MINUTES OF THE MESTING OF THE STATE HIGHWAY COLDUESLOW, HELD IN RICHEOMD, VIRGINIA, OCTOBER STR, THE, AND STR, AND AN INSPECTION OF PROPOSED HOUTES NOR STATE BLOW-WAY NO. 1, DETAILED RICHEOM AND PREDERICHEBURG, COTOBER STR AND TER,

1 9 2 1.

The State Highway Commission assembled in the rooms of the State Highway Department, 116 South Third Street, on Vednesday, October 5, 1921, at 10 A. H. with the following members in attendance, vis; Wade H. Manuic, Chairman, Henry P. Seck, Secretary, F. W. Davie, and Rorace Hardewey.

Mr. James A. Bear of Roanske City, who was appointed by the Hanorable Westmereland Davis, Covernor of Virginia, to fill the unempired term of the late James A. Mandy, Sr., of Material Bridge, appeared at this meeting and was sected as a member of the Commission.

Mr. George G. Peery of Chapman, Peary, and Suchman, Attorneys for certain citizens of Taxevell County, interested in what is known as the Soute from Taxevell, via Liberty, Eniden Springs, Copenhaver, to the Bussell County Line, petitioned the Countswion to grant a rehearing of the matter, covered by the order of the Coumission on March 30, 1922, on the ground that there was an adoption of this route by the Highway Commissioner, under the Ast of 1918, and that the Commission was without authority or jurisdiction to change the route so adopted by the Commissioner, under the Act of 1918, and upon the further ground that this route is better, norm communical, and best serves the interests of the State and the public at large.

On motion of Mr. Mardaway, the politics for a hearing was rejected.

Wr. R. B. Turner, representing the form of Clarksville presented an application from the Town to advance the necessary funds for paving the Main Street of Clarksville from its northern to its southern limits, on State Read No. 1. (about three quarters of a mile).

On motion of Mr. Davie, the offer was accepted and the Chairman and Secretary of the Commission wave authorised and empowered to enter into the usual agreement with the Youn of Charksville, in the name and on behalf of the State Highway Commission.

Mr. Holman Willis headed a delegation of Remoke Officials and citizens, and presented an application from the Romoke Association of Commerce by Jos. T. Engleby.

President, asking permission to advance \$250,000, for construction purposes on State Road No. 3 from Romoke to Rocky Mount.

On metion of Wr. Hardway the application was approved, and the Chairman and Segretary were authorised and

empowered to enter into the usual agreement with the Respoke Association of Commerce in the name of and on behalf of the State Highway Commission, the money so advanced being used for drainage and grading, and out-ficient funds to be allocated for the surfacing of this read in 1923-1924.

Hr. John W. Hevener, with a delegation from Highland County, with the request that the Commission alloonts sufficient funds to build that portion of State Road No. 9 from Sest Augusta to the top of the Ehemandoch Mountain, about five miles. The request was listed by the Commission for future occusiveration.

Mr. Saunders appeared with a delegation from South Hill requesting the Commission to favor the addition to the State Highway System of the road from Bouth Hill southward to the North Carolina Line Via Palmer Springs.

Pending inspection of this proposed addition, no action was taken by the Complesion.

The Commission required a bond from the Resnoke Railway and Sleetrie Company with surety to the extent of \$1000.00, as a condition of the Permit to creat pales and string wires on State Road No. 10 from Sales to the plant of the Sales Brick Company.

The budget of the State Highway Department for the years 1922 - 1923 was submitted by the State Highway Commissioner, and offer consideration was approved by the Commission, and forwarded to the Covernor's Budget Countities.

The Budget of wants for the State Righway Commission for 1922 - 1923 was also approved, and for-warded to the Governor's Budget Committee,

The minutes of the meeting of September 17, 1921, held at Richmond, Virginia, were read and approved, and the Chairman authorised to sign the same as correct.

On motion of Mr. Hardeney, the following resolutions covaring condemnation proceedings to be instituted to acquire the necessary right of way for State highways in various sections of the State, were adopted by the Highway Commission:

On motion of Mr. Davis them of \$27,000 was allocated for resurfacing work on Route No. 1 from Fredericks-burg wouth.

After some consideration of the matter, and at the request of Mr. Bear, the new member who had not the opportunity to read all of the papers in the case, the Rockbridge emitest, involving the final location of Route Mo. 3 between Loxington and Natural Bridge, was passed by until the next meeting on October 17th, 1921, On metion of Mr. Hardaway the additional sum of \$20,000, for construction purposes (convict cump) was allocated to Houte No. 18 from Afton southwardly.
