## MEETING OF THE COMMONWEALTH TRANSPORTATION BOARD

1401 E. Broad Street Richmond, Virginia September 16, 1993 10:00 a.m.

The monthly meeting of the Commonwealth Transportation Board was held in the Board Room at the Department of Transportation Building in Richmond, Virginia on September 16, 1993. The Vice-Chairman, Mr. Ray D. Pethtel, presided.

Present: Messrs. Candler, Davies, Rhea, Waldman, Warner, Wells and Williams and Dr. Thomas, Mrs. Brooks and Mrs. Kincheloe.

Absent: Messrs. Milliken, Howlette, Kay and Mastracco and Mrs. Miller.

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Moved by Mr. Wells, seconded by Dr. Thomas, that the Board approve Permits Issued and Canceled from August 1, 1993 through August 31, 1993, inclusive.

Motion carried.

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On motion of Mr. Wells, seconded by Dr. Thomas, the Board approved Additions, Abandonments or Other Changes in the Secondary System from July 30, 1993 to August 26, 1993, inclusive.

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Moved by Mr. Wells, seconded by Dr. Thomas, that

WHEREAS, by proper resolution, the Board of Supervisors of Carroll County has requested that a certain road which no longer serves as a public necessity be discontinued as part of the Secondary System of Highways.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-150 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, the Commonwealth Transportation Board finds the following section of road is not required for public convenience and is hereby discontinued as part of the Secondary System of Highways, effective this date.

Carroll County - Route 793 - Section 1 of old location 0.06 Mi.

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Moved by Mr. Wells, seconded by Dr. Thomas, that

WHEREAS, Route 174 in Henry County has been altered and reconstructed as shown on plans for Project: 0174-044-102, C-501; and

WHEREAS, six sections of the old road are no longer necessary as a public road, the new road serving the same citizens as the old;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-148 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.10 mile of old Route 174 designated as Section 7 on the plat dated April 17, 1992, Project: 0174-044-102, C-501, be abandoned as a part of the State Highway System, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-144 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.58 mile of old Routes 108 and 174, designated as Sections 1, 2, 3, 6 and 8 on the plat dated April 17, 1992, Project: 0174-044-102, C-501 be discontinued as a part of the State Highway System.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-144 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, 0.10 mile of old Route 58, designated as Section 1 on the plat dated April 8, 1992, Project: 6058-070-110, C501, be discontinued as a part of the State Highway System.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and,

WHEREAS, certain Principal-Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets within the corporate limits of the City of Chesapeake are eligible for such payment; and,

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Chesapeake for maintenance payments on Local Streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the City of Chesapeake for Local Streets be increased by 9.27 centerline miles. This increase is a result of additions of Local Streets as described on tabulation sheets numbered 1 through 11 for the City of Chesapeake, as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated July 19, 1993.

The <u>Local Street</u> additions totaling 9.27 miles increase the total mileage to 610.79 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and,

WHEREAS, certain Principal-Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets within the corporate limits of the City of Danville are eligible for such payment; and,

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Danville for maintenance payments on Local Streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the City of Danville for Local Streets be increased by 0.64 centerline mile. This increase is a result of additions of Local Streets as described on tabulation sheet numbered 1 through 1 for the City of Danville, as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated July 20, 1993.

The tabulation sheet is on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The <u>Local Street</u> additions totaling 0.64 mile increases the total mileage to 178.11 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and,

WHEREAS, certain Principal-Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets within the corporate limits of the City of Fredericksburg are eligible for such payment; and,

WHEREAS, any increase or decrease in centerline mileage of streets eligible for payment is to be approved by the Commonwealth Transportation Board; and

WHEREAS, under the authority of Departmental Policy Memoranda Number 7-4, a city may maintain the street segment within an interstate interchange and receive street payments; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fredericksburg maintains the section of Route 3 within the limits of the I-95 interchange but no longer desires to do so.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the road/street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the City of Fredericksburg for Principal Arterial Roads be decreased by 0.66 centerline mile. This decrease is a result of deletions of Principal Arterial Roads.

The <u>Principal Arterial Road</u> deletions totaling 0.66 mile decreases the total mileage to 6.27 centerline miles of approved roads subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Hampton for maintenance payments on Minor Arterial Roads and Collector Roads and Local Streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the road/street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the City of Hampton for Minor Arterial Roads be increased by 0.03 centerline miles, Collector Roads be increased by 0.64 centerline miles and Local Streets be increased by 1.04 centerline miles. These increases are a result of additions of Minor Arterial Roads and Collector Roads and Local Streets as described on tabulation sheets numbered 1 through 2 for the City of Hampton, as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated August 31, 1993.

The tabulation sheets are on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The <u>Minor Arterial Road</u> additions totaling 0.03 mile increases the total mileage to 75.51 centerline miles of approved roads subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

The <u>Collector Road</u> additions totaling 0.64 mile increases the total mileage to 21.68 centerline miles of approved roads subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

The <u>Local Street</u> additions totaling 1.04 miles increases the total mileage to 300.13 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Harrisonburg for maintenance payments on Local Streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the City of Harrisonburg for Local Streets be increased by 1.68 centerline miles. This increase is a result of additions and deletions of Local Streets as described on tabulation sheet numbered 1 through 1 for the City of Harrisonburg, as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated July 26, 1993.

The tabulation sheet is on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The <u>Local Street</u> additions totaling 1.68 miles increases the total mileage to 72.53 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

WHEREAS, certain Principal-Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets within the corporate limits of the Town of Rocky Mount are eligible for such payment; and, WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the Town of Rocky Mount for maintenance payments on Local Streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the Town of Rocky Mount for Local Streets be increased by 0.25 centerline mile. This increase is a result of additions of Local Streets as described on tabulation sheet numbered 1 through 1 for the Town of Rocky Mount, as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated June 29, 1993.

The tabulation sheet is on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The <u>Local Street</u> additions totaling 0.25 mile increases the total mileage to 18.36 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and,

WHEREAS, certain Principal-Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets within the corporate limits of the Town of Leesburg are eligible for such payment; and,

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the Town of Leesburg for maintenance payments on Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the road/street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the Town of Leesburg for Minor Arterial Roads be increased by 0.49 centerline mile, Collector Roads be increased by 0.28 centerline mile, and Local Streets be

increased by 1.21 centerline miles. These increases are a result of additions of Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets as described on tabulation sheets numbered 1 through 2 for the Town of Leesburg, as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated July 16, 1993.

The tabulation sheets are on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The <u>Minor Arterial Road</u> additions totaling 0.49 mile increases the total mileage to 7.15 centerline miles of approved roads subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

The <u>Collector Road</u> additions totaling 0.28 mile increases the total mileage to 9.94 centerline miles of approved roads subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

The <u>Local Street</u> additions totaling 1.21 miles increases the total mileage to 34.76 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

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Moved by Mr. Wells, seconded by Dr. Thomas, that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and,

WHEREAS, certain Principal-Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets within the corporate limits of the City of Newport News are eligible for such payment; and,

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Newport News for maintenance payments on Local Streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the City of Newport News for Local Streets be increased by 4.15 centerline miles. This increase is a result of additions and deletions of Local Streets as described on tabulation sheets numbered 1 through 4 for the City of Newport News, as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated July 12, 1993.

The tabulation sheets are on file in the Department's Urban Division.

The <u>Local Street</u> additions and deletions totaling 4.15 miles increases the total mileage to 352.51 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and,

WHEREAS, certain Principal-Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets within the corporate limits of the City of Virginia Beach are eligible for such payment; and,

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Virginia Beach for maintenance payments on Minor Arterial Roads and Local Streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the road/street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the City of Virginia Beach for Minor Arterial Roads be increased by 4.24 centerline miles and Local Streets be increased by 19.96 centerline miles. These increases are a result of additions and deletions of Minor Arterial Roads and Local Streets as described on tabulation sheets numbered 1 through 13 for the City of Virginia Beach, as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated July 19, 1993.

The Minor Arterial Road additions and deletions totaling 4.24 miles increases the total mileage to 149.33 centerline miles of approved roads subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

The Local Street additions and deletions totaling 19.96 miles increases the total mileage to 990.40 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Manassas for maintenance payments on Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the road/street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the City of Manassas for Minor Arterial Roads be increased by 1.27 centerline miles, Collector Roads be increased by 0.18 centerline mile, and Local Streets be decreased by 0.94 centerline mile. These increases and decreases are a result of additions and deletions of Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets as described on tabulation sheets numbered 1 through 3 for the City of Manassas, as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated July 17, 1993.

The <u>Minor Arterial Road</u> additions totaling 1.27 miles increases the total mileage to 11.48 centerline miles of approved roads subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

The <u>Collector Road</u> additions totaling 0.28 mile increases the total mileage to 3.79 centerline miles of approved roads subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

The <u>Local Street</u> deletions totaling 0.94 mile decreases the total mileage to 66.69 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and,

WHEREAS, certain Principal-Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets within the corporate limits of the Town of Warrenton are eligible for such payment; and,

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the Town of Warrenton for maintenance payments on Principal/Minor Arterial Roads and Local Streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the road/street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the Town of Warrenton for Principal Arterial Roads be decreased by 1.15 centerline miles, Minor Arterial Roads be increased by 1.15 centerline miles, and Local Streets be increased by 1.20 centerline miles. These increases and decreases are a result of additions and deletions of Principal-Minor Arterial Roads and Local Streets as described on tabulation sheets numbered 1 through 3 for the Town of Warrenton, as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated July 16, 1993.

The <u>Principal Arterial Road</u> deletions totaling 1.15 miles decreases the total mileage to 3.88 centerline miles of approved roads subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

The <u>Minor Arterial Road</u> additions totaling 1.15 miles increases the total mileage to 8.01 centerline miles of approved roads subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

The <u>Local Street</u> additions totaling 1.20 miles increases the total mileage to 18.23 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1993.

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Moved by Mr. Wells, seconded by Dr. Thomas, that

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and,

WHEREAS, certain Principal-Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets within the corporate limits of the City of Portsmouth are eligible for such payment; and,

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the City of Portsmouth for maintenance payments on Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets meeting the required criteria;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the road/street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the City of Portsmouth for Minor Arterial Roads be increased by 0.45 centerline mile, Collector Roads be decreased by 0.44 centerline mile, and Local Streets be increased by 2.40 centerline miles. These increases and

decreases are a result of additions and deletions of Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets as described on tabulation sheets numbered 1 through 4 for the City of Portsmouth, as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated July 20, 1993.

The tabulation sheets are on file in the Department's Urban Division.

WHEREAS, a request was received from the owner of Heishman BMW, for a break (40 feet in width) in the limited access right of way to provide an entrance to the property from Duke Street, for only right turn in/right turn out; and

WHEREAS, the proposed entrance would be located at the westernmost end of the property so that disruption to traffic movements at the interchange are minimized; and

WHEREAS, such break in limited access has been supported by the City of Alexandria, and would support economic development in the area; and

WHEREAS, Department and City staff have concluded that providing the entrance at the westernmost end of the property will meet design criteria and not present a safety hazard to the traveling public; and

WHEREAS, all costs of engineering and construction associated with the access are to be borne by others; and

WHEREAS, upon completion of work, all roadway construction within the right of way shall be the property of the Commonwealth.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that in consideration of the above mentioned conditions, the Commonwealth Transportation Board hereby grants a break in the existing limited access line subject to the conditions referred to above and, further, subject to payment from the City of a sum determined by the Department which represents the benefits and amenities realized by the City in having the access point on Duke Street, Route 236, based on a fair market value appraisal prepared by the Department.

Gen. Charles E. Williams, Chief Operating Officer of the Toll Road Corporation of Virginia, appeared before the Board and gave an update on the Dulles Toll Road Extension. According to Gen. Williams, things are progressing well and a groundbreaking is scheduled for September 29, 1993 at 11:00 a.m.

Moved by Mr. Waldman, seconded by Mr. Warner, that

WHEREAS, on July 20, 1989, this Board approved the project location and design of the Dulles Toll Road Extension and set forth certain terms and conditions for the construction of the facility by the Toll Road Corporation of Virginia (TRCV) among which included that the project will be completed and open to traffic no later than December 31, 1991 and the project costs shall not exceed \$155 million except as may be necessary to satisfy the certain terms and conditions set forth in the resolution; and

WHEREAS, on May 17, 1990, this Board amended its resolution of July 20, 1989 to provide for changes to certain design features for several of the interchanges on the toll road and further provided that the toll road be completed and open to traffic no later than April 1, 1993 unless delays are beyond the control of TRCV and that the total project costs shall not exceed \$227.4 million exclusive of costs necessary to satisfy the additional requirements of the amended resolution; and

WHEREAS, on May 16, 1991, this Board adopted a resolution which superseded the July 20, 1989 and May 17, 1990 resolutions as a result of TRCV desiring to make certain changes in the location and design of the Dulles Toll Road Extension in order to comply with its needs and the conditions of the Metropolitan Washington Airports Authority, the Corps of Engineers and other governmental requirements, and further requested that the project completion date be extended to December 31, 1993 unless delays in construction are beyond the control of TRCV and further that the project costs shall not exceed \$292.8 million; and

WHEREAS, on June 20, 1991, this Board adopted a resolution to facilitate TRCV's request of the State Corporation Commission to transfer its Certificate of Authority to construct the Dulles Toll Road Extension to Toll Road Investors Partnership II and provided that the Dulles Toll Road Extension be substantially complete and open to traffic no later than December 31, 1993 and that total project cost incurred through the completion of construction shall be approximately \$295 million; and

WHEREAS, on July 16, 1992, this Board adopted a resolution at the request of TRCV to amend the completion date and cost estimate of the Dulles Toll Road Extension due to increases in costs and delays in commencing construction with such new date for completion of the project set at January 31, 1995, with construction commencing on September 30, 1992 and a cost of approximately \$315 million to be incurred through the completion of construction; and

WHEREAS, on November 19, 1992, this Board adopted a resolution authorizing the Commissioner to set certain terms and conditions relative to the payment of funds owed by TRCV to VDOT for cost related to project development with such authority being contingent upon the enactment of the necessary statutory changes by the General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, on June 20, 1993, this Board adopted a resolution at the request of TRCV to amend the completion date and cost estimate of the Dulles Toll Road Extension due to a decrease in project costs and delays in commencing construction with such new date for the completion of construction set at December 28, 1995 with construction commencing on June 28, 1993 and a cost of \$290 million to be incurred through the completion of construction; and

WHEREAS, TRCV now anticipates the commencement of construction on September 30, 1993 with a March 31, 1996 completion date and a construction period project cost of \$293.8 million.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that TRCV shall use all reasonable efforts to have the construction of the Dulles Toll Road Extension complete and open to traffic no later than March 31, 1996, but construction shall commence no later than September 30, 1993 and continue without interruption (except for force majeure) until construction is complete and that total cash costs incurred through the completion of construction shall be approximately \$293.8 million.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that prior resolution of June 20, 1991 as modified by the resolution adopted by the Board on November 19, 1992 remains in full force and effect except as specifically modified herein.

Motion carried.

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Mr. Davies asked for an update on the Jamestown-Scotland Ferry (between Jamestown in James City County and Scotland Wharf in Surry County). Mr. J. S. Hodge, the Department's Chief Engineer, explained the various steps the Department has undertaken to improve the ferry service; i.e., upgraded the schedule, increased the number of crew members and obtained a permit to dredge the channel for the boats. The bids for a new boat will be received the week of September 20.
