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MESTING OF STATE HIGHMAY COMMISSION OF VIRGINIA Richmond, Virginia

September 19, 1963

Noved by Judge Weaver, Seconded by Mr. Holland, that WHEREAS in connection with Route 615, State Highway Project 0615-068-012, C-1, in Orange County, the Commonwealth did acquire all of the lands of Marie F. Braun lying between the old and new locations of said Boute 615; and

WHEREAS, an agreement was reached with Langbourne M. Williams which provided in part that the unneeded portion of said land and a section of the former location of said Route 615 would be conveyed to said Langbourne M. Williams in partial exchange for the new right of way required from his property for the reconstruction of said road; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Orange County by resolution duly adopted on their meeting of August 14, 1962 did abandon said section of old Route 615 pursuant to the provisions of Section 33-76.12 of the 1950 Code of Virginia as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Deputy State Highway Commissioner has cartified in writing that the said section of old location so abandoned and lying west of the new west right of way line of Route 615 from a point on same, opposite approximate Station 75+50 to a point on same opposite approximate Station 76+60 no longer constitutes a section of the public road, nor does the parcel of land so acquired from Marie F. Braum between said section of old road so abandoned and the new west right of way of said Route 615 constitute a section of public road, and that he deems neither the old location nor the said parcel of land to be necessary for the uses of the Secondary System of State Highways.

MOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-75.11 of said Code, the conveyance of the said parcel of land and right of way of the said section of old road so certified to the owner or owners of the adjoining land is hereby approved and the State Highway Commissioner or Deputy State Highway Commissioner is hereby authorised to execute a deed of quitclaim for same in the name of the Commonwealth. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Flythe, Seconded by Mr. Holland, that WHEREAS, Route 460 in Dinwiddle County has been altered and reconstructed as shown on plans for Project 0460-026-008, C-501 and

WHEREAS, two sections of the old location of Route 460 are to be transferred to the Secondary System;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33-27 of the Code of Virginis of 1950, as emended, 0.87 mile of old Route 460, shown in red and designated as Sections 1 and 2 on the plat dated June 18, 1963, Project 0460-026-008, C-501, he transferred from the Primary System to the Secondary System of Highways as follows:

Sections - Old location of Houte 460, from new Houte 460 1 & 2 at Survey Station 1269+50 southwesterly 0.87 mile to Survey Station 1316+00.

Motion carried.

Moved by Judge Weaver, Seconded by Mr. Holland, that WHEREAS, the Commonwealth is the owner of a right of way generally 50 feet in width along a portion of Route 17 in Carolina County; and

WHEREAS, the said portion of Route 17 was relocated and reconstructed under Project 0017-016-101, RW-201 through property now belonging to the United States of America as a part of the A. P. Hill Hilitary Reservation; and

WHEREAS, an agreement has been entered into with the United States of America which provides that the right of way for the relocated and reconstructed section of Route 17 will be conveyed to the Componwealth in exchange for the right of way of the former location of said Route 17 where same lies within the limits of the said A. P. Hill Military Reservation; and

WEBREAS, The Deputy State Highway Commissioner has certified that the new location of said road as constructed under said project serves the same citisens as the old road, was constructed in lieu thereof and is approved; and

WHEREAS, the Deputy State Righway Commissioner has also certified in writing that the maid sections of old road from a point on the northeast side of the new location opposite survey Station 271+20 to a point on same opposite survey Station 313+60 and on the southwest side of same from a point opposite survey Station 327+90 are depend no longer necessary for the uses of the State Righway System and has recommended that same be conveyed to the United States of America in accordance with the terms of the aforesaid agreement.

NOW, THERRFORR, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-76.5 of the 1950 Code of Virginia as amended, the said sections of old road so certified are hereby declared abandoned, and in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-76.6 of the said Code, the State Highway Commissioner or Deputy State Highway Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute in the name of the Commonwealth a deed conveying by quitclaim such sections to the United States of America in exchange for the said new right of way so required. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. McWane, Seconded by Mr. Landrith, that WRENEAS, an intersection at grade is presently planned for the extension of Route 29-A, the Lynchburg Expressway, with Route 297 in Campbell County;

WHEREAS, on interchange with grade separation of these two routes would be desirable but was omitted from the original plans because of shortage of funds:

WHEREAS, the construction contract for this project has been awarded leaving a net balance in the ellocation of approximately \$240,000;

WHEREAS, it is now possible to finance the remaining cost of the interchange estimated at \$400,000 from the Construction Reserve Fund of the Lynchburg District; therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the sum of \$160,000 is allocated from the Lynchburg District Reserve Fund for this purpose. Motion carried.

Moved by Judge Wesver, Seconded by Mr. Holland, that, WHEREAS, the Commonwealth is the owner of the former right of way of the Harrisonburg-Warm Springs Turnpike in Rockingham County; and

WHEREAS, present Route 42, Project 339-D has been constructed in lieu of a section of the old Turmpike between survey Station 12464 and survey Station 14437 of the centerline of Project 339-D, serves the same citizens and has been approved by the State Highesty Commissioner; and

WHENGAS, the owners of the adjoining lands in order to remove a cloud on their title, and to more fully develop their lands, have requested that the old right of way be conveyed to them; and

WHENEAS, the State Highway Commissioner has certified in writing that the said section of the old Turnpike is no longer necessary for the uses of the State Highway System.

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-76.5 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, this Commission declares the section of old Turnpike from a point 45 feat left of Station 12+64 to a point 45 feat left of Station 14+37 of the centerline of Project 339-D to be abandoned, and in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-76.6 of the said code as amended, the conveyance of said right of way between survey Station 12+64 and survey Station 14+37 so abandoned, to the owner or owners of record to the adjoining lands, is hereby approved at a price considered reasonable and proper by the State Right of Way Engineer, and the Deputy State Highway Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute a deed of quitelaim for same accordingly. Hotion carried.

Moved by Judge Weaver, Seconded by Mr. Holland, that WHENEAS, the Commonwealth in connection with Route 151, State Highway Project 6862-01 in Nelson County did acquire certain lands from J. M. Demron by dead recorded in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court of said County in Deed Book 84, Pages 244 & 243, including all of the lands of the said J. M. Demron lying west of the said Route and Project; and

WHEREAS, the owner of the adjoining land has requested that the triangular parcel of said land so acquired which lies went of and beyond the west right of way line of said Route and Project be conveyed to him in order to provide for the more orderly development of his property; and

WHEREAS, the Deputy State Highway Commissioner has certified in writing that the parcel of land so acquired lying west of the west right of way line of said Boute and Project, same being 40 feet west of and parallel to the survey centerline, from a point opposite approximate survey Station 22+00 to a point opposite survey Station 24+35, does not constitute a section of the public road and is deemed no longer necessary for the uses of the State Highway System.

NOW, THEREFORE, the conveyance of the said parcel of land so certified to the owner or owners of record of the adjoining lands in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-76.6 of the 1950 Code of Virginia as emended is hereby approved, and the State Highway Commissioner or Deputy State Highway Commissioner is hereby authorized to execute a deed conveying same without warranty in the name of the Commonweelth. Motion parried.

THAT WHIREAS, not revenue from state sources for highest purposes, on which appropriations and allocations were based for the fiscal year 1962-63, were estimated prior to the beginning of that year at \$120,424,225, and

MHEREAS, upon final closing of the books for the year ended June 30, 1963, net income from state sources totaled \$125,154,540.95, resulting in an unappropriated believe of \$4,730,315.95, or 3.77% in excess of the above estimate, and
