

Minutes of the Meeting of the State Highway Commission  
of Virginia, Held in Appomattox and Richmond,  
September 21 and 22, 1932.

On the morning of September 21st, 1932, the State Highway Commission, consisting of Messrs. H. G. Shirley, Wade H. Massie, Secretary, and Mr. H. East, met at the Court House in Appomattox, and gave a public hearing on the classification of roads in the secondary system for the counties comprising the Lynchburg District.

After all present had been heard, the meeting adjourned, and the Commissioners proceeded to Richmond, where they spent the night.

On the morning of the 22nd, the Commission, consisting of Messrs. H. G. Shirley, Wade H. Massie, Secretary, I. Wilke Truxton, H. G. Gilmer, and Mr. H. East, met in their office in the State Office Building.

The meeting was called to order by the Commissioners.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the minutes of the meeting of August 16th be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. East, that the minutes of the meeting of September 2nd be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Massie, that permit #12540, Henrico County, issued August 8, to the Virginia Electric & Power Company, be cancelled as requested. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that permit #10561, Scott County, issued May 10th to the Appalachian Electric Power Co., be cancelled as requested. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. East, that the Commission award the contract for the construction of Project F565 HHZ, Route 15, Forks of Buffalo-4.195 Mi. W. Forks of Buffalo, and Bridge over Buffalo River, to the low bidder, Wood and Shipley Company, Stanley, Va., at their bid of \$77,043.74, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, and \$1,217.14 for work outside slope stakes, making a total of approximately \$85,960.26 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commission award the contract for the construction of Project F494 DRZ, HZ, Route 122, 3 Mi. S. Hrabette Hill-4.58 Mi. S. Hrabette Hill, to the low bidder, M. S. Hodges, Roanoke, Va., at his bid of \$50,899.21, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, and \$200.40 for work outside slope stakes, making a total of approximately \$56,900.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. East, that the Commission award the contract for the construction of Project 502E, Route 40, Bridge over Deep Creek, to the low bidder, Tomstall-Johnson Company, Inc., Norfolk, Va., at their bid of \$7,558.17, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making total of approximately \$8,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that the Commission award the contract for the construction of Project F813 E8, Route 110, Bridge over North Fork Holston River, to the low bidder, J. S. Bowers, Whiteville, W.C., at their bid of \$19,335.48, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$22,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the Commission award the contract for the construction of Project P688 F, Route 13, 4.29 Mi. E. Forks of Buffalo-Forks of Buffalo, to the low bidder, Meadowview Construction Co. Inc., Meadowview, Va., at their bid of \$38,143.69, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, and \$1,193.50 for work outside slope stakes, making a total of approximately \$44,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the Commission award the contract for the construction of Project 8873 E2, Route 52, Bridge over Mountain Run, to the low bidder, Perkins-Barone Construction Co., Blackstone, Va., at their bid of \$4,547.09, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$4,900.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. East, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the Commission award the contract for the construction of Project P754 ODRB, Route 44, 3.45 Mi. W. Turbeville P.O.-3.95 Mi. W. Turbeville P.O., to the low bidder, W. W. Tuck and Son, Virginina, Va., at their bid of \$50,302.85, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work; \$974.61 for soil rights; \$8,552.50 for guard rail; \$8,076.68 for surface treatment and \$1,674.50 for outside slope stakes, making a total of approximately \$76,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the Commission award the contract for the construction of Project 5755 D, Route 522, Bridge over Occoneechee Creek, to the low bidder, Tomstall-Johnson Co. Inc., Norfolk, Va., at their bid of \$8,914.18, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$7,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the following permits be approved under the rules and regulations of the Commission.

Robert W. Adamson, Manassas, Va., to open Route 26 in Manassas and install sewer and water connections.

Appalachian Electric Power Co., Lynchburg, Va., to erect one pole as addition to existing line on Route 10 and construct a 230/110v service crossing.

Arlington County Board of Supervisors, Clarendon, Va., to dig five holes over 12" water main and shut off stop cocks of abandoned water connections on Route 26, 1800 ft. south of the Lee Highway.

Arlington County Board of Supervisors, Clarendon, Va., to place 2" air valve on existing main 100 ft. west of Bell Avenue, on Route 21, Balls Hill, Va.

Arlington County Board of Supervisors, Clarendon, Va., to excavate and place 3/4" water connection across Route 26, 500 ft. from the Lee Highway.

Arlington County Board of Supervisors, Clarendon, Va., to excavate and place 3/4" water connection across Route 26, 800 ft. from the Lee Highway.

Arlington County Board of Supervisors, Clarendon, Va., to install 3/4" water service connection to premises of Ann R. Dye, Route 26.

Arlington County Board of Supervisors, Clarendon, Va., to install 3/4" water connection on Route 26 to premises of W. A. Yeatman.

William Braxton, Clay Bank, Va., to haul piling of a greater length than specified in Chapter 348, Acts 1932, Section III, in the Fredericksburg District.

Buchanan Water Works Company, Inc., Buchanan, Va., to dig ditch under Route 26 and repair water pipe in house connection.

C. L. Byrd, Belle Haven, Va., to haul logs on trailer with licensee #600 and on three timber carts drawn by mules, or a greater length than specified in section III of Chapter 348, Acts of 1932, in the Suffolk District.

C & P Telephone Co. of Va., Clarendon, Va., to erect 1 pole on Route 26, east side of Globe Road, opposite north side of Oak Street.

C & P Telephone Co. of Va., Clarendon, Va., to remove 14 poles to opposite sides of Route 211 about 1 mile northwest of Amherstville, so the Electric Company can use the route.

C & P Telephone Co., Norfolk, Va., to push one 8" pipe under Route 26 in Warwick County.

C & P Telephone Co., Winchester, Va., to place about 400 ft. of underground conduit on Route 50, north side, opposite the Hyrd Airport.

C & P Telephone Co., Roanoke, Va., to construct line on Route 10, about four miles east of Bedford.

C & P Telephone Co. of Va., Richmond, Va., to trim trees on and bordering on Routes 53, 34 and 54, in Loudoun County.

Chincoteague Inn, New Church, Va., to concrete existing entrance to filling station and Inn on Route 34, between Oak Hall and New Church.

Clark Oil Company, Danville, Va., to remove section of curb and build entrance to filling station at intersection of Routes 14 and 309.

Commonwealth Utilities, Harrisonburg, Va., to make parallel highway cut on Route 55 and install 8" gas line in ditch line for a distance 1800 ft. south of the city.

W. P. Crouch, Ellerson, Va., to make entrance to dwelling on Route 18, 6.8 miles northeast of Mechanicsville.

Cushman Plumbing Co., New Market, Va., to lay a 4" sewer line under and serve Route 21 to service residence of J. H. Bottoms.

M. S. Good, Falls Church, Va., to lay drain pipe under Route 51 to store building, in the Town of Falls Church.

P. E. Haynes, Williamsburg, Va., to haul piling on trailer with license No. 128, of a greater length than specified in section 111, Chapter 543, Act of 1908, in the Suffolk District.

M. M. Hopson, Portsmouth, Va., to grade entrance to filling station on Route 14, about 3 miles west of Alexanders Corner.

R. R. Jolly, South Hill, Va., to grade entrance to filling station on Route 51 one-half mile south of South Hill.

J. E. Meany, Broadway, Va., to cut the pavement on Route 35 and install 2½" pipe at intersection of Routes 35 and 517.

The Mariners' Museum, Newport News, Va., to drive a 1½" pipe under Route 58 about 200 ft. south of Alaska Service Station.

R. H. Munzer, Roanoke, Va., to build entrance to filling station on Route 10 between Salem and Glenvar, also to Tourist Camp.

John W. Newton, Golconville, Va., to build gravel entrance to filling station on Route 51 in Caroline County.

Norfolk City Division of Water Supply, to install 3/4" lead tap under Route 10, in Princess Anne County.

Norfolk City Division of Water Supply, to install 3/4" water tap under Route 10 by drilling under roadway, in Princess Anne County.

Pearisburg Filling Station, Pearisburg, Va., to build entrance to filling station on Route 25.

Brown Pettington, Luray, Va., to build entrance to filling station on Route 21, east of Forestry Camp on Massanutten Mountain, in Page County.

Pounding Mill Water Supply Co. Inc., Covington, Va., to drive one 2" water line under Route 14 one mile east of Covington.

T. J. Pritchett, Petersburg, Va., to construct standard entrance No. 2 on Route 31 one mile south of Hitzkie's Store.

J. Donald Richards, Warrenton, Va., to extend town water line along Route 33 north of Warrenton about 700 ft. making one crossing.

Richmond Engineering Co., Richmond, Va., to haul steel storage tanks from Richmond to Littleton, N. C. on trailer.

Roslyn Gas Co., Clarendon, Va., to cut Route 21 between Maryland Avenue and Cherryvalley St., in Clarendon to repair leak.

Roslyn Gas Co., Clarendon, Va., to cut Route 21 at Fawcett St., over Lee Knolls, Va., to connect 2" pipe.

C. M. Shannon, Mount Jackson, Va., to build entrance to filling station on Route 35 three miles south of Mt. Jackson.

Tazley Volunteer Fire Co., Tazley, Va., to concrete existing entrance to fire engine house on Route 34.

R. E. Timberlake, Laramie, Va., to construct driveway to garage and filling station on Route 38; also to dig ditch and fill in present ditch on north side of highway.

T. F. Topham, Mytherville, Va., to construct entrance to filling station on Route 38, on top of Hunter Mountain.

Mrs. Elizabeth Vassar, Culpeper, Va., to grade entrance to residence on Route 51 near Basington.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Richmond, Va., to install 7 guy anchors on Route 421 about 2.2 miles south of Hanover C.H., at the request of the Department.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Richmond, Va., to erect a crossing of 5 #8 ACSR wires and 2 #8 ACSR service wires; also one 5/16" guy wire over Routes 418 and 419.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Richmond, Va., to erect 5 "E aluminum conductors, steel reinforced, 2500 ft, across Route 37 about half a mile south of Goshen.

Virginia Electric & Power Co., Richmond, Va., to erect a crossing of 3 #4 TE&P service wires over Route 31, half a mile south of Route 410.

Virginia Plumbing & Supply Co., Harrisburg, Va., to drive 1" pipe under Route 35, two feet below surface of road.

Virginia Public Service Company, Warrenton, Va., to install one 3 wire 110/220v secondary crossing over Route 52 between Esmington and Warrenton.

Virginia Public Service Company, Newport News, Va., to make a house connection with main already laid on Route 511 on LaSalle Avenue.

Virginia Public Service Company, South Boston, Va., to relocate one pole on Route 10 five miles west of Farmville and make two crossings.

Virginia Public Service Company, Alexandria, Va., to haul poles of a greater length than specified in section 111, Chapter 342, Acts of 1932, on trailers with license tags TR153, TR154, TR155, TR571 in Suffolk District.

Virginia Public Service Company, Alexandria, Va., to haul poles on trailers with license tags TR574 and TR870, of a greater length than specified in section 111, Chapter 342, Acts of 1932, in Lynchburg District.

Virginia Public Service Company, Alexandria, Va., to haul poles on trailer with license tag TR572, of a greater length than specified in section 111, Chapter 342, Acts of 1932, in Richmond District.

Virginia Public Service Company, Alexandria, Va., to haul poles of a greater length than specified in section 111, Chapter 342, Acts of 1932, on trailers with license tags TR560, TR561, TR526, TR576, TR801, TR803, TR804, TR805 and TR806, in the Staunton District.

Virginia Public Service Company, Alexandria, Va., to haul poles of a greater length than specified in section 111, Chapter 342, Acts of 1932, on trailers with license tags TR818, TR892, TR830, TR218, TR222, TR221, TR219 and TR857, in the Culpeper District.

Motion carried.

At the request of Mr. Geo. Bowles and others, a rehearing was given on the location of Route 41 in the vicinity of Ferncliffe.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. East, that the Commission disapprove any permit for bus or truck operation over Route 539. That the State Corporation Commission be requested not to grant the application of the Peninsula Transit Corporation for such a permit. Also there is a concrete road on the south side of the railroad tracks a short distance from this road, the construction of which is suitable and should be used by such vehicles. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. East, that the request of the Independence Bridge Company and Raymond B. Bottom, for a permit to construct a bridge across the York River at Yorktown, be not acted upon until after a public hearing is given in the Court House at Suffolk on October 7th at 2:30 o'clock P.M. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that the action of the District Engineer in not approving payment of bills submitted by the City of Staunton on the first quarter payment for maintenance of streets, be upheld until Coalter Street is put in proper condition by the city. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Massie, that it is the intention of the State Highway Commission to improve Route 605 to the North Carolina Line just as soon as funds are made available for such purpose. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Massie, that \$200,000.00 or as much as may be necessary, be transferred from Route 31, Fredericksburg-Herth, to Route 34 in Accommack County. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Chairman be authorized to confer with the officials of the Bruce Bridge at West Point looking to taking this bridge over not later than March 1st, 1933; and that if no agreement can be reached to start condemnation proceedings. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. East, seconded by Mr. Massie, that \$500.00 per mile additional be allowed the City of Norfolk, 1932-1933, for the construction of a bridge over LaFayette River, Hampton Boulevard. Motion carried.

Mr. E. T. Humphries, of Pentress, Mr. Whiting, Mr. Mansfield and a large delegation from Princess Anne County, appeared before the Commission in the interest of constructing Route 536, asking that the work be started immediately.

Mr. Lewis C. Williams and Mr. J. H. Gates, appeared before the Commission requesting a refund of the two certified checks, \$1,000.00 each, filed with bids by the Brown Paving Company, Inc., Lexington, N.C., on State Projects 676E and 676F, Route 53, which were forfeited when the contractor failed to execute contracts. The matter was referred to Mr. Hall for report.

A public hearing was held in Room 407 of the State Office Building on the classification of roads in the Secondary System for the counties in the Richmond District.

All counties in the District were heard that were present.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Truxton, that the Commission endorse the request of Silas J. Hale for the abandonment of section of road in Caroline County near Corbin, which section of road reverted to the County by reason of relocation of State Route 50, Project 448C, between Stations 610,000 and 620,000. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. East, that petition from Bland County Board of Supervisors to add to the Secondary System a section of road from Salem Church to point in the public road near a large slide, be rejected. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. East, that right of way on the Secondary System will not be paid for by the State Highway Commission, but that fares will be set back at the expense of the Department to secure the proper width, and where changes in location are required, the State will make such changes and build the road, provided the right of way is given. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. East, that the request of the Board of Supervisors of Richmond County to extend County Road No. 201 to intersect County Road No. 102, and take it into the Secondary System of Richmond County, be rejected. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that First and Second Avenues in the Village of Cloverdale be adopted as a part of the Secondary System in Botetourt County, as requested by the Board of Supervisors. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. East, seconded by Mr. Massie, that \$25,000.00 of the allocation made for Route 57, between Berryville and Winchester, be transferred to Route 515, Front Royal-South. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Ordinance of the Town of Falls Church, turning over Route 54 within the Town to the State, be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that request of Turnbull-Johnson Company, Norfolk, Va., for extension of time on their contract for Project C-2-38, Routes 10, 12 and 500, be rejected, as recommended by the Chief Engineer. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. East, that the line known as the New Survey, be adopted as the location of Route 110 into Abingdon. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the northwest line, as shown on sketch, be adopted as the location of Route 42, Blue Grass Trail through Smyth County. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxton, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Commission give \$200.00 additional for curb and gutter, making a total of \$1000.00 on Route 58 leading into Newport News. Motion carried. Mr. Shirley voting in the negative as those rights of way had been agreed to be given.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the Secretary of the Agricultural Department be requested to divert 18 miles of the Federal Aid Mileage from Route 407 to Route 115. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilmer, seconded by Mr. Massie, that where requests come in from private property holders to oil roads leading to their residences, the Chairman be authorized to do so at full cost to the property holders, including the expense of the Engineer and hire of equipment, and that the money be put up before any work is undertaken. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the bids on gasoline, received September 20th for approximately 3,556,000 gallons, be rejected and new bids asked. Motion carried.

- Moved by Mr. East, seconded by Mr. Gilmer, that the contract be awarded to Harwood Brothers, Richmond, Va., for approximately 125,400 gallons of lubricating oil, our requirements for the 100 counties from October 1st, 1938 to April 15th, 1939, as follows.
