Rt. 29, Proj. 472-1-1R: The appropriation of \$35,000 was made almost ten years age for improving the section of present Route 29 just north of the James River Bridge. The proposed Lynchburg Distribution Road will make unnecessary the improvement proposed by this allocation.

Rt. 29, Proje 1605; This appropriation was for sidewalk construction on the same scotion of road mentioned above. As in the above case, the Lynchburg Distribution Read will change the picture and this allocation is not required.

Route 58, Project 1771-06: The appropriation was made for a major grade revision at a Secondary read intersection at which there had been some accidents. The location has been relatively accident-free during the last three years and the project is now unnecessary.

Route 17, Sidewalk at Deep Creek: Local opposition to this proposed widewalk makes it desirable to withdraw the funds.

Moved by Mr. Wysor, seconded by Mr. Regers, that as provided by Chapter 212, Section 1, Act approved March 19, 1926, and upon recommendation of the Commissioner, the following sections of old Route 10 in Chesterfield County being no longer necessary for uses as a highway they be abandoned upon opening of new sections in lieu thereof; Sections 1, 2 and 3 shown on plat dated February 15, 1950, Project 4120-01. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Demrdit, seconded by Mr. Barrow, that additional payment be made to Parsons, Brinckerhoff, Hall and Macdonald, for preparation of plans on the Globe Read, Route 120, Project 529, as recommended by Mr. Mulion, Chief Engineer, in his memorandum of July 26, 1950, to the Commissioner, and that final payment in full settlement for the work be made in the amount of \$49,491.20, deducting, of course, all previous payments on this account. Metion carried.

Mr. Wyser stated that the opening of the read at Mescasin Gap in Scott County on June 7 was quite a successful event, through the efforts of Mr. Ryland Craft and his colleagues. Virginia's Governor Battle and Governor Browning of Tennessee were present. The read itself is quite historical and a masterpiece. It was reported that the name Mescasin Gap came from the fact that the Indians made a path through the gap in seeking a water route and left the prints of their mescasins.

Moved by Mr. Wyser, accorded by Mr. Rawls, that the Commission confirm its letter ballet vote to defer action on the deletion of Route 51 in Spotsylvania County and to give a hearing to those interested at the next meeting of the Commission, some time in August or early September. Motion carried.

A delegation of fourteen appeared before the Commission relative to the deletion of sections of Route 51 from the Primary System in Caroline, Henover and Spotsylvania Counties. Among those present were Judge Welson Waller, Senator Blanton, Delegate Delarmette, General 5. Gardner Waller, Mr. Chewning and others. Judge Waller acted as spekesman for the group, and requested that they be left as they were with this Route in the Primary System. He stated that the people would be deprived of what they desired as it was the only primary read in the district. Mr. Delarmette stated that the history and tradition of the read was well known; it was the old Richmond-Washington highway and that it was paid for by public subscription, and even the Railroad Company contributed. Further, that on behalf of the Board of Supervisors of Hanover County he expressed their opposition to the route being placed in the Secondary System. Senator Blanton, Mr. Chewning and General Waller speke in the same voin.

After a full discussion and most careful consideration, it was moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Wyser, that the Commission confirm its former action and transfer the sections of Route 51 from the Primary System to the Secondary System between Route 1 near Ashland and Route 606 at Snell, offective September 1, 1950. Notion carried. Messrs. Barrow and DeMardit voting may.

Moved by Mr. Rowls, seconded by Mr. Watkins, that the claim of T. E. Ritter Corporation, contractor, on Project 113-488, Route 236, Bridges over Molmos Run and Overpass on Route 350 at Lincolnia, Fairfax County (Shirley Righmay Contract Ro. 3), for time spont jacking up certain concrete slabs adjacent to the everhead crossing of the Shirley Highway, be approved for 38% of the total claim of \$2,012.05, or \$503.01, as recommended by the Chief Engineer. Motion carried.

THEREAS, at the mosting of the State Highway Commission hold in the City of Roundee on the 9th day of May, 1950, a resolution was adopted and duly recorded in the minutes of said meeting approving and authorising the exchange of two cortain 10-foot strips of land between the Estate of Mathildo Townsond Wollos Estate and the Commonwealth of Virginia in sommostion with the proposed relocation of the 80-feet right of way on Route 15 and Project 51-W adjoining the Town of Cape Charles, which resolution provided that the conveyance on the part of the Commonwoulth to the Estate be by a deed of special warranty, and that the convoyance on the part of the Estate be by a deed of general marranty; and whoreas, the State Highway Commissioner has been advised that the said convoyances should be made to and by the Trustees under the last will and tostament of Mathildo Townsond Wolles, doseased, and that the emwayance from the Trustoes to the Commonwealth should be by a deed of special warranty; and whoreas, said resolution provided that the Satate convey a 10-foot strip of land adjacent to the south 80-foot right of may line and across Lots 37 to 75, inclusive, in Block "B", and the Commissioner has been advised that Lots 45 and 64 in Block "B" are owned. by the fown of Cape Charles, and that the fown will convey to the Commonwealth the northern 10-feet pertions of Lets 45 and 64 without nemotory consideration. Now, therefore, the said resolution adopted on the 9th day of May, 1950, is hereby smended to provide that the conveyance on the part of the Commonwealth shall be made to the said Trustees instead of to the said Estate of Mathilde Townsond Welles and may be, in the disprotion of the Commissioner, by a deed of special warranty or a deed of release and quitelaim; that the conveyance on the part of the Trustees shall be by a dood of special warranty and shall convey the northernmost 10-foot portions of Lote 37 through 44, Lots 48 through 65, and Lote 65 through 75 in Blook "B"; that the conveyance on the part of the Cumonwealth shall not be executed or delivered until the Term of Cape Charles shall have conveyed the northern 10-feet pertions of Lets 45 and 64 in Block "B" to the Commercealth by a deed acceptable to the Commissioners. and that Section 33-81, Code of Virginia of 1950 baving been repealed by the 1950 Session of the General Assembly of Virginia, and Title 35, Chapter 1, of the Gode of 1960 having been amended by Chapter 405, of the Acts of the 1950 Session of the General Assembly of Virginia, the conveyance on the part of the Commenwealth shall be as provided for by the Code of Virginia of 1950 as amended.

The Chairman reported to the Commission on his appearance before the House of Representatives' Public Works Committee and the Senate Sub-committee on Reads in May in the interest of Federal Aid for the Federal Aid Primary System. Hr. Wyser stated that in a conference with Senator Byrd recently he learned that the Senator was not in favor of increasing Federal appropriations for reads. The Chairman was advised by Mr. Haywood Boll of Benater Byrd's office that by unanimous consent the Senate was to consider the Federal Highway Ast this week.

The Chairman gave the Commission a review of the tell read situation and is of the opinion that if the Coastal Tell Read is built, that the Department is bound to get into it, and stated further that he had been advised that bends for this proposed tell read had been advertised. That the proposed Pittsburgh-Charlette Read is visualised as another "Pennsylvania Turnpike" and also there is talk of a tell read paralleling Reute 29. A monorandum of August 1 to Messrs, Mullon, Bowles, Maryo and Meliano was read to the Commission re proposed charter of the Old Deminion Turnpike Corporation for Virginia's part of the Pittsburgh-Charlette read.

A letter of July 31 to Governor Battle on "Pressing Highway Problems" was read to the Commission. The Chairman reviewed his trip of inspection over the Maryland Test Read and through Pennsylvania and invited the Governor to take the same trip with him. The Chairman went to same length covering truck weight limits and enforcement; controlled or limited access for important arterials and handling traffic through or around teems and cities. The Chairman teld the Commission of the Governor's courage and referred to his attitude on the everloading problem. He also teld of the trip by Mr. Pettigrow and Mr. Mills to the mosting of the Southeastern Association of State Highway Officials last week and the action of the Association on lead limits. The Hembers of the Commission were requested to write the Chairman and give him the ten most troublesome things they have to deal with in their respective districts as he would like to know more of their problems and how they fit in with those of the Department.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Wyser, that the Commissioner having certified in writing that a certain parcel of land located between the West 80-feet right of way line of Route 460 and the Herfolk and Western Railway near Pamplin, Virginia, is not and will not be needed for highway purposes and has recommended that the said parcel of land be released and quitelaimed to James A. Williams of Pamplin, Virginia, for a consideration of \$250.00, the said recommendation is hereby approved and the said Commissioner is hereby authorized to exscute an behalf of and in the name of the Commenwealth of Virginia a quitelaim deed accordingly, as provided for under fitle 33, Chapter 1, Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended by the Acts of 1950 (Section 35 - 76.6), this parcel of land being a portion of the land conveyed to the Commenwealth of Virginia by Pearl P. Trent and husband by deed dated November 18, 1927, and recorded in the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court of Appenditox County, Virginia, in Deed Book 27, Page 444. Motion carried.

Hoved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Nawls, that whereas, due to the recently approved Pederal Aid Urban System for north and south-bound traffic on Route 11, the Council of the City of Winehester has requested adjustments as it affects payment of the \$4,000 per mile allocation on the Primary System streets and the \$300 per mile allocation on other streets. Now, therefore be it resolved, that the following changes in the designation of streets be approved, affective beginning the first quarter July 1, 1950:

- 1. Alternate Route 11 (Loudoum St.) from Gerrard St. to North Ave., to be deleted from the Primary System, dropping payment of the \$4,000 per mile and add this section to the \$300 per mile streets - Longth 1,003 Mi.
- 2. Route 11 (Loudoum St.) between North Ave. and Cameron St., be excluded from the \$4,000 per mile allowation-Loughb C. \$10 ML.
- 5. The short section of Alternate Route 11 along Valley Ave., between Eurodeck and Loudenn Streets, to remain in the Frimary System and to be renumbered as northbound Route 11.
- 4. Cameron Street, between Gerrard St. and the North Corporate Limits, to be added to the Primary System for payment of the \$4,000 per mile allocation and designated as northbound Route 11 Longth 1.513 Mi.
- 5. Piccadilly Street, between Braddock and Loudoun Streets, to be added to the Primary System as an extension of Routes 7 and 340, payment to be made on a basis of the \$4,000 per mile-Length 0.078 Biles.
- Cameron Street The portion of Cameron St., between Gerrard St. and Gibbons St., to be dropped from the present \$500 per mile officention for City Streets - Length 1.399 M.

The not result in the above changes will add 0.016 Ki. to the \$4,000 per mile payment under Section 38-113 of the Code of 1950; and deduct 0.398 Ki. from the \$500 per mile payment under Section 38-113.2 of the Code of 1950. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rowls, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that the Commission approve the annual budget for the fiscal year September 1, 1950 to August 31, 1951, for the Revenue Bond Act Projects, a total budget of \$1,185,500, with the reserve maintenance fund of \$375,000.00. Motion carried,

The Commission signed the letter of transmittal to the Governor covering the annual report for the year ending June 30, 1950, and the Chairman was instructed to forward this to the Governor. A copy was mailed to each number of the Commission.

A copy of the annual report on conditions and operations of the James River Bridge System, Chesapeake Ferries and the York River Bridge for the fiscal year 1948-1950 will be mailed to the members of the Commission.

AMSCIVED that the Chairman of the State Highway Consission having certified in writing that a certain portion of the right of way sequired for the proposed new location of Route 207 lying outside of the right of way retained for proposed Route 207, Project 1465-C, Caroline County, and lying along and adjacent to the lands of F. W. Campbell and Catherine A. Campbell, his wife (being the center of present Route 207), is no longer needed for the uses of the State Highway System, or for the benefit of any other party or parties, the conveyance of the said portion of right of way to said Campbell in accordance with an agreement with him, dated May 22, 1980, is approved; and the Chairman is hereby authorised to execute a deed of quitolaim to him, as provided for under Title 33, Chapter 1, Code of Virginia of 1960, as amended by Chapter 403, Acts of Assembly of 1950.

Anderson, has certified in writing that a certain portion of the land acquired from W. Parker and Mary C. Richardson on Project 1400-E3. Route 550, Fairfax County, is no longer needed for the uses of the State High-way System; and whereas, the Commonwealth has acquired certain land from J. Guy Springman and Anna C. Springman for the construction of said Project 1400-E3, Route 550 and as part payment for same has agreed to convey to said J. Guy Springman and Anna C. Springman above mentioned residue parcel of land. Now, therefore, he it resolved, that in consideration of the premises, the Chairman is hereby authorised, as provided under fitle 55, Chapter 1, Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended by Chapter 405, Acts of Assembly of 1950, to execute a quitelaim deed to said Springman for the said portion of land.

WHEREAS, Walter G. Andrews, Town Manager of Galax, Virginia, has requested in writing that an easement be granted the Town of Galax for the construction of a charmel change for a Flood Control Project under the bridge over Chestaut Creek on Route 58, Project 1065-M3; and whoreas, the Chairman, J. A. Anderson, has recommended, in writing, that the easement requested by the Town of Galax be approved; now, therefore, be it resolved, that in consideration of the premises, the Chairman is hereby authorised, as provided for under Title 35, Chapter 1, Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended by Chapter 403, Acts of Assembly of 1950, to execute a quitelaim deed of casement to the said Town of Galax for the said casement.

WHEREAS, the Chairman of the State Highway Commission, J. A. Anderson, has certified in writing that certain parcols of land acquired from Carl H. Adoms by dood dated March 14, 1960, recorded in Dood Book 130, Page 156, Russell County, and from Jone Adone by deed dated March 14, 1980, recorded in Dood Book 130, Page 196, Russell County, in connection with the construction of Route 64, Project 4683-01, are no longer needed for the uses of the State Highway System and whereas, the Commonwoolth has acquired cortain lands from W. P. Gibson, Jr., for the construction of Route 64, Project 4685-01, Russell County, in accordance with the provisions of an option-agreement dated May 16, 1950, which instrument provided for the conveyance of the said parcels of land to the said Gibson, now, therefore, be it resolved, that in consideration of the proxises, the Chairman is hereby authorized as provided for under Title 35, Chapter 1, Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended by Chapter 405, Acts of Assembly of 1950, to execute a quitclaim deed to said W. WHEREAS, the Chairman of the State Highway Commission, J. A. Anderson, has certified in writing that a certain section of the right of way of the old location of Route 11, shown on Shoot No. 10 of Project 1145-A abandoned by the Highway Commission on December 15, 1938, is no longer needed for the uses of the State Highway System; and whereas, the Commonwealth has acquired certain lands from the J. P. Alexander Hetate for the construction of Project No. 1651-02, Route 11, in Rockbridge County, in accordance with the provisions of an option-agreement dated May 17, 1950, which instrument provides for the convoyance of the said pertion of all Route 11 to the said J. P. Alexander Estate; now, therefore, be it resolved, that in consideration of the promises, the Chairman is hereby authorised, as provided for under Title 55. Chapter 1, Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended by Chapter 405, Acts of Assembly of 1950, to execute a quitelain deed to said J. P. Anderson, has cortified in writing that a certain strip of the old location of Route 18, shown on Sheet 12 of plans for Project 3028-01, Craig County, is no longer needed for the uses of the State Highway System; and whereas, the Commonwealth has acquired certain lands from Frenchie Reynolds for the improvement and construction of Route 18, Project 3022-01, Craig County, in accordance with the provisions of an Option-agreement dated June 8, 1980, which instrument provides for the conveyance of the said portion of old Route 18 to said Frenchie Reynolds; now, therefore, be it resolved, that in consideration of the premises, the Chairman is bereby authorized, as provided under Title 35, Chapter 1, Code of Virginia of 1980, as amended by Chapter 405, Acts of Assembly of 1960, to execute a quitelaim deed to said Frenchie Reynolds to the said right of way of the old location of Route 18.

THESELVED, that the Chairman of the State Highway Commission having certified in writing that certain portion of the land acquired from the Comp Manufacturing Company on Route 58, Project 160-4Wl, Isle of Wight County by doed dated June 5, 1986, recorded in Dood Book 109, Page 594, which lies between a line one foot South of the south edge of the sidewalk and the lands of the said Camp Manufacturing Company, between Stations 1,00 and 7,45, is no longer needed for the uses of the State Bighmay System, or other road purposes: the release and quitelaim of the land not required to the Comp Manufacturing Company is approved; and the Chairman of the State Highway Commission is hereby authorized, as provided for under fittle 33, Chapter 1, Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended by Chapter 405, Acts of Assembly of 1950, in consideration of the conveyance by the Camp Manufacturing Company by doed of general warranty to the Commonwealth of Virginia of that portion of its lands needed for the releastion or reconstruction or other improvement of the north side of said Route and Project, to make deed of quitelain to the Camp Manufacturing Company. Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Harpine, that whereas, under the provisions of Chapter 136, Acts of 1950 (Section 55-60.2 of the Code of Virginia, amended) the governing bedies of incorporated towns having less than 3,500 inhabitants are obligated to elect a choice under which to operate its Secondary System, now therefore be it resolved, that allocation to the following towns for payment at a rate of \$300 per mile on streets mouting the required standards, having an unrestricted right of way of not less than 30 feet and a hard surfaced width of not less than 12 feet, be made effective beginning the first quarter, July 1, 1950:

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. DoHardit, that whereas, applicable to Section 33-115.2 of the 1950 Code of Virginia (amended), cities and incorporated towns having a population above 3,500 are eligible to receive \$500 per mile annually on streets having an unrestricted right of way width of not less than thirty feet and a hard surface width of not less than sixteen feet, now, therefore, be it resolved, that offective beginning the first quarter, July 1, 1950, additional mileage at the rate of \$500 per mile be approved by the Highway Commission as follows:

Moved by General Anderson, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that whereas, by terms of an amnusation decree by the Circuit Court of Grayson County, effective March 29, 1950, the corporate boundaries of the Town of Galax were extended and the population increased to exceed 5,800 inhabitants, now, therefore, be it resolved, that in accordance with a resolution by the Town Gouncil of Galax dated July 10, 1950, that the following mileage on Primary System Routes be approved as designated streets within the Town of Galax for payment of \$4,000 per mile, as provided by Chapter 495, Section 9, Acts of 1948:

U. S. Route 58-from the cost to the west corporate limits - - - - 3.545 Mi. Route 89(Main St.)-from intersection of Rt.58 S. to Marthur St. - 0.765 Mi. Route 89-from McArthur Street south to the SOL Galax - - - - - - 0.585 Mi. TOTAL ADDITION - - - - 4.671 Mi.

Bo it further resolved, that the Town of Galax be made eligible to receive the \$500 per mile payment on other streets totaling 4.10 miles and meeting the required standards, having a minimum 40 feet right of way and 20 feet surface treatment, as provided under Chapter 499, Acts of 1948. The above changes to become effective as of April 1, 1950, the date of the annexation, and the first payments after approval by the Highway Commission shall have deducted from them the state funds expended on the Primary and Secondary System reads after April 1, 1950 and until these streets are accepted by the Highway Commission and turned over to the Town of Galax, Notion carried.

On August 23, 1949, at a regular meeting of the Commission the policy was adopted to retire all employees who reached the age of seventy years on ar before July 1, 1950. In view of the interest in several cases of employees retired July 18 of this year the Commission carefully reconsidered its fermer action. On motion of Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Wyser, the Commission determined that all regular employees continue to be retired at the end of the fiscal year in which they become seventy years of age, and that all hourly employees be dropped from the payrell at the end of the fiscal year in which they attain the age of seventy years. Further, that in cases of emergency where suitable relief employees cannot be obtained that temperary employment of not more than 30 days be given the retired employees, and after that period of time not more than 3 or 4 days in any 2 weeks period. The notion carried.

The Commission was advised that due to the weighing program the Budget Office had approved the employment of additional State Police to do the necessary work, the expenses of the employees to be charged to the Highway Department.

The Chairman advised the Commission that the Annual Highway Conference would be hold at V.M.I., Lexington, October 12-15 and planned to have a Commission Meeting at that time. A resume of the program and speakers was given the Commission.

The Commissioner explained to the Commission the efforts that had been made in the last few years to secure full cooperation of the railroads and a program of grade crossing elimination. Legislation was prepared for the 1950 session of the General Assembly which would have put those cooperative measures into effect. It was felt that the Highway Commission was making full plans to deal with the railroads on a realistic and generous basis. Only one railroad in the State agreed to the program. The 1950 session of the General Assembly strongthened the laws requiring railroad participation in grade crossing elimination. The Atlantic Coast Line Railroad was notified that under the State law it would be expected to participate in the elimination of the grade crossing on Route 60 just west of Richmond. The A.O.L. Railroad has propared a brief to be presented to the State Corporation Commission. The hearing is set for October 10, 1950.

Letter of August 8 written by the Commissioner to General L. T. Gerow, c/o 2nd Army Headquarters, Fort George C. Heade, Maryland, was read to the Commission relative to Access Highways for Metropolitan Washington. A copy of the letter to General Gerow has been referred to the Chief of Transportation, Department of the Army, which agency is prisarily concerned with such matters.

The Commissioners were asked for any suggestions that they might wish to make or any matters they wished to bring up or discuss.

A report from the Chief Engineer was presented to the Commission which dealt with the natorial and equipment development attributed to the Korean situation. It was pointed out that for some items prices were advencing and deliveries slowing down. It was also pointed out that in some areas labor is again becoming scarce. The Chief Engineer's report showed that unless conditions get much werse than they are at present it is believed that the work of the Department will proceed at a normal rate.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at neon.
