NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that \$238,000 of the 1999-2000 Fiscal Year Industrial, Airport, and Rail Access Fund be allocated to provide adequate access to Morgan Lumber Company, located in Charlotte County, Project 0705-019-221,N501, contingent upon:

- all necessary right of way, environmental assessments and utility adjustments being provided at not cost to the Commonwealth;
- the payment of all ineligible project costs, and of any eligible project costs in excess of this allocation, from sources other than those administered by VDOT;
 - 3. the provisions of capital outlay documentation by the County; and
- VDOT determining eligible capital outsay in accordance with current policy and procedure.

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-221 of the Code of Virginia provides a fund to "...be expended by the Board for constructing, reconstructing, maintaining, or improving access reads within counties, cities, and towns to industrial sites on which manufacturing, processing, or other establishments will be built under firm contract or are already constructed and to licensed, public-use airports"; and

WHEREAS, the Roanoke City Council has, by appropriate resolution, requested Industrial Access Funds to serve Johnson & Johnson Vision Products, Inc. located off Interstate 581 and Hershberger Road in the northwest portion of the City of Roanoke, and said access is estimated to cost \$350,000; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this request falls within the Intent of Section 33.1-221 and complies with the provisions of the Commonwealth Transportation Board's policy on industrial access.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that \$325,000 (\$300,000 unmatched and \$25,000 matched) of the 1999-2000 Fiscal Year Industrial, Airport, and Rail Access Fund be allocated to provide adequate access to Johnson & Johnson Vision Products, Inc. located in the City of Roanoke, Project 9999-128-107,M501, contingent upon:

- 1. all necessary right of way, environmental assessments, and utility adjustments being provided at no cost to the Commonwealth;
- 2. provision of satisfactory documentation of eligible capital outlay of at least \$3,500,000 by the industry;
 - 3. provision of the required \$25,000 matching funds by the City;
- 4. the execution of an appropriate contractual agreement between the City of Roanoka (City) and the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) to provide for the design, administration, construction, and maintenance of this project;
- the payment of all ineligible project costs, and of any eligible project costs in excess of this allocation, from sources other than the Industrial, Airport, and Rall Access Funds; and
- VDOT determining eligible capital outlay in accordance with current policy and procedure.

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-221 of the Code of Virginia provides a fund to "...be expended by the Board for constructing, reconstructing, maintaining or improving access roads within counties, cities and town to industrial sites on which manufacturing, processing, or other establishments will be built under firm contract or are already constructed and to licensed, public-use airports"; and

WHEREAS, on April 15, 1999, the Commonwealth Transportation Board allocated \$325,000 from the Industrial, Airport, and Rail Access Fund to provide access to White Oak Technology Park in Henrico County, Project 9999-043-187,M501, subject to certain contingencies; and

WHEREAS, Henrico County has advised the Department of Transportation that it will not utilize the allocated Industrial Access Funds in the development of White Oak Technology Park; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed that the administration of the Industrial Access Program can best be served by the return of this allocation to the Industrial, Airport and Rail Access Fund.

NOW, THERFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the aforenoted action of the Commonwealth Transportation Board on April 15, 1999 is hereby rescinded.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the \$325,000 previously allocated to Project 9999-043-187,M501, be returned to the Industrial, Airport, and Rall Access Fund.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board hereby approves the reallocation of these funds as set forth and Indicated herein.

WHEREAS, Paul Jefferson Wilson was a respected gentleman and father and beloved neighbor to the many citizens of the area; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Wilson has volunteered many hours of his time toward the betterment of Wise County over many years; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Wilson was a World War II veteran and retired employee of Westmoreland Coal Company; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Wise County has agreed to pay the cost and expenses incident to the placement of appropriate markers; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Commonwealth Transportation Board to honor this prominent citizen, now deceased.

WHEREAS, the former old metal bridge was so designated in recognition of the Henderson family who lived at and operated a ferry boat from the location of the bridge prior to the construction of the bridge in 1910-1912; and

WHEREAS, the Joseph Henderson family helped build the old bridge and housed the workers during the construction of the 1910-1912 bridge; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Henderson and his family gave the necessary right of way for both the road leading to the old bridge and for construction of the bridge itself; and

WHEREAS, Increasing the safety and efficiency of the surface transportation system is a primary goal of the Virginia Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, the Virginia Department of Transportation has identified the use of advanced transportation technologies or "intelligent transportation systems" as one means of Improving highway safety and efficiency; and

WHEREAS, the Virginia Department of Transportation, in partnership with Arlington County, seeks to upgrade the Transit Priority and Emergency Vehicle Preemption System on Columbia Pike to improve capacity and increase operational efficiency in that corridor; and

WHEREAS, the Transit Priority and Emergency Vehicle Preemption System will improve emergency response and will allow transit agencies to provide faster, safer, more flexible services to the public; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board supports the use of innovative technology solutions to deliver improved transportation services to the public.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commonwealth
Transportation Board hereby approves the Partnership Agreement with the Federal
Highway Administration for the Transit Priority and Emergency Vehicle Preemption
System in Arlington County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board authorizes the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner to execute the Partnership Agreement for the administration of the program and any amendments to the Agreement necessitated by the operation of the project.

Item 15:

Moved by Mr. White, seconded by Mr. Sabo, that

WHEREAS, Increasing the safety and efficiency of the surface transportation system is a primary goal of the Virginia Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, the Springfield Interchange is one of the most complex and busiest interstate interchanges on the East Coast with over 370,000 vehicles passing through the Interchange on an average day; and

WHEREAS, the Virginia Department of Transportation, in order to address traffic problems in the Interchange, is embarking on an 8-year, \$350 million construction project to rebuild the Interchange; and

WHEREAS, the construction project will affect the extensive system of Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) infrastructure currently deployed in and around the Interchange, including the traffic signal system, freeway management system, advanced traveler information, incident management, and emergency services; and

WHEREAS, the enhanced use of video images, including the transfer of video images between VDOT, Fairfax County Public Safety Dispatch Office and the Virginia State Police, can improve incident response and mobility through the Interchange during the reconstruction period and beyond; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board supports the integration of ITS infrastructure to improve safety, mobility, and Inter-jurisdictional cooperation.

NOW, THREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board hereby approves the Partnership Agreement with the Federal Highway Administration for the integration of Intelligent Transportation Systems in the Springfield Interchange.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Virginia Department of Transportation work in cooperation with Fairfax County and the Virginia State Police to implement these potentially life-saving technology applications.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board authorizes the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner to execute the Partnership Agreement for the administration of the program and any amendments to the Agreement necessitated by the operation of the project.

Motion carried.

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At its meeting on July 15, 1999, the Board approved the major design features of Route 123 (Ox Road), Fairfax Couty, Project 0123-076-F09,PE103,RW203,C503,B602,B603, South approaches and Bridge over Occoquan River (Prince William County) and Project 0123-029-F28,PE100,RW203, from 2.67 Mi. South Norfolk Southern Railway Co. (Burke Lake Road) to Occoquan River (Fairfax County). During the discussion of the Issue, Mr. White esked VDOT staff to meet with citizens in the area and respond to their concerns regarding the projects. Mr. White stated this has been accomplished and thanked VDOT staff for their time and attention.

Mr. Myers stated he had been contacted regarding VDOT's policy regarding cell towers and asked if changes were being made to the policy. The Commissioner advised that the policy is being applied consistently statewide and remains the same as outlined in the draft Utility Accommodation Policy presented to the Board on November 21, 1996. The proposed draft of the policy has been submitted for publication for public participation.

Commissioner Gehr announced the awards presented to VDOT at the recent American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials National Transportation Public Affairs Workshop. Awards were received for the Springfield Interchange website, the Springfield Interchange newsletter and for the radio public service announcements for Adopt-a-highway.

Mr. James W. Atwell, Assistant Commissioner for Finance, has received the National Council of Public/Private Partnership's Leadership Award.
