#### Minutes of the Mosting of the State Highway Countesion of Virginia, Held in Richard, September 24, 1959.

Moved by Mr. Rawle, seconded by Mr. Salater that it appearing desirable to improve a hazardous reilroad grade crossing on Route 55 in the Town of Elkton by extending the present grade crossing eignals farther toward the roadway, at an estimated cost of \$2,500.00, ten per cent of which is to be contributed by the Morfolk and Western Railway, the sum of \$8,250.00 is allocated from the Steunton District Construction Reserve Fund for this purpose. Motion carried.

The Chairman verbally reported further to the Commission on the proposed new office building and stated that he was of the opinion that this was not the opportune time for such construction.

Noved by Mr. Hawle, seconded by Mr. Sciater, that, WHRMAS, the space in the present State Highway Office Building in the City of Richard, completed in 1958, has become inadequate for the needs of the Department; the Highway Commission, recognizing such inadequaty, sutherized studies of providing more space, culminating in plans and specifications for an additional State Highway Office Building; and, WHEREAS, the Department does not have funds at this time to proceed with the construction of a new office building; NOW, THEREFORE, it is directed that the plans and specifications be filled and no further work be done, or action be taken in this matter for the present. Notion carried.

Mr. S. S. Flythe having requested information concerning the expenditure of industrial Access Funds for the past three years, a copy of the tabulation sent him was forwarded to the other Members of the Commission under date of July 22, 1959.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Barrow, that the Annual Report for the year July 1, 1956 through June 50, 1959, be forwarded to the Governor, it and the letter of transmittal having been signed by the Countesion Members this day. Notion carried.

Each Number was asked for suggestions and comments. Mr. Flythe was interested in right of way questions and Mr. Felix gave to each Number a brief on "Procedures Used by the Department in the Acquisition of Right of Way." Several questions by Mr. Flythe were answered by Mr. Felix and a general discussion in detail followed on the securing of right of ways the use of appraisers and negotiators being two separate and entirely different persons. Senator Nelson was interested in a road in Hillside Development that needed surfacing. Mr. Chinn was interested in a section of Route 20 from Wilderness Run to Orange. Mr. Chinn was advised that funds were available for the work and the plans are being prepared.

Mr. Seleter discussed the problem of the Mountain Empire Airport and the quastion of right of way, referring to the cost of right of way for the purpose of runnays, etc., and the question of the location of Interestate Soute SL. The Commission hopes to look over the problem on the ground when it holds a Public Hearing on Interestate Route 77 in the western part of the State later on. A verbal report was made on the progress of a report on Interestate Route 77 by Mr. May. Mr. Davis went into some detail on this Route and a report on it.

The Chairman took up the question of a request from Honorable John W. Wicker for a permit to lay a pipe line along the right of way of the highway from the District Line south along the Potomac. A permit is sought by the Potomac Public Service Company.

There being no further business the Commission adjourned at noon and proceeded to lunch.
