Winutes of the Meeting of the State Highway Commission of Virginia, Held in Richmond, August 28, 1949.

Anderson, has certified in writing that a certain section of the former location of Route 55 (the old Front Royal Turnpike) which runs through and adjacent to the property of E. E. Keister, and others and lying outside of the right of way of present Route 55, Project 416-D1 and North of the Southern Railroad, between approximate survey Station 385/50 and survey Station 428/85 in Warren County, Virginia, is no longer needed for the uses of the State Highway System;

AND WHEREAS: B. B. Reister has requested that the abandoned portion of the former location of Route 55 (old Front Royal Turnpike) which lies within the limits of his property be released and quitelaimed to him.

NOW THE REPORT: as provided for by Chapter 10 of the Acts of the General Assembly of February 7, 1940, the Chairman is hereby authorized to execute a deed releasing and quitolaiming to E. E. Keister, the said section of the former location of Route 55 (the old Frent Royal Turnpike) which lies within the limits of the grantee's land end north of the north right of way line of present Route 55 and north of the Southern Railroad.

WHERMAS, the Chairman, J. A. Anderson has certified in writing that certain sections of the old location and right of way of Route 6 (formerly Route 19), known as the Goodhland Turnpike, and that portion of the land acquired from Mary H. Beattle by deed dated September 1, 1948, and not now needed for right of way purposes, all of which lies north of a lime 55 feet north of and parallel to and/or concentric with the survey centerline of the present location of Route 6, as constructed under Project 617-C, within the lands of Manakin Farms, Inc., are no longer needed for the uses of the State Highway System;

AND WHEREAS, Manakin Farms, Inc., has agreed to convey to the Commonwealth certain lands along the present location and right of way and aforementioned land;

THE THEREFORM, as provided for by Chapter 10, of an Ast of the General Assembly passed Pobruary 7, 1940 the Chairman is hereby authorised to execute a deed releasing and quitelaining to Manakin Farms, Inc., the said sections of the old location and right of way and aforementioned land in exchange for said lands along the present location. meeting held on the 24th day of March, 1949, adopted a resolution approving and recommending the leasing of the Capahosic Public Landing property on York River, to E. Stewart James, for a period of twenty years for the purpose of erecting a wharf, reserving, however, a strip of land thirty feet in width through the same and extending from the present highway (Route 618), to the river.

NOW THEREFORE, the leading of the said Public Landing property to E. Stewart James for a period not exceeding twenty years at an annual rental of One Bollar (\$1.00) per year payable in advance, and upon such other terms and conditions as the Chairman may deem to be proper and in the public interest, is hereby approved, and the Chairman is hereby authorised to execute such lease on behalf of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

WHEREAS, W. L. Shewn, of the City of Morfolk, for several years prior to and since the acquisition of the properties of the Chesapeake Perries by the Commonwealth of Virginia has operated a ship-to-shore and shore-to-ship water taxi service and business, and in connection therewith has leased and/or rented and used a certain portion of said property located at and on the Norfolk or Pine Beach Terminal, and just west of the west and of 98th Street and just south of and adjacent to the ferry entrance; and the said W. L. Shawn desires to continue to operate the said service and business, and to lease, rent and use the said portion of property, and has offered (1) to pay to the Commonwealth of Virginia for such lease, rent and use the sum of One Thousand Two Hundred and Bixty Dollars (\$1,260.00) annually in twelve (12) monthly payments of One Hundred and Five Dollars (\$105.00) in advance; and (2) to render without cost to the Commonwealth of Virginia, Department of Highways, any emergency assistance and aid which might become necessary in the operation of the ferries and property of the Commonwealth of Virginia when called upon to do so by the Director of Ferries or any other representative of the Chairman of the State Highway Commission; and

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission is of the opinion that the acceptance of the said offer would be advantageous, convenient, and/ or necessary to the operation and maintenance of the ferries and property of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

NOW, THRESTORE, pursuant to the provisions applicable of Chapter 599 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Virginia of 1940, known as the "State Revenue Bond Act" the chairman is hereby requested, authorized and empowered to enter into and execute an agreement and loase with and between the said W. L. Shawn for the use of the said certain portion of property, together with and including the riparian rights appertaining thereto, the two wooden piers extending westerly therefrom, and the existing buildings and improvements thereupon, subject to the following covenants, terms and conditions: (1) that the rental shall be at the rate of One Thousand Two Hundred and Sixty Dollars (\$1,280.00) annually paid in equal monthly

installments in advance of One Hundred and Five Dollars (\$105.00) beginning with the first day of September, 1949, which shall be the effective date of the said agreement and lease, which shall run and operate for a period of twolve (12) months therefrom with automatic renewal unless terminated at the end of any thirty (50) day period as herein provided for; (2) that either party to the said agreement and lease shall have the right to terminate the same upon the giving of thirty (30) days' written notice to either party of intent to do so; (5) that the said W. L. Shawn shall have the right to remove the frame office building located upon the said portion of property within thirty (50) days from the termination of the said agreement and lease, but failing to do so the said building shall become the property of the Commonwealth of Virginia; (4) that no morchandise of any kind shall be sold upon the said portion of property in competition with the lessee or user of the property adjacent to and east thereof; (5) that the Commonwealth of Virginia, Department of Highways, nor any of its officials and employees, shall be liable or in any way responsible for damage to any person or property ashere or affort, which might occur by reason of the conduct of the service and business of the said W. L. Shawn, or his occupancy and use of the said portion of property; (6) that the said portion of property and the said piers, together with all of the improvements thereupon and appurtenant thereto shall be kept in a safe condition, and upon the termination of the said agreement and lease be delivered up to the Commonwealth of Wirginia in the same condition as at the effective date of the same; ordinary wear and tour, fire and other unavoidable casualties or assidents excepted; (?) that the said agreement and lease shall not be assigned or sub-let except with the written consent approval of the said Chairman; and (8) that the said W. L. Shawn shall render to the Commonwealth of Virginia, Department of Highways, without cost, any emergency assistance and aid which sight become necessary in the operation of the ferries and property of the Commonwealth of Virginia when called upon to do so by the Director of Perries or any other representative of the Chairman of the State Highway Commission,

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the attention of the State Highway Commission, (1) that it is impossible from the record descriptions and/or physical markings or evidence to exactly determine and locate the boundary line between the tract of land located adjagent to and on the east side of Route 460 just north of Suffolk, which was conveyed to the Commonwealth of Virginia by the heirs at law of B. G. Ferguson, deceased, by deed dated September 25, 1946, recorded in the Clerk's office of the Circuit Court of Mansemond County in Deed Book 156, Page 501, and the property adjacent thereto and south and west thereof owned by Herford Types Cowling and others; and (2) that the said Herford Types Cowling and others have offered, (a) to enter into a boundary line agreement and deed with the Commonwealth of Virginia to fix, establish and record the said boundary line on and along the location, now fenced, heretofore tentatively agreed upon between them and the State Highway Commissioner, and on and along the applicable motes and bounds of the survey and plat of the said tract of land made by the Dopartment of Highways, and on file in its Central Office at Richmond under "R/W File #136"; and (b) to release,

quitolaim and convey unto the Commonwealth of Virginia any and all such property, if any, as they may own lying adjacent to and north and east of the said boundary line in consideration of and in exchange for the release, quitolaim and conveyance on the part of the Commonwealth of Virginia to them of such property, if any, as the Commonwealth of Virginia may own lying south and west of said boundary line.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to authority vested in the State Highway Commission and the State Highway Commissioner, the State Highway Commissioner is hereby requested, authorized and empowered to execute in the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia, and jointly with and by the said Herford Tymes Cowling and others, a deed fixing and establishing the boundary line as aforesaid, and releasing, quitolaiming and conveying any property of the Commonwealth of Virginia, which may lie adjacent to and south and west of said boundary line, in consideration of and in exchange for the release, quitolaim and conveyance to the Commonwealth of Virginia of any property of the said Herford Tymes Cowling and others lying adjacent to and north and east of said boundary line.

WHEREAS, at a meeting of the State Highway Commission held in the City of Richmond on the 29th day of March, 1949, the following resolution was adopted:

REBOLVED, that the Chairman of the State Highway Commission having certified in writing that certain abandoned portions of the right of way of old road, containing 0.12 acre, more or less, and lying outside of the right of way retained for Project 1256-ARI, Route 116, Roanoke County, and adjacent to the property of the Appalachian Electric Power Company, are no longer needed for the uses of the State Highway System, the exchange of these abandoned portions of right of way for parcels of land required for right of way purposes in accordance with revised plans is approved; and the Chairman is horeby authorized to execute a deed of quitelaim to the Appalachian Electric Power Company, as provided for by Chapter 10, Acts of the Virginia General Assembly, approved February 7, 1940; and

WHEREAS, by virtue of ammeration proceedings the aforesaid abandoned portions of the right of way of the old road and the parcels of land required for right of way purposes in accordance with revised plans became located within the corporate limits of the City of Roanoke on and after January 1, 1949, and the City of Roanoke thereupon succeeded to the rights, interest and jurisdiction of the State Highway Commission, and the Commonwealth of Virginia in and to the same, although the aforesaid project was constructed and the right of way agreement negotiated with the aforesaid Appalachian Blectric Power Company when the section of Route 116 sowered by said project or the portion of same along and upon the said rights of way was in the County of Roanoke.

MOW, THEREFORE, HE IT RESCLVED: That the said resolution adopted on March 29, 1940; is hereby rescinded and that the Chairman be and is hereby directed to request the City of Roancke and the Appalachian Electric Power Co. to make the exchange of the said rights of way as recited in said resolution, and in accordance with the said agreement between the Appalachian Electric Power Co. and the Commonwealth of Virginia.

At 10:20 A.M. the Commission proceeded to the Auditorium for the presentation of the portrait on the late Hon. Henry G. Shirley, Chairman, State Highway Commission 1922 to 1941.

All employees in the Central Office Building who had served under Mr. Shirley were invited to take part in the ceremony.

Mr. A. H. Pettigrew, Right of Way Engineer, made the following presentation:

General Anderson and members of the Commission -

At your meeting in March of this year, Mr. Mullen presented you with a picture of our second Righway Commissioner, Mr. Geo. P. Coleman, In making the presentation, he stated "It is not too much to say that his efforts resulted in the firs foundation on which the great Highway System of Virginia has been constructed." We were fortunate in having the Governor appoint, as successor to Mr. Coleman, Mr. Honry Garnett Shirley, who had the ability and foresight to build on this foundation our present System of Primary and Secondary Highways. We, as well as all the citizens of the Commonwealth, are justly proud of his achievements.

Although Mr. Shirley was born in West Virginia, he was educated at the Virginia Military Institute and spent his most fruitful years with us. After graduating from the Institute, he first served as Commandant and Professor of Military Science at Horner Military School, Oxford, North Carolina. During the Spanish-American War, he served as an officer in the U.S. Volunteers. After the war, he worked with several railway ocemanies and later as Engineer for Baltimore County and then Chief Engineer of the Maryland State Roads Commission.

During World War I he was a member of the Highway Transport Committee, Council of National Defense, and in 1918 he was made Executive Secretary of the Federal Highway Council. In 1920 he was again appointed Engineer of Baltimore County, as the suburbs of Baltimore were undertaking a large program of street and road building and the construction of various public utilities.

He was instrumental in organizing the American Association of State Highway Officials, and served as its first President. On July 1, 1922, he came to Richmond as the Chairman of the State Highway Commission, in which capacity he served until his death on July 16, 1941.

Whereas Virginia newspapers were all most gracious in their editorials on his death, in my opinion that of the Bristol Herald Courier stands out nost forcibly:

"Virginia regrets the passing of Mr. Shirley. He was efficient and faithful in the discharge of his important and difficult duties. He was not to be swayed by political influence or deterred by any question of the popularity or unpopularity of decisions he was called upon to make. And he built thousands of miles of modern highways and roads throughout Virginia. It is not too much to say of him, as Governor Price does, that this public service will constitute a lasting monument to his memory."

I am sure that all of us agree with the thoughts expressed in this editorial. We not only lost a valiant leader but a personal friend.

Gentlemen - It was a real privilege and pleasure for me to represent Mr. Shirley's family in presenting this picture of the Hon. Henry Garnett Shirley, third Highway Commissioner of Virginia.

General Anderson accepted the portrait for the Commission saying:

Mr. Pattigrow, Gentlemen of the Highway Commission, Relatives and Friends of Mr. Shirley -

It is a high honor for me to receive Mr. Shirley's picture on behalf of the State Highway Commission. While still in my twenties I had the privilege of knowing Mr. Shirley well. He has been a constant inspiration to me. I am happy to pay him tribute and acknowledge my debt of gratitude to him.

Mr. Shirley was particularly interested in young men. Homan Engineering in Virginia received great impetus from his supert telenta, energy and example. Two remarks that he made when I first met him will always be remarkered as characteristic of this great man.

One - "The first thing a young man must learn is not to take "No" for an enswer unless it is absolutely known to be the enswer". The other - "When in doubt as to what to do, do something. By taking hold we get the feel of the problem and work our way out of our difficulties".

Mr. Shirley's magnetic personality, exceptional sagacity and indomitable will quickly caught the imagination of the people of Virginia. He was admired and looked up to by all. We realised while he was still with us that he was one of the greatest Highway Engineers of all time. His stature, the scope of his vision and his confidence in the future of highway transport knew no limitations.

His profession recognized him as a leader who was always master of the situation. Virginians think of him as one of the ablest men ever to serve the State. Our nation in peace and wer is the stronger because of his work and wisdom.

To all who have made this Memorial possible the Highway Commission extends its best thanks.

Mr. Shirley's picture, Mr. Shirley's memory will be with us so long as there are Highways in Virginia.

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that where studies shown on the pavement bus stops to be seriously interfering with traffic, that "pull off" areas be provided at the expense of the Department, this effecting at present the thickly populated areas on heavily traveled roads, where traffic volume approaches the capacity of roads during peak hours. That where "pull off" areas are provided that buses be required to pull completely off the pavement when stopping. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Wysor, seconded by Mr. Wampler, that the Commission officially adopt the name for the Yorktown Bridge as the George P. Colemn Memorial Bridge. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Barrow, seconded by Mr. Rawle, that at the request of the City of Lynchburg, the Commission mane the proposed Bridge over the James River at Lynchburg the CARTER GLASS MEMORIAL BRIDGE. Motion carried.

Invitation from the Chamber of Commerce for the Commission to hold a meeting in Front Royal was again brought to the Commission, and while it is not believed possible to hold a meeting during 1949 in Front Royal it is hoped that it will be possible to accept Mr. Payne's invitation in 1950.

The Chairman gave the Commission a report on the upgrading and pay increases of the employees of the Department. He thanked the Commission on behalf of the employees for their efforts in securing new and satisfactory salary ranges for all Highway personnel.

WHEREAS, four years have elapsed since the satisfactory conclusion of the war with Japan and:

WHEREAS, it is now possible to secure and retain the services of capable employees and:

WHENEAS, Section 8, paragraph B of the Virginia Retirement Act provides that any member who has attained seventy years of age before the date of establishment of the retirement system, or who attains seventy years of age on or after such date, shall be retired forthwith; provided, that upon the request of his employer in the case of a teacher, or the head of the department, institution or agency by which he is employed, in the case of a State employee, he may remain in service not longer than the last day of the fiscal year during which he attains seventy years of age or if he is a State officer appointed by the Governor, he may, in the discretion of the Governor, be retained in service during such period or periods for which he may be appointed by the Governor. Butwithstanding the foregoing provisions, however, until the conclusion of the war in which the United States is engaged at the time of the enactment of this act, upon the request of his employer, in the case of a teacher, or of the head of the department, institution or agency by which he is amployed, in the case of a State employee, such member may remain in service for such period or periods as may be determined by such employer or department, institution or agency head, with the approval of the Board, if such member is mentally and physically able to perform his duties efficiently, but, upon conclusion of eaid war, any member so remaining in service shall be retired not later than the end of the fiscal year in which occurs the conclusion of the war.

THEREFORE HE IT RESCLVED, that the Highway Commission of Virginia authorizes that all Highway employees who are now seventy years of age or more or who will attain the age of seventy years by the end of the fiscal year June 50, 1950 be retired on that date; and, be it further resolved, that any Highway employee thereafter attaining the age of seventy be retired forthwith; or upon the request of the head of the department, such employee may remain in service but shall be retired not later than the end of the fiscal year in which the employee attains the age of seventy years.

The Chairman made a progress report on the tall road problem in response to a request from the Commission at its meeting on March 29, 1949, that a thorough study of tall road problems be made.

A report was given the Commission on Flood Damage. The Chairman advised that there had not been any great damage this year due to floods but that the rainfall in some sections had been the most intense ever recorded.

Moved by General Anderson, seconded by Mr. Wysor, that the Commission name the Bridge over New River at Radford the "Southwest Virginia Momorial Bridge" and the Chairman advise the local interested organisations that this has been done and that the name plates will be furnished provided the cost is taken care of, amounting to \$64.60. Motion carried.

The Commission was advised of the dedication on Labor Day. September 5, of the Bridge over New River at Radford in the morning and the dedication of the New River Bridge at Austinville in the afternoon. The Chairman advised the Commission that he would be present for the exercises and hoped that some of the members would find it convenient to be present.

A progress report on construction, etc. was given the Commission by the Chairman, who stated that the program was well along and that the Department is now getting ready for winter.

It was also reported that labor, equipment and material are available in ample quantities, and that all that could be paid for could be had. The Chairman also stated that prices seemed to be leveling off.

The Commission was advised that the most rigid control had been kept on the financial situation at all times, a thorough study having been made of the possible need for additional revenues and it is hoped that it will be possible to get by reasonably well provided people are willing to wait for improvements on the primary system to about keep pace with the twenty year plan. The Chairman further stated that he believed the secondary road problem has been whipped and that within the next few years a reasonable road will be available to every reasonably located farm.

A report on the highway programs of adjoining states was given the Commission by the Chairman.

The next meeting of the Commission was approved for Thursday and Friday, October 28 and 21, in Lexington, in order to be present for the Annual Highway Conference at V.M.I. A program is being designed to show that the towns, cities, counties and state are working as a team . In the development of highways in Virginia.

The correspondence with Mr. Remaie L. Arnold, a candidate for Governor in the August 2nd Primary, was read to the Commission relative to the policy of the Highway Department regarding non political activities of its personnel. The Commission was of the opinion that if no reply is received from Mr. Arnold that the correspondence be not continued further.

The Commission eigned the letter of transmittel to the Governor sovering the annual report for the year ending June 30, 1949.

A full report was given the Commission covoring the Revenue Bond Act projects. The Chairman stated that the ferries had been purchased and the money borrowed to make the payment; the James River Bridge System purchase will be completed in September; bids to be received on the York River Bridge on September first and it is expected that a satisfactory bond issue of about nineteen million dollars will be affected.

The proposed Plankitank River Bridge project was thoroughly discussed.

The new ferry rates also were discussed.

Additional equipment for Rockingham County work was carefully considered.

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that

WHEREAS, the District of Columbia, a municipal corporation, the State Reads Commission of Maryland and the State Highway Commission of Virginia jointly entered an agreement dated May 13, 1948, for undertaking a comprehensive transportation study of the Washington Metropolitan Area including all of the District of Columbia as well as adjacent areas of Maryland and Virginia, and

WHEREAS, field surveys and tabulation of essential data being virtually completed, the work of detailed analysis, preparation of final plans, final report, and publication of same, should be undertaken in order that proper and largest benefit of the collected data may accorde to the Highway authorities of the parties of the aforesaid agreement, and

WHEREAS, a new mutual agreement has been reached by the Commissioners of the District of Columbia, the State Roads Commission of Maryland and the State Highway Commission of Virginia as to the scope and financing of the analysis, plan preparation and final report publication, whereby the cost to the District of Columbia will be approximately twelve thousand dollars, the cost to the State Roads Commission of Maryland will be approximately twelve thousand dollars and the cost to the State Highway Commission of Virginia will be approximately twelve thousand dollars, the final total cost to be apportioned equally among the three makers of said agreement,

HOW THEREFORE HE IT RESOLVED by the State Highway Commission that its Chairman, J. A. Anderson, acting for and on behalf of the State Highway Commission and the Commonwealth of Virginia be, and he is hereby, authorized and empowered to enter into a written agreement to be executed between the District of Columbia, a municipal corporation, the State Roads Commission of Maryland acting for and on behalf of the State of Maryland, and the State Highway Commission of Virginia acting for and on behalf of the Commonwealth of Virginia, said agreement being dated April 7, 1949, and to become effective when officially executed by all the parties thereto. Notion carried,

Moved by Mr. Wyser, seconded by Mr. Wampler, that the closing of the following section of road in Franklin County has been advertised as required by law. No objections have been filed in writing in the office of the State Highway Commission and the same is hereby declared abandoned and eliminated from the Primary Highway System as of this date, all as provided by Section 2, Chapter 212, Acts of 1926.

Old location of Route 40 from the new right of way line opposite Sta. 87,40 looping easterly 0.276 Mi. to the new right of way line at Sta. 99,00.

Length 0.276 Mile.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Barrow, seconded by Mr. Harpine, that the Commission confirm action taken by letter bullot covering the location of Route 259 into Broadway as follows:

That Route 801 be placed in the Primary System and designated as Route 259; that the present Route 259 through Broadway be designated alternate Route 259; and Route 42 be extended north on Main Street to intersect with Route 259 at Lee Street and follow the present 801 to the intersection near the Broadway Motor Company. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Wysor, that the closing of the following sections of old Route 6 in Albertale County has been advertised as required by law:

Section 1 - Old location of Route 6 from the new location at Sta. 205,90 looping easterly 0.07 Mi. to Sta. 206,60. Length 0.07 Mi.

Section 2 - Old location of Route 6 from the new location at Sta. 214/70 looping easterly 0.09 Mi. to Sta. 216/90. Length 0.09 Mi.

Section 3 - Old location of Route 6 from the new location at Sta. 222/30 looping southeasterly 0.14 Mi. to Sta. 227/70. Length 0.14 Mi.

Section 4 - Old location of Houto 6 from the new location at Sta. 228/75 looping southeasterly 0.16 Mi. to Sta. 234/40. Length 0.16 Mi.

Section 5 = 01d location of Route 6 from the new location at Sta. 237/50 southeast 0.70 Mi. to the new intersection of Route 830. Length 0.70 Mi.

Section 6 - Old location of Route 6 from the intersection of Route 630 southeast 1.17 Mi. to the intersection of Route 335. Length 1.17 Mi.

Section 6 = Old location of Route 6 from the new location at Sta. 320,75 looping easterly 0.18 Mi. to Sta. 326,90. Length 0.18 Mi.

No objections having been filed in writing in the office of the Highway Commission the same is hereby declared abandoned altogether and eliminated from the Primary Highway System as of this date, all as provided by Section 2, Chapter 212, Act approved March 19, 1926. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that the request to include in the Primary System Route 513 in Louisa and Spotsylvania Counties and Route 606 in Spotsylvania County, having been fully studied and the Commission being of the opinion that inasmuch as these routes do not carry sufficient traffic to pay the cost of upkeep and upon factual evidence does not indicate any abnormal traffic increase in the near future, these routes be not included in the Primary System. Motion carried.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Scott County by resolution May 5, 1949, petitioned for the transfer of Scott County Route 629 from Speers Ferry to the Virginia-Tennessee State Line to the State Highway Primary System and

WHEREAS, the Commission's Engineers have examined the usage of this road and ascertained that no section of the road's 7.6 mile length carries more than 85 vehicles per average day, with as low as 35 vehicles per day on one section and

WEFFELS, the Commission, upon reviewing the facts, finds no warrant for the requested transfer,

HOW, THEREFORE, HE IT RESOLVED, that the said section of Route 629 remain in the Secondary System of State Highways of Sectt County.

Moved by Mr. Wysor, seconded by Mr. Barrow, that resolution passed on Merch 29, 1949, covering extensions to the Primary System in Falls Church, be changed to read as follows:

Washington Street (Lee Highway) Routes 39 and 211 from Arlington County Line to a point approximately at Marshall Street 1.31 miles

Leepburg Pike, Route 7, from the East corporate limits to the W. Corporate limits 2.35 miles

Route 338 (Hillwood Ave.) a distance of

1.22 miles

Total 4.88 miles

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Wampler, that the following towns having passed proper ordinances requesting the State Highway Commission to take over certain routes in the towns for maintenance, the same be accepted:

Edinburg Haymarket Holland Posshontes Portlock Remington Richlands Shemandonh Tusewell Vicana

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Wampler that .

WHEREAS, the City of Martinsville has requested a change in the routing of Route 108 through the city and, also, that the present Route 108 be made eligible for the \$500 per mile payment,

NOW, THEREFORE, HE IT RESCLVED, that under Chapter 214, Acts of 1948, the designation of Route 106 in Martinsville be changed as follows:

Route 108 changed to follow Moss Street from Church Street to Fayette Street; themce along Fayette. Jones and Liberty Streets to Franklin Street, adding 0.8566 mile and deleting 0.7569. This will result in a net increase of 0.0997 mile to be added to the \$4000 per mile allocation to the city, to be made effective beginning the first quarter, July 1, 1949-50.

HE IT FURTHER RESCLVED that the city of Martinsville be made cligible to receive the \$500 per mile payment, as provided under Chapter 499, Acts of 1948, on the deleted portion of Route 106, from Church Street via Walnut and Franklin Streets to Liberty Street, a distance of 0.7869 mile. The effective date beginning the first quarter, July 1, 1949-50. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Wysor, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that the following policy be adopted in respect to private entrances:

- That property owners purchase from a source other than the Department of Highways and furnish pipe for private entrances, in accordance with State Highway specifications and as indicated by the Rosident Engineer.
- That the installation of the pipe be made by the Department of Highways at no cost to the property owner; and
- 3. That private entrances within the limits of the right of way be stabilised (not bitumineus surface treated) at the expense of the Highway Department.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Harpine, that insamuch as Chapter 499. Acts of 1948 provides mileage payments of \$800.00 per mile to cities and towns with a population of 3500 or more, the Commission approve the mileage as set up for the following cities and towns:

Moved by Mr. Wysor, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that under Chapter 214, Section 9, Act of 1948, due to annexation the Commission approve the following additional mileage in the Town of Front Royal eligible to receive maintenance and construction funds as of January 1, 1949:

Routes 12, - From the old MCL to the new HOL of 55 & 522 Front Royal Length 1.16 Mi.

Route 522 - From the old ECL to the new SOL of Front Royal Length 0.83 Mi.

Route 55 - From the old SCL to the new ECL of Front Royal Length 0.91 Mi.

Route 55 - From the intersection of Route 12
east to the old SOL Front Royal
Length 0.12 Mi.

Route 12 - From the old SCL to the new SCL Front Royal Length 0.29 M.

Motion carried.

WHEREAS, Chapter 510, Acts of Assembly 1948, amending Section 113-a of the Notor Vehicle Code of Virginia provides in subsection (a) The State Highway Commission may, by general or special order, which may be amended or rescinded from time to time, increase the maximum weight permitted on the road surface of certain highways, or parts thereof, as in the opinion of the Commission are capable, from the standpoint of the design strength and condition of carrying such maximum weights as prescribed in Faragraphs (1), (2), (3) and (4) of this Section.

AND MHEREAS, Paragraph (3) of said Section provides maximum limits of 18,000 pounds exte loads, and gross loads of 40,000 pounds for vehicles having three or more extes,

AND WHEREAS, Paragraph (4) of said Section provides maximum limits of 18,000 pounds axle loads and gross loads of 50,000 pounds for vehicles having four or more axles,

Commission shall cause every highway or part thereof, on which the Commission permits the maximum weight per axle and the maximum gross weight to be increased as provided in subsection (a) to be marked with appropriate signs indicating the respective weight limits permitted.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that, the State Highway Commission under authority of subsection (a) of Section 115-a of the Motor Vehicle Code of Virginia prescribe the following changes:

HEREBY, orders struck from the list subject to limitations prescribed in Paragraph (3) of said Section, the following highways now in the 40,000 pound system which highways will, in this resolution, be added to the 50,000 pound system.
