MINUTES OF THE MESTING OF THE STATE HICHWAY COMMISSION OF VINCISIA HELD AT OATH SITY, GLADS, PRADISBURG, PULABRI, MAND C. M., AND HOABOKS, VINCISIA, AUGUST 29TH, 30TH, 31ST, AND SEPTEMBER 200, 1922, AND AN INSPECTICE TRIP, AUGUST 27TH TO SEPTEMBER 200, 1921.

The State Highway Commission, with Wade H.
Massie, Chairman, Henry P. Beck, Secretary, and Horace
Eardaway, in attendance, met on Saturday morning, August
27th, 1921, at the Richmond Hotel for the purpose of making
a general inspection of the State Roads in Southwest Virginia,
and also to attend a public bearing at Cate City in Sectt
County, where an appeal as to the logation of State Highway
Ec. 10 in Sectt County was to be settled.

The Counteries left Richard by automobile and proceeded over Route No. 13 to Farmville; thence over Route 10 to Lymphburg and to Rouneke where the party, after being joined by Counterieser Davie, remained for the might.

Leaving Rosnoke early Sunday noming, August 28th, 1921, the Commission proceeded by automobile over Route Se. 10 to Salon, where Commissioner Davie left the party, and the remaining rembers of the Commission; manely Massie, Book, and Mardaway, continued their journey westward over

Neute 10 to Palacki, Tytheville, Marion, Atingdon, and Bristol, where the party spent the might.

The Commission, on Conday meming, August 29th, proceeded by the Southern Railway train from Bristol to Cate City, where they commerced a tour of both routes from Specie Parry to Pattoneville.

Ournission, with Mesers. Massie, Beds, and Bardanay in attendance, assembled in the Scott County Court House, at Gate city, where the appeal of cortain freeholders of Beatt County, protecting against the location of that pertion of Route No. 10 between Specie Persy and Pattone-ville, as determined by Highway Consissionsy, S. P. Coleman, was fully argued by the advocates of the two reutes, and at the conclusion of the hearing the Chairman deslared the meeting adjourned, amademoing that the Highway Commission would take the matter under advisoners and amounce their declared through the regular official channels at a later date.

Rightmy Commissioner Coleman was in attendamen at this hearing.

The entire party returned by automobile over Route 10 to Bristol, where the night was event.

On Tweeday morning, August 30th, the State
Righway Commission, with Messre, Bassie, He dt and Rardaway
in attendance, left Bristol and proceeded by automobile
exetwardly to Glade ever State Road No. 10. At Glade
the History Commission, in meeting assembled, rejdeted

the application of the Windhester Thir Association for a permit to place advertising matter on the State Highways in the vicinity of Windhester, and the Secretary was instructed to immediately notify the Pair Association by telegraph of this decision.

prom Glade the Commission proceeded by sutomobile to Saltville, where they were the gueste of the Officials of the Nathiesen Alkali Works. From Saltville the Commission Journayed to Bland Court House, Machanisaburg, Poplar Grove and Penrisburg, where the Commission retired for the might, after hearing from a number of citizens of Giles County and of Elucation, West Virginia, at the Giles County Court House, about road matters in this neighborhood.

Jiet, the Commission proceeded by automobile to Dublin, then or to Pulacki, where they were not by a delegation of Pulacki citizens, and shown over Route No. 26 (Pulacki to Neckanicaburg) as far as the fost of Mig Walkers Modulain. Returning to Pulacki the Commission proceeded over Route No. 20 to Mythaville where they were not by a number of representative citizens of Mand and Wythe Counties, who accompanied them over the two proposed routes from Mythaville to Bland Court House, the party going out by the Sharon Springs Route.

At Bland Court House the Commission was met by a large number of citizene, headed by Judge Kegley, and after assembling in the Court House, the Commission heart at length from the advicates of the various routes. At the constanton of the meeting the Chairma announced that the metter would be taken under consideration by the Commission and their decision announced at a later date.

The Commission returned to Wytheville for the might.

The Commission left Tytheville on Thursday morning September let for Sural Retreat over Route No. 10 by automobile, and thence to Independence, from which point the party journeyed over State Road No. 12 to Galax, Rills-ville, and Stuart, where they remained for the might.

year Stant, on Friday marking September 2nd, the Commission continued their trip contents over Route So. 12 to Partingville, and thence turning northward proceeded ever Route No. 3 to Rocky Nount, thence to Routeke, where the inspection ended.

The State Highway Commission, with Messre, Fade R. Massis, Chairwan, Honry P. Back, Secretary, and Horage Rardway in attendence, met in the Horfelk and testers Railway Station at Rosnoke for the transaction of routine business, G. P. Celeman, State Highway Commissioner, being present.

On metion of Mr. Neek, the Chairman and Secretary of the State Highway Commission were authorized and empowered to onter into the usual agreement with the following parties in the name and on behalf of the Commission, for the advancement of funds to be used in the construction of sertain sections of the State Highway System; manually,

The Moard of Supervisors of Halifax County to advance \$30,000 for the construction of Route No.12 from the Pittsylvania County Line to Verson Hill, In Halifax County.

The Chamber of Commerce of Virginia Beach to advance sufficient funds for the construction of Route No. 10 between Parks Avenue and Atlantic Avenue, Virginia Beach.

\$100,000 for the construction of Route No. 9 from the fork of the road just beyond Trevilians, four miles west.

Certain eliinems of Vice County to advance appreximately \$60,000 for the construction of Route So. 11, from Morton towards Big Stone Cop, being Virginia Project No. 131, Vice County.

The Torm of Lexington and the South River Road moura of Roadbridge County, to advence \$12,000 (\$5,000 from the Torm and \$7,000 from the South River Road Board) for the reconstruction of one mile of Route No. 3 from Lexington north,
and \$12,000 to be returned from the 1922 maintenesses fund.

On motion of Mr. Mardamay, the following requests for permission to use the right of way of the State Mighway System for advertising purposes were rejected, and the

Secretary instructed to se advice them:

The Great Boancke Fair and Moree Show, to use State Roads leading into Roanske - application dated August 29th, 1921.

The Wodel Garage, Remoke, Virginia, to use State Roads into Rospoke - dated August 30th, 1921.

Wyrick Spring Company, Incorporated, Grockett, Virginia, to use State Highway between Bural Setrent and Sytheville - dated August 15th, 1921,

Vaughan and Rassett Company, Martineville, Virginia, to use State Highways in the vicinity of Martinesville - dated August 24th, 1921.

W. B. Ford Company, Forton, Yirginia, to use State Highway No. 11 in Wise County - dated August 22, 1921.

The Highway Counterloner referred to the Counterlon a letter from Mr. D. B. Ryland, Business Manager of the Lynchburg Chamber of Counters, making application for permission to leave signs, advertising the City of Lynchburg, which had already been exected, on the right of way of State Highways in the vicinity of Lynchburg.

After enveral consideration, the Commission determined to permit on State Highway right of way municipal signs, which simply give direction, but prohibit municipal signs carrying advertising matter, and Mr. G. P. Coleman, Commissioner, was sutherised and instructed to so advise Mr. Ryland.

Mr. Coleman, Highway Consideration a lass referred to the Considerate a telegram from Mr. J. D. Peery. Chairman of the Board of Supervisors of Tanswell County, agreeing to the proposition made by "r. Coleman to them for financing bridge and road work in Tanswell County, but with the previse that the read should be located by way of Borth Tanswell.

After experie consideration, and on motion of Mr. Hardway, the Secretary was instructed to advice Mr. Peary that the Commission would not accept the proposition made by farewall County, with the conditions made.
