WHEREAS, Route 19, State Highway Project 6019-083-106, RW-201, C-501 in Russell County, was designated as a Limited Access Highway by the Commonwealth Transportation Board on May 21, 1970; and

WHEREAS, in connection with the said Route 19, the Commonwealth acquired certain limited access control rights along Route 19 from Benjamin F. Gilmer, Jr., et al by deed dated February 9, 1978, recorded in Deed Book 279, Page 344 in the Office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Russell County; and

WHEREAS, on Route 19, State Highway Project 6019-083-106, RW-201, C-505, a limited access control break on the south existing right of way and limited access control line was established at approximate Station 464+00 (slip ramp, right out only) for the purpose of serving an industrial service road; and

WHEREAS, the land along the south existing right of way and limited access line of the said Route 19 project has been proposed for additional development and will require a limited access control break of a maximum of 100 feet at approximate Station 460+00 (50 feet both sides, signalized entrance with median break); and

WHEREAS, the developer has proposed the one main signalized entrance and median break at approximate Station 460+00 and requests the said limited access control break; and

WHEREAS, all parties are in agreement to close the said limited access and control break on the said Route 19 project at approximate Station 464+00; and

WHEREAS, the said changes are supported by Russell County and the Town of Lebanon staff and will support economic development in the area; and

WHEREAS, the Department, Russell County and the Town of Lebanon staff have preliminarily determined that the said changes are appropriate from a safety and traffic control standpoint; and

WHEREAS, the developer has agreed to provide within 90 days from the approval of this resolution, a comprehensive traffic analysis quantifying the impacts of the proposed development on the safe functional operations of said Route 19 in support of the preliminary determination that the said changes are appropriate from a safety and traffic control standpoint and the Department concurs with the findings; and

WHEREAS, all costs of engineering and construction, including all necessary safety improvements, will be borne by others; and

WHEREAS, the developer shall pay to the Department an amount equal to the fair market value of the proposed limited access control break. This amount is to be determined by the Department; and

WHEREAS, upon completion and acceptance of all work, all roadway construction, improvements, and equipment will become the property of the Commonwealth.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board hereby approves the closing of said limited access control break and grants the said break in limited access control as set forth and subject to the above referred to conditions. The Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents needed to comply with this resolution.

WHEREAS, using technology to improve the transportation system and the travel experience of motorists in Virginia is a priority for the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT); and

WHEREAS, the use of emerging technologies such as the Internet, alphanumeric pagers and palm top computers to deliver real-time, up-to-the-minute traveler information can help travelers determine how and when to travel thus making the transportation system more efficient; and

WHEREAS, VDOT is a leader in the use of public-private partnerships to deliver travel and traffic information to the public. Partners in Motion (Washington, D.C.) and Travel Shenandoah (northern Shenandoah Valley) are two current partnerships initiated by the Department to provide such information; and

WHEREAS, VDOT has developed a public-private partnership to deliver real-time traffic information in the Hampton Roads region. This partnership will utilize the full range of communication media to deliver this information to the public where and when they need it most: automated telephone system, Internet, radio, cable television, alphanumeric pager, and palm top computer; and

WHEREAS, public sector funding for this project totals \$1,200,000:

- \$600,000 federal ITS funds
- \$300,000 local CMAQ funds
- \$300,000 VDOT ITS Division state funds; and

WHEREAS, the proposed private sector investment in this partnership exceeds \$5,800,000.

WHEREAS, another objective of the Department is to increase awareness of the Smart Travel Program and to educate and inform various constituencies about the Program and the benefits of transportation technologies; and

WHEREAS, the Department proposes to utilize and tailor existing FHWA/USDOT materials to communicate with key constituencies in Virginia, such as local government officials, planning district commission staff, regional civic organization members, and the general public; and

WHEREAS, total funding for this project is \$241,368:

- \$120,684 federal ITS funds
- \$120,684 in matching funds from a combination of university funds and state-funded in-kind services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board approves the Partnership Agreement with the Federal Highway Administration for the development of an advanced traveler information system in the Hampton Roads region and a statewide ITS outreach program.
