MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE STATE HIGHWAY
COMMISSION, HELD AT RICHMOND, VIRGINIA,
SEPTEMBER 16, 1926.

On the morning of September 16th, 1926, the State Highway Commission, consisting of Messrs. H. G. Shirley, Chairman, Wade H. Mannie, Secretary, Hugh D. Sproul, and H. G. Gilmer, met at their office, State Office Building. The meeting was called to order by the Chairman.

The minutes of the meeting held July 16th were read and it was moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that they be approved. Motion carried.

On the invitation of the Commission, a number of representatives of various organizations interested in the erection of historical markers, met with the Commission to discuss this important matter. Among those present were, Mr. Mair of Lexington, Member of the Elks Club and Chairman of the Utilities Committee of the Chamber of Commerce; Dr. W. A. R. Goodwin of William and Mary College and also representing the Thomas Nelson, Jr., Chapter Sons of the Revolution; Mrs. W. W. Sale, Chairman, Board for the erection of Historical Markers in Virginia; Mrs. H. P. Lewis, Secretary Southwest Division of the same Board; Mr. E. T. Harrison of the Battlefield Markers Association; Mr. J. Ambler Johnson, Secretary and Mr. C. B. Lindsey of Charlottesville, representing the Western Division of the same association; Mrs. Norman Randolph and Mrs. H. A. Blamer, of the United Daughters of the Confederacy; Miss Anderson of the Confederate Museum; Congressman Drury, the Secretary of the Chamber of Commerce of Fredericksburg, and many others.

It was the consensus of opinions, and a resolution was passed by those present, that the Chairman of the Commission appoint two Committee, one to select a uniform marker, and second, to pass on the check all inscriptions to be placed on such markers.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the contract for the construction of .496 Miles South of Wall Street, South Boston to .37 Miles South of Cluster Springs, Route 15, Project 8-278B, be awarded to the low bidder, J. W. Tally, Petersburg, Virginia, at his bid of \$54,067.89 and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, and \$3,254.29 for Guard Rail, making a total of approximately \$60,000.00 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Sprout, that the contract for the construction of Project 8-445, AMG, Route 23, Stuart towards North Carolina Line, be awarded to the low bidder, Marye and Blackshear, Shawsville, Virginia, at their bid of \$30,906.25, with the provision that this work can be extended at his unit prices to the amount of the appropriation of \$50,000.00. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commission confirm the award of contract for the construction of Project 167F, Route 36, Shenandoah River to Millwood, to W. H. Clark and Company, Charlottesville, Virginia, an informal bid submitted July 28th, amounting to \$25,225.98, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of approximately \$30,000.00 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sprout, that the Commission confirm the award of contract for the construction of Bridge over Ocoeean

Creek, Route 31, Project 4480, to the low bidder, Atlantic Bridge Company, Greensboro, North Carolina, at their bid of \$75,733.48, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of approximately \$86,000.00 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the Commission confirm the award of contract for the construction of 2.187 Miles 18" concrete road, Route 33, Project 446A, to the low bidder, Allport Construction Corporation, Richmond, Virginia, at their bid of \$30,274.92 and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering and \$1,200.00 for detours, making a total of approximately \$33,000.00 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sprout, that the Commission confirm the award of contract for the construction of 6.3 Miles Grading and Drainage, including Bridge over Byers Creek, Route 14, Project 259-BIG, to the low bidder, R. H. Langhorne, Irvington, Virginia, at his bid of \$56,529.00, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering and \$7,369.84 for Guard Rail, making a total of approximately \$71,000.00 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commission confirm the award of contract for the construction of .802 Miles 18" Bituminous Macadam road, Route 10, Project 132B, to the low bidder, Varian Construction Company, Pulaski, Virginia, at their bid of \$12,951.47 for Section B, and \$10,163.76 for Section C, with 10% additional set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of approximately \$26,000.00 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Nassie, that the contract for the construction of 1.189 Miles 18" Concrete road, Route 392, Project 459, Town of Wakefield, be awarded to the low bidder, Robert Martin Company, Salem, Virginia, at their bid of \$29,994.97, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering and \$1,000.00 for detours, making a total of approximately \$35,000.00 chargeable to the Robertson Act Loan of \$45,000.00. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the contract for the construction of the Bridge over Pamunkey River, 3.5 Miles South of Chatham, Route 14, Project 457, be awarded to the low bidder, M. O. Turner, Durham, North Carolina, at his bid of \$17,632.56 and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of contingencies and engineering, making a total of approximately \$19,500.00 chargeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the Commission transfer \$30,000.00 of the appropriation made to the Lynnhaven Inlet Bridge of \$100,000.00, to Route 34 to extend the present work .8 Miles, at the same unit prices bid, same to be replaced out of next year's allocations. Motion carried.

Mr. Dulin and Mr. Wright of the Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone Company appeared before the Commission and requested them to allow the conduit which had been placed under Route 23, Giles County, without a permit to remain as it would cut off the service into Blafield if they had to tear up this conduit. They stated that an effort was made to secure a permit the day the work was done, but could not get in touch with the District Engineer.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that permit be granted the Chesapeake & Potomac Telephone Company to put a three duct conduit under the slab of the Hunting Creek Bridge, as per recommendation of Chief Engineer Wallen. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the request of the Norfolk & Western Railway Company to erect three flashlight warning signal devices on Route 10, Lee Highway, as follows:

McGonnell's - Two Miles East of Abingdon,
Greavers - One Mile West of Chilhowie,
Copehaver's - Two Miles West of Marion,

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be turned down, and that the Commission suggest the same type of signal as used by the Chesapeake & Ohio R.R. Co. at Tazewell, be installed in lieu thereof. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Spraul, that the Chairman having petitioned the Commission to make certain changes in the location of Route 10 in Campbell County so as to eliminate the grade crossing of the Norfolk and Western Railway Company's tracks near Rustburg, that the following notice be given:

THE STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION OF VIRGINIA, hereby gives notice, in accordance with Chapter 212, Act approved March 19, 1926, that the Chairman of the Commission having petitioned that certain changes be made in the location of State Highway No. 10, in the County of Campbell, so as to eliminate the grade crossing of the Norfolk & Western Railway Company's tracks near Rustburg, and to put in an underpass in lieu thereof, said grade crossing to be closed as soon as the underpass has been completed and opened to traffic;

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the proposed change will be made unless there are objections filed in writing at the office of the State Highway Commission, State Office Building, Richmond, Virginia, on or before noon, October 20, 1936. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Spraul, that objections having been filed to the proposed changes in Route 10 between Blackstone and Petersburg, Nottoway and Prince Edward Counties, and near Evergreen in Appomattox County, to eliminate certain grade crossings of the Norfolk and Western Railway Company's tracks that the Commission give public hearings on October 21st 11:00 A.M. at Appomattox Court House and 3:00 P.M. at Nottoway Court House, to hear such objections. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sprout, seconded by Mr. Macie, that the Commission see no objection to the construction of a toll road from the Lee Highway to the top of the Massanutten Mountain, provided no Forestry Road Funds for Construction or Maintenance are used for such purpose. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sprout, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that upon receipt of an affidavit from the Aetna Casualty and Surety Company that all bills for labor and material have been settled on the H. A. Donald and Company contracts, that the Commission accept bonds from this Company covering highway contract work. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sprout, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the Commission add to the State Highway System, under the 2½ Clause of the Law, 400 ft. of road from Route 31 at Yorktown to a proposed Ferry Landing, and 1400 ft. of road from Route 19 at Gloucester Point to a proposed Ferry Landing. Motion carried.

Messrs. Monroe and Fleming came before the Commission in regard to oiling the road from Pohick Church to Ocequon. They stated that they would pay for the gravel and oil, the Workhouse Superintendent at Ocequon would furnish the labor, if the Commission would do the hauling and operate the oil distributor.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Sprout, that the Commission agree to do the hauling and operate the distributor as requested by Messrs. Monroe and Fleming, as this road is being used as a detour while Route 31 is under construction. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Macie, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the following mileage tentatively added to the State Highway System under the 2½ Clause, be confirmed and maintained hereafter as a State Highway:
