### MEETING OF THE COMMONWEALTH TRANSPORTATION BOARD

1401 E. Broad Street Richmond, Virginia August 15, 1996 10:00 a.m.

The monthly meeting of the Commonwealth Transportation Board was held in the Board Room of the Department of Transportation in Richmond, Virginia, on August 15, 1996, at 10:00 a.m. The Chairman, Dr. Robert E. Martinez, presided.

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Present: Messrs. Gehr, Byrd, Cogbill, Grubb, Lee, Martin, Myers, Neale, Newcomb, Prettyman, Roudabush and White and Mrs. Lionberger.

Absent: Messrs. Porter and Rich.

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Item 2:

On motion of Mr. White, seconded by Mrs. Lionberger, the minutes of the meeting of May 9, 1996, were approved.

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Item 3:

On motion of Mr. White, seconded by Mr. Roudabush, the Board approved Permits Issued and Canceled from July 1, 1996, through July 31, 1996, inclusive.

### Item 4:

Moved by Mr. Roudabush, seconded by Mr. White, that the Board approve Additions, Abandonments or Other Changes in the Secondary System from July 1, 1996, through July 31, 1996, inclusive.

Motion carried.

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### Item 5:

Moved by Mr. Cogbill, seconded by Mr. Grubb, that

WHEREAS, by virtue of Section 33-26, roads within the grounds of Elko Tract were included in the Primary System of State Highways and numbered State Route 380, located in Henrico County; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner has filed an application with the Commonwealth Transportation Board to abandon 1.77 miles of Route 380 as no longer necessary for public use by letter dated June 17, 1996; and

WHERRAS, the Chairman of the Commonwealth Transportation Board had posted at the Henrico County Circuit Court Building on June 18, which is at least 3 days before the July term of the Circuit Court of Henrico County, notice of such application to abandon; and

WHEREAS, the Chairman sent by certified mail notice of the Commissioner's application for abandonment to the Henrico County Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, no petition has been received by the Commonwealth Transportation Board from any interested land owner or the Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is satisfied that no public necessity exists for the continuance of this section of road as a public road.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board in accordance with and under the authority entrusted by Section 33.1-145 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, hereby abandons 1.77 miles of old State Route 380 as shown on the plat dated June 17, 1996.

WHEREAS, certain Principal-Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets within the corporate limits of the Town of Christiansburg are eligible for such payment; and

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the Town of Christiansburg for maintenance payments on Local Streets meeting the required criteria.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the Town of Christiansburg for Local Streets be increased by 2.35 centerline miles. This increase is a result of additions of Local Streets as described on tabulation sheets numbered 1 through 2 for the Town of Christiansburg as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated June 5, 1996.

The tabulation sheets are on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The Local Street additions totaling 2.35 miles increases the total mileage to 79.19 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1996.

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the Town of Orange for maintenance payments on Local Streets meeting the required criteria.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the Town of Orange for Local Streets be increased by 0.08 centerline mile. This increase is a result of additions of Local Streets as described on tabulation sheet numbered 1 through 1 for the Town of Orange, as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated June 25, 1996.

The tabulation sheet is on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The Local Street additions totaling 0.08 mile increases the total mileage to 15.33 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1996.

WHEREAS, certain Principal-Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets within the corporate limits of the City of Williamsburg are eligible for such payment; and WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Williamsburg for maintenance payments on Local Streets meeting the required criteria.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the atreet mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the City of Williamsburg for Local Streets be increased by 0.71 centerline mile. This increase is a result of additions of Local Streets as described on tabulation sheet numbered 1 through 1 for the City of Williamsburg, as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated July 16, 1996.

The tabulation sheet is on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The Local Street additions totaling 0.71 mile increases the total mileage to 25.51 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1996.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the Town of Woodstock for Local Streets be increased by 0.70 centerline mile. This increase is a result of additions of Local Streets as described on tabulation sheet numbered 1 through 1 for the Town of Woodstock, as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated July 22, 1996.

The tabulation sheet is on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The Local Street additions totaling 0.70 mile increases the total mileage to 14.69 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1996.

1144+14 (Route 168 construction centerline) to a point
approximately 93 feet opposite approximate
Station 1144+58 (Route 168 construction centerline) was
acquired incidental to the construction,
reconstruction, alteration, maintenance and repair of
Route 64 and does not constitute a section of the
public road and is deemed by him no longer necessary
for the uses of the State Highway System; and

WHEREAS, the adjoining landowner has requested that the Department convey any and all rights to the former temporary construction easement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33.1-149 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, the conveyance of the said lands, so certified, is approved and the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute a deed without warranty, in the name of the Commonwealth conveying the lands for a consideration satisfactory to the State Right of Way Engineer, subject to such restrictions as may be deemed appropriate.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 33.1-151 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, a section of present Route 656, which was acquired for Route 66 was abandoned by the Board of Supervisors of Fairfax County by resolution dated August 5, 1996; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation
Commissioner has certified in writing that a portion of
the lands, so acquired, containing 0.291 acre, more or
less, lying north of and adjacent to the revised north
right of way and limited access line of Route 66, from
a point approximately 165 feet north approximate
Station 249+75 (Route 66 survey centerline) to a point
approximately 150 feet opposite north Station 251+55
(Route 66 survey centerline) was acquired incidental to
the construction, reconstruction, alteration,
maintenance and repair of Route 656 and does not
constitute a section of the public road and is deemed
by him no longer necessary for the uses of the
Secondary System of State Highways; and

WHEREAS, the adjacent landowner of record has requested that the Commonwealth convey to him the excess lands.

NOW, THEREFORE, the conveyance of the said lands, so certified, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33.1-154 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, is approved and the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute a deed, without warranty, in the name of the Commonwealth conveying same to the adjoining landowner of record for a consideration satisfactory to the State Right of Way Engineer, subject to such restrictions as may be deemed appropriate.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner has certified in writing that a portion of the lands containing 0.497 acre, more or less, lying south of and adjacent to the south revised proposed right of way of present Route 234, from a point approximately 100 feet opposite approximate Station 862+80 (present Route 234 construction centerline) to a point approximately 110 feet opposite approximate Station 864+65 (present Route 234 construction centerline) and also from a point south of and adjacent to the south revised proposed right of way of present Route 234 from a point approximately 115 feet opposite approximate Station 866+20 (present Route 234 construction centerline) to a point approximately 125 feet opposite approximate Station 867+40 (present Route 234 construction centerline) was acquired incidental to the construction, reconstruction, alteration, maintenance and repair of Route 234 and does not constitute a section of the public road and is deemed by him no longer necessary for the uses of the State Highway System; and

WHEREAS, the Frederick County Board of Supervisors and the City Council of Winchester have, by resolutions, requested consideration for funding of certain improvements for the Winchester and Western Railroad Company; and

WHEREAS, the improvements will allow the railroad to increase productivity and efficiency, which will help ensure the continuation of rail service to the localities in this area; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this request is in accordance with the provisions of the Commonwealth Transportation Board's policy and procedures for the use of the funds established by Item 517 of Chapter 912 of the 1996 Acts of the General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, the Board believes that this project is for the common good of a region of the Commonwealth and serves a public purpose.

Item 13:

Moved by Mr. Lee, seconded by Mr. White, that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board on December 16, 1993, authorized the Director of the Department of Rail and Public Transportation to execute an agreement to examine growth projections for the Dulles Corridor, consider transportation alternatives that are needed to respond to this growth, estimate costs and impacts of the alternatives, solicit input from the public and recommend an appropriate course of action for the corridor; and

WHEREAS, the study has completed all of these tasks; and

WHEREAS, the Policy Advisory Committee for the Dulles Corridor Transportation Study, on June 10, 1996, agreed unanimously on a series of recommendations for the corridor; and

WHEREAS, in a memorandum dated July 10, 1996, the Policy Advisory Committee presented the following recommendations to the Board for evaluation:

- 1. The preferred alternative should be a seamless extension, using Metro-like facilities, of the regional rail system from the West Falls Church station to the vicinity of Route 772 in Loudoun County. The term "Metro-like" means that the rail line would be compatible with the existing regional rail system but indicates no conclusion on the institutional arrangements for ownership or operation of the line.
- 2. As the entity established to make decisions with regard to transportation funding in Virginia, the Commonwealth Transportation Board should begin to consider funding alternatives and foster the development of a funding strategy for capital and operating costs of the preferred alternative for the Dulles Corridor. Some progress toward agreement on a strategy is necessary for the inclusion of the rail line in the long range transportation plan for the Washington metropolitan area—a step that is required before any funding assistance can be obtained from the Federal Transit Administration.

3. In addition to the longer-term funding needs of the rail line, the funding strategy should also provide for the near-term implementation and operation of enhanced express bus services in the corridor. In the near term, these services would use the new lanes on the Toll Road, the park/ride lots being developed along the Toll Road and Greenway in Loudoun County, and other existing transportation facilities in the corridor. The services would provide immediate response to continued growth in the corridor and help to develop further the transit market in anticipation of the rail line.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board adopts the recommendations of the Policy Advisory Committee and directs the inclusion of the project in the State's Transportation Improvement Plan.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board authorizes the Director of the Department of Rail and Public Transportation to proceed with developing a funding plan and to take whatever steps are necessary to carry out preliminary engineering for the preferred alternative.

Moved by Mr. Cogbill, seconded by Mr. Prettyman, that

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-223 of the Code of Virginia sets forth that the General Assembly of Virginia has found and declared that it is "... in the public interest that access roads and bixeways for public recreational areas and historical sites be provided...," reserves \$3,000,000 from highway funds for such purpose, and further provides that "The Commonwealth Transportation Board, with the concurrence of the Director of the Department of Conservation and Recreation is hereby authorized to make regulations to carry out the provisions of this section."; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Department of Conservation and Recreation and the Commonwealth Transportation Board have adopted a joint policy to govern the use of Recreational Access Funds pursuant to Section 33.1-223 of the Code of Virginia; and WHEREAS, the Chesterfield County Board of Supervisors has, by resolution, requested the use of Recreational Access Funds to provide adequate access to Robious Landing Park, located off Route 3387 north of Route 711 (Robious Road) and south of the James River in Chesterfield County, and said access is estimated to cost \$109,000; and

WHEREAS, this request has been considered by the Director of the Department of Conservation and Recreation and has been found to comply fully with the provisions of Section 33.1-223; and

WHEREAS, the Director of the Department of Conservation and Recreation has recommended the construction of the aforementioned access road.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that \$109,000 from the 1996-97 Piscal Year Recreational Access Fund be allocated to construct the access road to Robious Landing Park, in Chesterfield County, Project 3387-020-291, N501, contingent upon:

- all necessary right of way, environmental assessments, and utility adjustments being provided at no cost to the Recreational Access Fund; and
- 2. the payment of all ineligible project costs and all eligible project costs in excess of \$109,000 from sources other than the Recreational Access Fund.

WHEREAS, Chapter 391 of the Acts of Assembly of 1993, amended and reenacted in the 1994 session of the General Assembly, authorized this Board to issue Transportation Revenue Bonds in the amount of \$271,000,000 to finance the cost of the projects in the Northern Virginia Transportation District Program, plus an amount for issuance costs, capitalized interest, reserve funds, and other financing expenses; and

WHEREAS, on July 15, 1993 this board authorized the issuance and sale of \$134,060,000 aggregate principal amount of Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Revenue Bonds, Series 1993C (Northern Virginia Transportation District Program); and

WHEREAS, on December 12, 1994, this Board authorized the issuance and sale of \$60,810,000 aggregate principal amount of Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Revenue Bonds, Series 1995A (Northern Virginia Transportation District Program); and

WHEREAS, the Board intends to issue approximately \$80,000,000 in additional bonds ("Series 1996A Bonds") for the Northern Virginia Transportation District Program in October 1996; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 12 of the Acts of Assembly of 1989, Special Session II authorized this Board to issue Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Revenue bonds in a principal amount not to exceed \$600,000,000 plus an amount for issuance costs, reserve funds and other financing expense, to finance a portion of the costs of the U.S. Route 58 Corridor Development Program; and

WHEREAS, on November 16, 1989 this board authorised the issuance and sale of \$200,000,000 principal amount of Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Revenue Bonds, Series 1989 (U. S. Route 58 Corridor Development Program), a portion of which were refunded by the sale of \$91,455,000 Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Revenue Refunding Bonds, Series 1993A (U. S. Route 58 Corridor Development Program); and

WHEREAS, on May 20, 1993, this Board authorized the issuance and sale of \$98,715,000 principal amount of Commonwealth of Virginia Transportation Revenue Bonds, Series 1993B (U. S. Route 58 Corridor Development Program); and

WHEREAS, the Board intends to issue approximately \$113,000,000 in additional bonds ("Series 1996B Bonds") for the U. S. Route 58 Corridor Development Program in October 1996; and

WHEREAS, the Board is authorized to determine the method of sale that is in the best interest of the Commonwealth; and

WHEREAS, the State Treasurer and this Board's Financial Advisor have recommended that the Series 1996A and Series 1996B Bonds be sold by competitive bidding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board does hereby authorize the use of competitive bidding for the sale of the Series 1996A Bonds for the Northern Virginia Transportation District Program and the Series 1996B Bonds for the U.S. Route 58 Corridor Development Program.
