MINUTES OF MEETING OF STATE HIGHWAY AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

Richmond, Virginia

August 17, 1978

The monthly meeting of the State Highway and Transportation Commission was held at the Central Highway Office in Richmond, Virginia, on August 17, 1978, at 10 a.m. The chairman, Mr. Harold C. King, presided.

Present: Messrs. King, Crowe, Fralin, Glass, Hall, Landes, Roos, and Wrench.

Absent: Messrs. Hassell, Hooper, and Robinson.

On motion of Mr. Glass, seconded by Mr. Fralin, the minutes of the meeting of July 20, 1978, were approved.

On motion of Mr. Glass, seconded by Mr. Fralin, permits issued from July 20, 1978, to August 16, 1978, inclusive, as shown by records of the Department, were approved.

WHEREAS, Section 33.7-185 of the Code of Virginia excludes in cases of emergency the requirement for advertisement of bids, the Chief Engineer has entered into an emergency contract with the State Contracting and Stone Company, a division of Medusa Aggregates Company of Elkhorn. Kentucky, to contract and complete the work formerly covered under the Contee' contract in the amount of \$3,265,496.85. This contract agreement is concurred in by written agreement with the Fidelity and Deposit Company of Maryland:
