Mi. E. R.R. Culpeper and .79 Mi. N. Intersection Route 11-Intersection Route 36, to the low bidder, Spotsylvania Construction Company, Highland Springs, Va., at their bid of \$15,954.40, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work; \$2,120.38 for guard rail; \$1,200.27 for Royalty on Soil; \$11,417.35 for surface treatment and \$1,587.00 for outside slope stakes, making a total of approximately \$20,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commission award the contract for the construction of Project 26821.2, Route 12, Bridges over Difficult Run and Piney Creek, to the low bidder, C. R. Anderson, Cartersville, Va., at his bid of \$1,355.80, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$2,000.00 chargeable to this work. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commission award the contract for the construction of Project 230421, Route 12, Bridge over Bluestone Creek, to the low bidder, Boston Construction Company, South Boston, Va., at their bid of \$4,821.22, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$6,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the contract be awarded the Standard Oil Company of N. J., Richmond, Va., for 40,000 gallons of gasoline, covering requirements for the Bristol Residency to October 15, 1932, at their bid of 14¢<sup>44</sup> per gallon, including tax. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Massie, that purchase of the Mackiengate Bridge and a right of way 60 ft. wide, for \$7,500.00 by Mr. Truxton, be confirmed. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Massie, that \$2,500.00 be transferred from Route 33, Culpeper to Brandy, for repairs to the Brundick Bridge. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the following Resident Engineers be appointed traffic officers -

Wm. C. Parsons.

Motion carried.

Mr. Walter Taylor, Director of Public Works, Norfolk, Va., appeared before the Commission and requested that additional mileage be added to the state highway system in addition to that recommended by the Chairman, for the City of Norfolk, to the amount of 4.00 miles.

Mr. Frank C. Chapman and a delegation from Portsmouth appeared before the Commission and requested that additional mileage be added to that recommended by the Chairman on the state highway system in the City of Portsmouth.

Mr. Q. C. Davis, Jr., City Attorney, South Norfolk, also appeared before the Commission and requested additional mileage to that recommended by the Chairman to the highway system in the City of South Norfolk.

A delegation consisting of Messrs. Edward Weeks, G. V. Hanger and Senator Woodson, appeared before the Commission concerning the location of Route 15, from Ashurst-West, requesting that it not follow along the ridge as located but go via Monitor.

Mr. W. E. Proctor, Jr., and a delegation from Chatham appeared before the Commission concerning the location of Route 37 through Chatham, requesting that it be not adopted over the straight line, but follow the old road.

Mr. W. I. Green, also appeared before the Commission and requested that Route 37 be located along the straight line survey.

Mr. John Q. Rhodes, Jr., of Louisa County, and a large delegation appeared before the Commission and requested that the location of Route 41 from approximately half a mile east of the Fluvanna-Goochland County line to a point near Zion, remain as it is now located, especially in view of the fact that a convict camp is at work.

Mr. George Bowles, Mr. Shelton, Mr. Perkins and a large delegation from Fluvanna and Goochland Counties, appeared in opposition to this location and asked that a straight line be adopted not touching Fernscliffe.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that the following permits be approved under the rules and regulations of the Commission.

Miss Elizabeth Anderson, Portsmouth, Va., to install drain of 15" terra cotta pipe paralleling Route 12 for 120 ft. and grade driveway to filling station, about one mile west of Alexander's Corner.

Appalachian Electric Power Co., Roanoke, Va., to install one service connection crossover on Route 33, about 1½ miles south of Roanoke.

Appalachian Electric Power Co., Lynchburg, Va., to construct power line along Route 312 west of Lynchburg, or 6900v.

Appalachian Electric Power Co., Roanoke, Va., to install one service crossover near Medley on Route 306.

Atkins and Williams, Haybrook, Va., to construct entrance to filling station on Route 25, at bridge over Sinking Creek.

L. L. Boyd, Louisa, Va., to construct entrance to filling station on Route 29 at the W.C.L. of Louisa.

A. G. Brown, Fairfield, Va., to construct entrance to filling station on Route 33 three miles south of Fairfield.

Paul Callas, Fredericksburg, Va., to build entrance to filling station on Route 31 half mile south of Fredericksburg.

W. A. Cawrse, Orange, Va., to grade entrance to service station on Route 32, about two miles south of Orange.

J. M. Campbellson Son, Hanover, Va., to move one story frame store building across Route 50 by use of rollers on skids, and construct entrance to filling station.

Garys Inn, Manakin, Va., to construct double drive to filling station and sow grass seed in island between drives on Route 19, between Richmond and Manakin, also pull down bank east of station.

Thomas P. Chapman, Fairfax, Va., to make water service connection at residence of J. W. Weeks.

R. E. Cheatham, Lynchburg, Va., to widen fill and move guard rail on Route 14 to have entrance to filling station.

C & P Telephone Co. of Va., Roanoke, to construct pole line along Route 22, beginning about half mile west of intersection of Route 205, consisting of 5 poles and 1 guy wire with necessary wires, etc.

C & P Telephone Co. of Va., Norfolk, to place 125 ft. of conduit under Route 512 at Buckroe Beach.

C & P Telephone Co. of Va., Clarendon, Va., to place anchors on electric light pole 25 on Route 25.

C & P Telephone Co. of Va., Roanoke, to construct telephone pole line along Route 22, using 9 poles, one guy and making one crossing.

C & P Telephone Co. of Va., Clarendon, Va., to erect 4 poles on Route 25 for service to Colonel Williams.

C & P Telephone Co. of Va., Richmond, to string two 134 iron wires across Route 421 to furnish service to residence of W. F. Lewis, 6.68 miles north of Ellerson.

Clinton Webb Co., Millville, Va., to grade entrance to filling station on Route 12, 5.6 miles west of Laurel Fork.

Cold Harbor National Cemetery, Richmond, Va., to construct entrance to cemetery on Route 414 and install 8" pipe under private driveway.

R. M. Cowman, Roanoke, Va., to grade entrance to proposed tea room on Route 207.

Crozet Packing Association, Crozet, Va., to make entrance to packing house on Route 39.

Guy Cross, to operate under Chapter 542, Acts of 1932, trailer bearing state license #571, to carry piling of a greater length than specified in section III.

J. L. Crowder, Stony Creek, Va., to construct entrance to filling station on Route 24 at intersection of Route 48.

Crozet Water Company, Crozet, Va., to drive 4" water pipe under Route 39.

L. A. Curtis, Fredericksburg, Va., to build entrance to filling station on Route 37 half mile west of Fredericksburg.

Cusiman Plumbing Co., New Market, Va., to lay 4" sewer across Route 35 in New Market, for house connection.

L. B. Dutrow, Town Manager, Front Royal, Va., to open Route 57 and repair break in water main near Clevel Street.

L. B. Dutrow, Town Manager, Front Royal, Va., to open Route 618, to repair leak in water main at corner of Manor Avenue and Prospect Street.

Town of Fairfax, to install water service connection to new Fire Department house in the Town on Route 58.

Town of Fairfax, to install water service connection on Route 25 to residence of Mrs. Rita Gobba, in the Town.

Oliver Fout, Winston, Va., to construct entrance to filling station on Route 28, six miles west of Culpeper.

J. S. Gibson, Monterey, Va., to lay 3/4" water pipe across Routes 59 and 600, two miles south of Monterey.

H. C. Godfrey, Hartford, Va., to haul piling of a greater length than specified in section 111, Chapter 543, Acts of 1932, on trailer with N. C. License #24215.

Halifax County Board of Supervisors, Halifax, Va., to lay pipe line under Route 12 at or near the Hotel Filling Station.

L. G. Harrell, Emporia, Va., to build entrance to service station and garage on Route 24 in Emporia.

O. L. Hoffman, Shelby, Va., to construct driveway to filling station on Route 28 about 3½ miles south of Madison.

E. M. Hoge, Bland, Va., to dig trench and lay one inch pipe to carry water to dwelling on Route 42, between Bland and Giles County lines.

W. A. Houston and C. P. Bray, Hanover, Va., to construct entrance to filling station on Route 60, about 900 ft. north of intersection of Route 421, and put in drain pipe; also to make fill on account of elevated curve.

Rodman's Barbecue, Portsmouth, Va., to construct entrance to barbecue stand and filling station on Route 12 near Alexander's Corner.

R. W. Shaffer, Bluefield, Va., to build entrance to filling station on Route 11, 4 miles south of Bluefield.

J.H. Shelton, Goochland, Va., to construct double entrance to filling station on Route 41, 28 miles west of Richmond, and sow grass in island in front.

Wilbur Smith, Denhigh, Va., to build entrance to filling station on Route 59 at Warwick Courthouse.

M. T. Stone, Beaver Dam, Va., to construct entrance to filling station on Route 59, 0.75 mile east of Montpelier.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Richmond, Va., to erect a crossing of 3  $\frac{1}{4}$  TEWP service wires over Route 39, about 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  miles S.E. of Seven Pines.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Norfolk, Va., to install electric power transmission line west of Alexander's Corner on Route 12.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Richmond, Va., to erect one pole on Route 421 at the Wye intersection of Route 50, about 1200 ft. N. of Hanover Courthouse.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Richmond, Va., to erect a crossing of 3  $\frac{1}{4}$  TEWP service wires over Route 19 in Crozier.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Richmond, Va., to erect 2 poles; 1 crossing of 3  $\frac{1}{4}$  bare copper wires; 2  $\frac{1}{4}$  TEWP copper wires and one 5/16" galv. guy wire over Route 421 at Hanover Courthouse.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Richmond, Va., to erect a crossing of 3  $\frac{1}{4}$  TEWP service wires over Route 51 at Solomon's Store.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Richmond, Va., to trim 2 trees and remove 3 trees on Route 19 half mile east of Manakin; also to erect crossing and anchor guy.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Richmond, Va., to erect a crossing of 3  $\frac{1}{4}$  TEWP service wires over Route 41 about 2800 feet west of Skipwith Avenue.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Richmond, Va., to make a crossing of 3  $\frac{1}{4}$  TEWP service wires over Route 420.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Richmond, Va., to operate trailer with license tag #347 to carry reels of cable.

Virginia Public Service Co., Newport News, Va., to make necessary openings on Route 611 and make houseconnection to main already in place.

J. H. Whitaire, Gore, Va., to construct entrance to service station on Route 56 between Winchester and West Virginia Line.

Waiting Oil Company, Troutville, Va., to widen present entrance to filling station on Route 58 between Troutville and Cloverdale.

W. M. Webb, Lawrenceville, Va., to operate trailers with license tags 2117 and 2118 to carry poles.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. East, that the mileage in Norfolk City, designated as state highway routes, be increased from the 22.9 miles as recommended by the Chairman, to 29.4 miles and cover the following streets.

1. Starting at Ocean View, U. S. Route 30, and running over Granby Street to Twenty-First Street -	6.5 mi.
2. Newport News Ferry, Hampton Boulevard, Twenty-First Street, Granby Street, Princess Anne Road, Bank Street, Main Street, Commercial Place, Portsmouth Ferry -	8.86 mi.
3. Commercial Place, Main Street, Church Street, Holt Street, Lovitt Avenue, Park Avenue, Brambleton Avenue, Comptonella Road and Bridge to City limits over Wilson Road -	3.28 mi.
4. Bank Street, Brambleton Avenue, Park Avenue -	1.60 mi.
5. Bank Street, Princess Anne Road, Park Avenue, Brambleton Avenue -	1.90 mi.
6. Park Avenue, over Princess Anne Road, State Highway Route 12 to city water works -	1.10 mi.
7. Princess Anne and Battery Road, over Battery Road, Broad Creek Road to city limits, with a connection by extension of Broad Creek Road from Battery Road to Park Avenue -	1.40 mi.
8. Old Point Ferry, Ocean View, Norfolk, Princess Anne County Line -	<u>8.40 mi.</u>

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the mileage designated as state highways in Portsmouth be increased over that recommended by the Commissioner by 2.06 miles of streets, leading from High Street to the Navy Yard and thence over Geoport Road to Chestnut Street; thence over Chestnut Street to Shell Road, to Elm Avenue, making a total mileage for the city of 7.06 miles. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that the mileage as designated in South Norfolk as state highways, be increased over that recommended by the Commissioner, to include the road from the N & W Railroad tracks down Liberty Street to Atlantic Avenue, to the city limits, a distance of 0.6 mile, making a total of 2.6 miles for the city. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. East, that where additional funds are requested by a city, plans, specifications and estimate must be presented to the Commission for action on each project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that the Commissioner be authorized to pay the cities at the rate of \$1500.00 per mile per year on a quarterly basis for approved work done or anticipated by the cities. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that the mileage distributed under the Big Classen on the road leading from Route 515 near Front Royal towards Bremontown, in Warren County, be changed to read "From the end of the mileage near Stone Bridge towards Route 55". Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. East, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that as the State has taken over the county highways and the Boards of Supervisors have no road funds for securing of rights of way on Route 504 in Franklin and Bedford Counties, that the Boards of Supervisors be released of this agreement. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the tentative location of State Route 525 in Warren County be over county roads 8, 17, 6 and 7, towards State Route 55. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. East, that the distribution of the big mileage for 1938 be confirmed as follows -

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commission maintain the present road between Salem and Roanoke, Route 10, but deny the petition of Mr. R. F. Stokes against building this cut-off. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Massie, that if the county will secure a right of way of 50 ft., in width, free of all cost to the Commission, it approve of the addition to the Secondary System in Bassett County of the road in Occupacia District, extending through Stevens's, Lindsey Hall, etc., to Baird's Landing, on Occupacia Creek. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the request of the Board of Supervisors of Middlesex County, to add to the Secondary System the road from County Highway 211 and public landing on Mill Creek, be rejected. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. East, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the location of Route 41 in Goochland and Fluvanna Counties follow the line as surveyed, going via Ferncliffe. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the location of Route 15, Amherst-West, follow the south line and the one recommended by the State's engineers. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the location of Route 57 through Bath follow the straight line. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. East, that the two streets on which one way traffic is operated in Charlottesville, be included in the mileage taken over under Chapter 415, Acts of 1932, making the total mileage taken over 6.00 miles as follows - "Corporate limits; Free Bridge Road, High Street, First Street, Market Street, Preston Avenue, City limits; Monticello Road, Market Street, First Street, to Main Street, to Jefferson Park Avenue, to city limits; Main and Twelfth Streets, Ivy Road to city limits; Rugby Road from Ivy Road to Preston Avenue; Second Street, from High Street to Water Street, and from Water Street to Main Street". Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. East, that the Commission oil Route 66 from Marshall to Chancellors Corner, and proceed with construction from Chancellors Corner towards Linden, to the amount of the allocation. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that permit #11618, Fairfax County, issued D. L. Peyton, on Route 26, be cancelled as requested. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. East, that \$3300.00 on Route 41, in James City County, be transferred for oiling the road known as the Capitol Landing Road in James City and York Counties. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. East, that \$600.00 be transferred from Route 615 to Route 31, entrance to Agape Church, rather than from the road leading to Ashville as this allocation was eliminated. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that \$4,081.42 be transferred from Route 20, Project 697, Keyesville-Charlotte C.H., to Route 615, Shady Lane to Lanesville, for oiling and surface treatment. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that whereas the rights of way through the Town of Mt. Crawford, on Route 53, cannot be secured except by excessive property damages, that the road be located around the Town. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commissioner be authorized to join the Board of Supervisors in petitioning the Court to direct the Treasurer of Orange County to pay the contractor and the State Highway Department for work done under contract with the county. Funds are in the County Treasurer's bank for this purpose but he will not pay out same without order from the Courts. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the conditioning and oiling of Route 59 be from Virgilina towards Route 18, as far as the allocation will go. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the bids on Project 5761 ACB, Routes 19, 310 and 32, Streets of Farmville, be rejected and the work readvertised, as requested by the Town Authorities. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the Commission award the contract for the construction of Project E 748 EM, Route 421, Bridge over Chickahominy River, to the low bidder, Cobb and Sonwood, Chapel Hill, N.C., at their bid of \$6,804.06; that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$7,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.
