Minutes of the meetings of the State Highway Commission, held at Williamsburg and Richmond, Yirgihia, October 4th and 6th, 1920.

The State Highway Commission with all members in attendance, namely, Vade R. Massie, Chairman, Henry P. Book, Scaretary, James A. Mandy, Jr., Horace Hardaway, and F. W. Davie, assembled at the Court House in Villiameburg on Honday, October 4th, at 11 A. M. to hear the appeal of certain fresholders of James City County from the decision of the Highway Commissioner, G. P. Coleman, in regard to his location of that portion of Route 9, lying between Villiamsburg and Lee Hall.

After an extensive hearing from counsel on both sides of the controversy, the Countssion adjourned to meet in Richmond on the 6th for the further consideration of this matter.

The Highway Commission ascembled in the rooms of the Highway Demartment, 116 South Third Street, on Wednesday worning, October 6th at 10 A. M., and after due consideration of the appeal of the James City County freeholders the following action was taken:

WHEREAS, The State Highway Considerion having heard the appeal of the citizens of the County of James City, State of Virginia, in record to the location from Williamsburg via Grove Station to Lee Holl from the Commissioner's location via Springfield and Halstoad's Point to Lee Hall, in the Court House at Williamsburg on October 4th, 1920; it is the decision of the Highway Commissioner having heretofore unquestionable located, established, and built Route 9 from Williamsburg to Springfield, the Highway Commission is without jurisdiction from Williamsburg to Springfield; and the Commission is of the spinion that the practical route from Springfield to Lee Hall is via Halstead's Point;

THER SPORT, it is ordered that the appeal is dismissed.

On motion of Mr. Hardamay, the following traffic officers were appointed:

- S. J. Dudley, Faintenance Foremen, to succeed L. A. Carter, resigned, C. V. Cooper, Foremen Bugh Williams
- O. V. Cooper, Poresen " High Williams R. W. Morgler, Maintenands Foremen " R.V.Potterson O. T. Burch, Haintenands Foremen, Rosnoke, as a new Officer, Ec. 96

On motion of Mr. Davie, the following addition was made to the rules and regulations governing traffic over State Highways:

The State Highway Commissioner, or his duly authorized representative, shall have power to close to traffic any State read or highway, or section or sections thereof, whenever in the spinion of the Commissioner, or his representative, it is necessary or advisable to do so, on account of construction, reconstruction, or repair of said read or highway, or section or sections thereof.

The Consissioner, on closing a read or highway, shell provide, wherever possible, for reasonable and thecessary detours around the read or highway, or section or sections thereof, which may be so closed to traffic.

To person, firm or corporation, simil, without a penult in writing, signed by the State Highest Commissioner, or his representative, enter apon, see, travel on or pass over, or drive any vehicle, implement or contrivence thereon, or cause to be entered upon, used, travelled on, or passed over or driven, any vehicle, implement or contrivence thereon, any State read or highest, or section or sections thereof, which has been closed to traffic, as herein provided.

Ho person, firm or comporation shall remove, injure, deface, or destroy, or cause to be removed, injured, defaced, er destroyed, any barricade, sign, notice, or other thing placed on or near any State Read or highway, under the provisions of this regulation, to indicate that said road or highway, or scotion or sections thereof, is slosed to traffic.

On motion of Hr. Hardaway, the Sacretary of the Conmission was instructed to notify the proprietor of the Beverley Garage at Staumton, Virginia, that his application for a permit to be allowed to erect signs on the Valley Turnpike, known as Route 3, was rejected.

On motion of Hr. Davie, the Secretary was instructed to notify Hr. C. H. Butcher, President of the United Collieries, Incorporated, of Saint Charles, Virginia, that the charge in the allocations, as recommended by him, could not be made.

Open the request of the State Highway Commissioner, and on motion of Er. Davis, the Commission adopted, by unanimous vote, the following resolutions

DE IT REBOLUED, That Mayo C. Brown of Campbell County, Virginia, be, and he is hereby authorised and empowered to institute and conduct in the Circuit Court of Campbell County, Virginia, condensation proceedings for the number of having condensed sufficient lands of J. H. Brown, located an State Highway No. 18, running from Passock, Campbell County, to Bustburg, Virginia, for the construction of that parties of the said State Righway that passocs through the lands of the said J. H. Brown, as shown by the maps, diagrams and records now on file in the office of the State Highway Countssioner in Richard, Virginia, and the said Mayo C. Brown is hereby appointed the agent of the said State Righway Countssions for the purpose of instituting cald proceedings, and taking the necessary caths required therein.

upon the request of the Highway Countenioner, and on motion of Mr. Davie, the Countenion adopted undamentally the following resolution, extherising Henry Roberts and R. J. Squares, or either of them, to institute, conduct and conclude condensation proceedings to acquire necessary land for Noute 10 of The State Highway System between Orecadale and Whahington County Line in Machington, County?

resolved, That in the judgment of this Commission it is necessary, requisite and suitable for the alteration, reconstruction and maintenance of a partion of State Mighaey No.10, between Greendale and Washington County Line in Washington County. Virginia, to charge the location of said State Mighaey through the lands of N. W. Hann as shown by line "B" on the blueprint map attached hereto, and made a part hereof, the distance through eatd lands along said line "B" being approximately 772 foot; and

RESOLVED further that this Commission deems it necessary, requisite, and suitable that the right of way for said highway for said distance of approximately 778 feet through the lands of N. U.

from should be 50 feet wide, and that said line To should be in the center of said 50 feet right or way; and

RESOLVED further, that the profile showing the grade line, cuto and fills, as shown on said blueprint map, be made a part hereof, and that the grade line shown thorsen be adopted and cetablished;

RESOLATE further, that R. J. Semmers, Communical this Attorney for Eachington County, Virginia, and Henry Raberts of Bristol, Virginia, or either of them, be appointed attorneys for this Commission, and directed to some said right of way from M. W. Marm by gift, purchase or condomnation proceedings.

On motion of Hr. Hardamy the circutes of the meetings of September 13th to 18th, inclusive, were read and approved, and the Chairman authorized to sign the same.

On motion, the Commission adjourneds
