MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF
THE STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION OF
VIRGINIA, HELD AT LYNCHBURG/VIR-
GINIA, SEPT. EIGHTH 1921, 1921.

Pursuant to a call issued by Highway Commissioner, George P. Coleman, the State Highway Commissioner assembled at the Virginian Hotel, Lynchburg, on Friday, September 9th, 1921, at noon, with Wade H. Haagie, Chairman, Henry P. Beck, Secretary, and James A. Murdy, Jr., in attendance.

Highway Commissioner Coleman presented to the commission the tabulation of the bids for road work received at his office in Richmond on September 8th, 1921, and recommended the award of the following contracts to the following named firms, and on motion of Mr. Murdy the recommendations of the Highway Commissioner were approved, as follows:

To Jardine Brothers, Eastburg, Virginia,
8.29 miles soil road, Five Forks to the Patrick County
line, Project No. 133-A, Route No. 12, Henry County,
\$39,607.02.

To W. W. Boxley & Company, Roanoke,
Virginia, 3.45 miles concrete road, Danville to
Prospect, Project No. 76-Al, Route No. 10, Prince
Edward County, \$161,688.38.

To Pace Construction Company, Roanoke,
Virginia, 3.50 miles bituminous macadam road, New
Market toward Luray, Project No. 120, Route No. 16,
Shenandoah County, \$96,664.00.

To Hyde and Baxter, Washington, D. C.,
6.48 miles waterbound macadam road, Milford Mills to
Greenwich, Project No. 130, Route No. 21, Prince Wil-
liam County, \$102,732.99, or Bituminous macadam \$132,647.01.

To J. S. Lane & Company, Altavista,
Virginia, concrete bridge on road between Sydmers-
ville and Henry County Line, Franklin County, Project
No. 90, Route No. 3, \$6035.00.

On motion Mr. Mandy, an additional allo-
cation of \$20,000 was made for extending resurfacing
work on Route No. 7, between Culpeper and Lignum. The
Commissioner called attention to the fact that this is
just a part of the amount necessary for this work.

In motion of Mr. Beck, the following
resolutions for the condemnation of right of way re-
quired in Southampton County, Virginia, Route No. 5,
of the State Highway System were adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE STATE HIGHWAY
COMMISSION OF VIRGINIA, That, in the judgment of this
Commission, it is necessary, requisite, and suitable
for the alteration, construction, reconstruction, and
maintenance of a portion of the road embraced in the
State Highway System, Route 8, in Southampton County,
Virginia, to change the location of said portion of
said State Highway through the lands of the Estate of
Mr. W. Schroll, deceased, as shown by lines on blueprint
map of a portion of said road, identified as Sheet Nos.
3 and 4, Project No. 114, Route No. 8, to be filed in
the condemnation proceedings to be instituted in the
Circuit Court of Southampton County, to which said
blueprint map reference is here made; and

RESOLVED FURTHER that this Commission deems
it necessary, requisite, and suitable that the right of way
of said Highway through the lands of the Estate of Mr. W.
Schroll, deceased, as shown on said blueprint map, shall be
60 feet wide, and that the center line as shown on said blue-
print map shall be the center line of said 60 feet right of
way;

RESOLVED FURTHER that a profile showing
the grade line, cut and fills, shown on said blueprint
map be made a part hereof, and that the grade line shown
therein be adopted and established;

RESOLVED FURTHER that in the judgment of this Commission it is necessary, requisite, and suitable for the alteration, construction, reconstruction, and maintenance of said State Highway to acquire said right of way over such lands of said Estate of Wm. H. Schrell, deceased, that may be necessary to fill out and complete said 50 foot right of way, the additional right of way required over the lands of said Estate of Wm. H. Schrell, deceased, as shown on said blueprint map, being described as follows:

A certain strip or parcel of land lying on either side of and adjacent to the center line of a certain survey of Route 5, between Schrell and Bassett County Line, known as Project 114, said strip or parcel of land being 50 ft. in width, being 25 ft. on either side of said center line, described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the center line of Project 114 near Schrell, shown on attached drawing, Sheet Nos. 3 and 4 of plan for the above described project, as Station 18+00; thence with tangent N 3° 30' W. to Station 31+00.4, a distance of 1299.4 ft.; thence around a 4° curve to right to Station 35+32.4, a distance of 363.8 ft., thence with tangent N 3° 30' W. to Station 39+20, a distance of 1792.4 ft., said strip or parcel of land containing 4.4 acres more or less.

RESOLVED FURTHER that
of be appointed agent and
attorney for this Commission, in this matter, and directed
to secure said right of way through the lands of said
Wm. H. Schrell, by gift, purchase, or condemnation proceedings,
in accordance with the statutes in this State in such cases
made and provided.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE STATE HIGHWAY
COMMISSION OF VIRGINIA, That, In the judgment of this
Commission, it is necessary, requisite, and suitable
for the alteration, construction, reconstruction, and
maintenance of a portion of the road submitted in the
State Highway System, Route 5, in Southampton County,
Virginia, to change the location of said portion of said
State Highway through the lands of the Estate of Isiah
and Hennie Parker, (C. L. Ormond, Administrator) as shown
by lines on blueprint map of a portion of said road,
Identified as Sheet No. 18, Project No. 122, Route No. 5,
to be filed in the condemnation proceedings to be in-
stituted in the Circuit Court of Southampton County,
to which said blueprint map reference is here made;
and

RESOLVED FURTHER that this Commission deems
it necessary, requisite, and suitable that the right of way
of said Highway through the lands of the Estate of Isiah
and Hennie Parker, as shown on said Blueprint map, shall be
60 feet wide, and that the center line as shown on said
blueprint map shall be the center line of said 60 foot
right of way;

RESOLVED FURTHER that a profile showing
the grade line, cut and fills, shown on said blueprint
map be made a part hereof, and that the grade line shown
therein be adopted and established;

RESOLVED FURTHER That in the judgment of this Commission it is necessary, requisite, and suitable for the alteration, construction, reconstruction, and maintenance of said State Highway to acquire said right of way over such lands of said Estate of Isaih and Bonnie Parker, that may be necessary to fill out and complete said 50 foot right of way, the additional right of way required over the lands of said Estate of Isaih and Bonnie Parker as shown on said blueprint map, being described as follows:

A certain strip or parcel of land lying on either side of and adjacent to the center line of a certain survey of Route 5, between Courtland and Carroll, known as Project 121, said strip or parcel of land being 50 ft. in width, being 25 ft. on either side of said center line described as follows:

Beginning at a point on center line of Route 5, shown on attached drawing, Sheet 13 of plans for above described project, as Station 254+55; thence with tangent S 12° 30' E. to Station 246+40, a distance of 1800 ft., said strip or parcel of land containing 1.34 acres more or less.

RESOLVED FURTHER That
of be appointed agent and attorney
for this Commission, in this matter, and directed to secure
said right of way through the lands of said Estate of Isaih
and Bonnie Parker, by gift, purchase, or condemnation pro-
ceedings, in accordance with the statutes in this State in
such cases made and provided.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE STATE HIGHWAY
COMMISSION OF VIRGINIA, that, in the judgment of this
Commission, it is necessary, requisite, and suitable
for the alteration, construction, reconstruction, and
maintenance of a portion of the road embraced in the
State Highway System, Route 6, in Southampton County,
Virginia, to change the location of said portion of
said State Highway through the lands of the Estate of
George W. Williams, deceased, as shown by lines on
blueprint map of a portion of said road, identified as
sheets No. 8, 9 & 10, Project No. 121, Route No. 6, to
be filed in the confirmation proceedings to be in-
stituted in the Circuit Court of Southampton County,
to which said blueprint map reference is here made;
and

RESOLVED FURTHER that this Commission deems
it necessary, requisite, and suitable that the right of way
of said Highway through the lands of the Estate of George
W. W. Williams, deceased, as shown on said blueprint map,
shall be 50 feet wide, and that the center line as shown on
said blueprint map shall be the center line of said 50 foot
right of way;

RESOLVED FURTHER that a profile showing
the grade lines, cut and fills, shown on said blueprint
map be made a part hereof, and that the grade line shown
therein be adopted and established;

RESOLVED FURTHER That in the judgment of this Commission it is necessary, requisite, and suitable for the alteration, construction, reconstruction, and maintenance of said State Highway to acquire said right of way over such lands of said Estate of George W. W. Williams, deceased, that may be necessary to fill out and complete said 50 foot right of way, the additional right of way required over the lands of said Estate of George W. W. Williams, deceased, as shown on said blueprint map, being described as follows:

A certain strip or parcel of land lying on either side of and adjacent to the center line of a certain survey of Route 8, between Courtland and Schell, known as Project 121, said strip or parcel of land being 50 ft. in width, being 25 ft. on either side of said center line, described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the center line of Project 121, shown on attached drawing, Sheets No. 8, 9 and 10 of plans for the above described project, as Station 155+68; thence around this S° curve to right to Station 148+40.1 = Station 155+31.1, a distance of 666.1 ft.; thence with tangent E 5° 16' N. to Station 155+44.3, a distance of 453.8 ft.; thence with a S° curve to the left to Station 174+56, a distance of 406.7 ft., said strip or parcel of land containing 1.8 acres more or less.

RESOLVED FURTHER That
of be appointed agent and attorney for this Commission, in this matter, and directed to secure said right of way through the lands of said Estate of George W. W. Williams, deceased, by gift, purchase, or condemnation proceedings, in accordance with the statutes in this State in such cases made and provided;

After a general discussion of current highway matters, the Commission adjourned and proceeded in a body to attend a good roads meeting called by the Kiwanis Club of Lynchburg, and composed of all representative organizations of Lynchburg, Roanoke, and neighboring cities.

This meeting was for the purpose of devising ways and means to expedite the building of public roads in Virginia.

At the conclusion of this meeting the members of the Commission dispersed to their various homes.
