The State Highway Commission, with all members present, namely, Nade H. Massie, Chairman, Henry P. Book, Secretary, James A. Mundy, Jr., Hornes Hardaway, and Y. W. Davis, met in the Chamber of Connerce Heams in the Mational Bank of Commerce Building in Morfolk, Virginia, at 9:30 A.M. September 13, 1920, for the purpose of hearing from the officers and citizens of Horfolk County on the proposition of this County for the advancement of Funds to build Houte 27.

The menting was largely attended and the following were present and spoke, namely: Representatives of the Horfolk County Supervisors and the Horfolk County Road and Bridge Commission, Mayer A. L. Repey of Horfolk City and other representatives of this vicinity.

At the close of the meeting the Righmay Commission, secompanied by Go P. Coleman, Righmay Commissioner, preceded by automobile over Route 10 to Bullfulk, thence over Route 5 through Franklin to Courtland; thence over Route 12 to Emporie and to

Lawrenceville, where the Commission spent the night.

On the norming of the 14th, the Commission proceeded from Lawrenceville over combined Scutes 1 and 12 to LaGrance, South Hill and Union Level, thomas to Boydton, and ever Soute 12 to Chase City, Clover, Houston, Keeling and to Denville for the night.

The Righest Commission left Denville on the morning of the 15th and proceeded over Route 12 to Martineville, and, returning over the same route to Denville, proceeded ever Route 14 to Chathen, thence to Gretna, Alterista and to Lynchburg, where the Commission atopped for the night.

A business meeting of the Commission was held on the evening of September 15th, 1920, at Hotel Carroll in lynchburg, with all members present as follows:

The minutes of the meetings of August 19th to 25th, inclusive, were read and on motion of Mr. Davie were approved and the Chairman authorized to sign the mann.

On motion of Mr. Mandy, J. L. Temlinson was appointed a member of the traific police force:

On motion of Mr. Mandy the column of W. H. Glidden, Bridge Engineer, was fixed at \$2700, per minum from September 1, 1920 to March lat, 1921, and at \$3000, per minum after March lat, 1921.

On motion of Mr. Davie, the Highway Commissioner

was authorized to employ an engineer for the maintenance work, under his proposed plan for reorganization, esparating the work of construction and maintenance.

On motion of Mr. Hardenay the Denbigh High School was authorized to install and maintain one water pipe under State Read No. 9 in Varnick County.

The bond of the Northern Virginia Power Company, filed with the Rightmy Commissioner, in compliance with the terms of the permit lessed to them, authorizing the construction and maintenance of cole lines on State Highway No. 3, was accepted on motion of Ur. Hardamy.

On motion of Fr. Davie, B. F. Sikins of Dublin, Virginia, was granted authority to erect and maintain a pole line of thirty-sowen poles along State Righway No. 10 in Pulsaki County, for the purpose of conveying electric current to his residence; the location of the poles and all work to be under the supervision of the Highway Counterloner, and this parally to be revocable at the pleasure of the Highway Counterlon.

On motion of Nr. Mardaway, the appeal of certain freeholders of James City County (represented by Beredith and Meredith) appealing from the decision of G. P. Celeran, Highway Commissioner, in regard to the location of that portion of Route 9 between Milliamsburg and Law Hall, via Halatead Point, will be heard on Konday, October Ath, 1920, at 11 A. M. in the Court House at Williamsburg, Virginia.

On motion of Mr. Hardamay, the letter of the Attorney General was referred to the Highway Commissioner

with the request that he supply the Commission with any additional information he may have in his effice concerning the lecution of Route Eo.9 between Springfield and Halatead's Point.

On notion of Mr. Davie, the Halifax Hydro-Hiestric Corporation was allowed to advance the necessary funds to build a bridge norms Danister River on Boute 18.

On metion the meeting adjourned.

The Highway Commission left Lynchburg on the norming of September 16th and proceeded over Route 18 through Regiment to Breakment, thence over Boute 20 to Charlotte G.H., Reyaville, Eurhaville, Applia G.H. and to Richard, where the impresticu coded.
