Moved by General Anderson, seconded by Mr. Bawle, that the localisation reimpose the S ton load limit on Route 2 from Bowling Green to the Intersection of Route 17 and that signs be posted at proper points noting the restriction. Motion carried.

The question of hauling permits was referred to the Commission and given full consideration. It was noved by Mr. Rawks and seconded by Mr. Rogers that ----

Because of the extent of overloading during the war and our Mforts to combat same, it has been an unwritten policy of the Department to limit permits for the movement of overmight or overwidth vehicles to single rips. No blanket permits covering two or more trips were issued. The reason ms to secure better control over the route of travel, time of travel und related conditions. It is still the opinion and sense of the Commission that in all except the most unusual sircumstances, permits for the movement of werweight and overwidth vehicles be restricted to single trips. However, mere the owner of beavy equipment is operating exclusively within a very mall area and the requirement that he obtain a special permit for each adividual movement would be an obvious hardship, the Traffic and Flanning ingineer is authorized in his discretion to issue a permit covering more than me trip, under such conditions relating to the route or routes of travel, time w times of travel and other related conditions as will provide for the minimum. if inconvenience and hasard to the traveling public, and also provide for the eximum protection of roads and bridges. Motion carried.

The problem of access roads to industries was discussed at ength. We work told the Commission that he had taken the matter up evant times with the Viscose Corporation, first when they took up an option or the site in Pulaski County, agreeing to build a mile of road into the plant, and again when it was found that the Viscose people desired a road that would not experimentally \$60,000. The Viscose people stated that they did not wish a impose any hardships on the community and agreed to pay half of the cost of he road and if necessary to pay the total amount. The Commission was of the pinion that their action taken at the May meeting covered the problem and no urther action was taken.

A motion was made by General Anderson and seconded by Mr. Rawle, hat the Commission command Mr. Wysor's bandling of the project and to say that hile the procedure could not be adopted as a rigid regulation still it was extainly the type of solution upon which the Commission looked with favoration earried.

Moved by Mr. Wysor, seconded by Mr. Wampler, that revised Town religious and agreements having been executed for the maintenance of Primary ightays through the Towns of Grandy, Manages and Stephen City, as provided y law, that the Commission accept the same. Motion carried.

The problem of employing veterans who have relatives now orking for the Department was thoroughly gone into by the Commission. It was eved by Mr. Rawle and seconded by Mr. Barrow that the Chairman take the matter p with the Attorney General and bring it up again at the meeting of the commission in Octobers. Motion partieds
