Minutes of the Meeting of the State Highway Commission Held in Lexington, Va., October 30, 1947.

At 6:30 P.M. Thursday, October 30, 1947, the State Highway Commission met in the Robert B. Lee Rotel, Lexington, Va. Present - Mesars. E. P. Barrow, Geo. P. DeHardit, J. P. Harpine, Wayles R. Harrison, S. W. Rawls, Howard C. Rogers, J. B. Wampler and J. A. Anderson, Chairman, The meeting was called to order by the Chairman.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Harpine, that the minutes of the September 30-October 1 meeting be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawle, seconded by Mr. Harpine, that the permits cancelled by the Commissioner, as authorized June 25, 1947, and recorded in the Auditing Division, be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Harpine, that the Commission approve the permits issued from October 1 to October 30, 1947, inclusive, as recorded in the Auditing Division. Motion carried.

Request of the Elizabeth City County Board of Supervisors that the Commission declare as limited access Route 134 from Hampton to its junction with Route 17 and Route 351 from the East approach of the bridge over Route 168 to Queen Street in Hampton, was considered by the Commission. After carefully discussing the request and in view of the policy of the Commission to hold the use of Limited Access to routes having a large volume of through traffic it was moved by Mr. Rowls and seconded by Mr. BeHardit, that the Commission not so designate the routes named above. Notion carried.

A request for a hearing on the relocation of Route 3 near Litualter was discussed. It was decided that if those interested in a hearing desired it they would be given an opportunity to appear before the Commission in Richmond on Manday, December 15, 1947.

The request by resolution of the Thomas Melson, Jr. Chapter, S.A.R. Society, to make the proposed Yorktown-Gloucester Bridge, was considered by the Commission. It was decided that the Commission would go further into this matter after the proposed bridge is actually under construction and on the way to completion.

A resolution of October 15 from the Board of Supervisors of Rockingham was read to the Commission, expressing approxiation for the allocation made to the County for the fiscal year 1948-1949.

The program for the Highway Conference at V.M.I., Lexington, October 51-Nevember 1 was discussed with the Commission.

A statement on revenues, balances, etc. as of October 1, 1947, was given to the Commission.

Plans for the winter '47-'48, relative to equipment, materials, etc. were discussed at some length.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that the following list of claims, which the Department has been unable to collect, be cancelled as requested:

Moved by Mr. Rawle, seconded by Mr. DeHardit, that as provided by Chapter 212, Section 1, Act approved March 19, 1926, and upon recommendation of the Commissioner, the following sections of the Primary System in the grounds of William and Mary College being no longer necessary for uses as a highway the same be abandoned:

A to F - 0.034 mile F to G - 0.038 mile F to H - 0.095 mile Total - 0.167 mile

all as shown on blue print dated September 1947 showing location of compus reads. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. DeHardit, that as provided by Chapter 172, Acts of 1986, the following sections of road be added to the Primary System within the grounds of William and Mary College:

> A to B - 0.048 mile C to Cl - 0.220 * Cl to D - 0.059 " Dl to E - 0.078 * Veterana Housing Area- 0.246 "

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawle, seconded by Mr. Harpine, that the Commission confirm award of contract, on bids received October 2, for the construction of Project 261 Ml, Houte 460, E.C.L. Richlands-0,53 Mi. W. of E.C.L. Richlands, to the low bidder, Messe Construction Co., Wytheville, Va., at the bid of \$62,195.37, that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work and \$4,456.48 for work by State Forces, making a total of approximately \$51,860.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rewls, seconded by Mr. Harpine, that the Commission confirm award of contract, on bids received October 2, for the construction of Project 3 261 B4, Route 460, Bridge over Clinch River, 0.5 Mile from Richlands, to the low bidder, McDowall & Wood, Rosnoke, Va., at the bid of \$89,425.30 and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$98,350.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawle, seconded by Mr. Harpine, that the Commission confirm award of contract, on bids received October 2, for the construction of Project 8 1468 Bl. Route 508, Bridge over Three Creak, 4 Miles from Joyner, Southempton County, to the low bidder, W. H. Scott, Inc., Franklin, Va., at the bid of \$29,834.80, and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$52,800.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Harpine, that the Commission confirm award of contract, on bids received October 2, for the construction of Project S 167 AR2, R2, Route 50, 1.411 Mi. W. of W.C.L. Middleburg. 2.388 Mi. W. of W.C.L. Middleburg, to the low bidder, Hodgin & Gilliam, Upperville, Va., at the bid of \$138,145.49, that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, and \$1,524.60 for work by State Forces, Making a total of approximately \$153,460.00 chargeable to this project. No allocation having been set up the amount to be carried as a deficit for the present. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Harpine, that the Commission confirm sward of contract, on bids received October 2, for the construction of Project 1407 F1.F2.B2, Route 38, 1.230 Mi. S. of Int. Route 148 (Scotts Fork)-0.700 Mi. B. of Int. Route 153, Amelia County, to the low bidder, Perkins-Barnes Construction Co. Inc., Blackstone, Va., at the bid of \$78,197.82, omitting the items of surface source and covering material, making the net bid \$39,596.20 and 10% additional to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, a total of approximately \$43,335.00 as the contract price and \$34,171.00 for work by State forces, making a total of approximately \$77,500.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawla, seconded by Mr. Wampler, that as provided by Chapter 212, Section 1, Act approved March 19, 1926, and upon reccamendation of the Commissioner the following section of old Route 3 in Richmond County being no longer necessary for uses as a highway the same be abandoned upon opening of new section in Lieu thereof, the Right of Way of same to be retained for storage purposes: Section 1 shown on plat dated May 26, 1947, Project 628- CRl. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Barrow, seconded by Mr. Rogers that as provided by Chapter 212, Section 2, Act approved March 19, 1926, and upon recomendation of the Commissioner, the following section of Route 501 in Campbell County being no longer necessary for uses as a public highway the same be abandoned altogether as such and a public notice thereof be given as provided by the Act referred to:

Old location of Route 601 from the new location at Station 277,30, looping southeasterly 0.50 mile to Station 290,70 - length 0.50 mile.

Haid section is shown on plans on file in the office of the Department of Highways, Richmond, Virginia. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Barrow, seconded by Mr. Wampler, as provided by Chapter 10, Act approved February 7, 1940, that since in the relocation and improvement of Houte 35, Project 1069-CM-1, between 0.123 mile west of east corporate limits of Richmond and Highland Springs, Henrico County, sections of the right of way of old road were not used and will not be required for the uses of the State Highway System, as certified by the Chairman of the State Highway Commission, the conveyance of these shandoned sections of old right of way to the adjoining property owner, A. H. Hechler, is approved; and the Chairman is hereby authorized to execute in the name of the Commonwealth deed of quitolain, making conveyance of said lands to A. H. Hechler. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Barrow, seconded by Mr. Wampler, as provided by Chapter 10, Lot approved February 7, 1940, that since portion of residue parcel of land acquired from Harley Dalton and Minnie M. Dalton in connection with right of way settlement for relocated Houte 114, Project 1164-CR-1, near Fairlawn, Pulaski County, containing approximately 0.30 acre, and lying outside of the right of way retained for Route 114 and Route 695 (old Pepper's Ferry Turnpike) will not be required for the uses of the State Highway System, as certified by the Chairman of the State Highway Commission, the sale of this residue parcel to the trustees of the Southeast Fellowship of Brethren Churches for a consideration of \$500,00 is approved; and the Chairman is hereby authorized to execute in the name of the Commonwealth deed of quitolain, making conveyance of said residue parcel of land to the trustees of the Southeast Fellowship of Brethren Churches. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Wampler, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that the Commission add to the Primary System 1,087 feet or approximately 0.20 mile of road within the grounds of the State Teachers College at Radford, from Route 11 to Tyler Avenue, as provided by Chapter 172, Acts of 1988. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Barpine, seconded by Mr. Wampler, that the City of Waynesboro having annexed sections of the Primary Highest System effective January I, 1948, the following be approved as designated streets within the city and to receive additional maintenance funds of \$4,000.00 per mile:

Route 12, from the intersection of Route 250 west to the new corporate limits; also from the old north corporate limits to the new north corporate limits -----1.65 miles

Route 250, from old west corporate limits to the new west corporate limits; also from the old south corporate limits to the new south corporate limits ----2,22 miles

a total of 8.01 miles of streets in the city. Motion carried.

There are, at present, two routes numbered 29 between Oulpoper and Warrenton which cause much confusion to strangers. It is deemed desirable to renumber one of these highways. Therefore, it was:

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Rawls;

that (1) Present State Route 29 between Route U. S. 522 in
the town of Culpeper and a point on said route approximately at the
intersection of Culpeper Secondary Route 526, together with the extension
of State Route 29 over a new location as provided for in Project 1130-E
to U. S. Route 211 at a point near the intersection of Route U. S. 211
and Culpeper Secondary Route 622, be renumbered State Route 229;
and that (2) With the approval of the Boards of Supervisors

and that (2) With the approval of the Boards of Supervisors of both Gulpeper and Fauguier Counties, that portion of State Route 29 between the south end of Project 1130-R and Alt. Route U. S. 15 in Marrenton revert to the respective Secondary Systems of each county, a fistance of 12,09 miles, of which 5,17 miles are in Culpeper County and 8,92 miles are in Esuquier County. Motion parried.

A construction project which has been under way for several years has been recently completed from a point on Route U. S. 29 north of Anherst to another point on Route U. S. 29 at the village of Collegn. This newly completed highway is of the most modern construction and climinates a "dog's leg" and a very crocked piece of road on Route U. S. 29 between the same termini. Therefore, it was:

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Rawle;

that (1) The highway recently constructed, which starts at a point approximately one and one-half miles north of the M.C.L. of Amberst and extends over a portion of State Route 150 to the village of College, be numbered Route U. S. 29;

and that (2) Present Route U. S. 29 from its southern junction with the new highway to an intersection with State Route 151 at Piney River, be renumbered State Route 151;

and that (5) The sections of State Route 151 and of U. S. Route 29 between Route U. S. 60 and College, be regumbered State Route 158. Hotion carried.

A new route, now numbered Alt. U. S. 60 has been completed between Callaghan in Alleghany County and the West Virginia State line. It is on much better alignment, grade, sight distance, and is wider than present Route U. S. 60 between the same termini. It is also approximately seven miles shorter in distance. Therefore, it was:

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Rawls;

that (1) Alt. Route U. S. 60 between Callaghan and the West Virginia State line be changed to Route U. S. 80;

and that (2) Present Route U. S. 60 between Crows and the West Virginia State line be changed to State Route 311;

and that (5) Prosent Route U. S. 60 between Callaghan and Crows be remembered State Route 159. Motion carried.

Mr. Marpine referred to the situation on Route 11 which will be developed eventually into a 4-lane highway and stressed the value of strip soning to prevent construction which would interfere with the ultimate development of the highway.

Mr. Wampler referred to the fact that Mr. John Blakemore was attempting to secure right of way for the Old Glade project on the north line. General Anderson advised Mr. Wampler that so far as he knew, the north line was no longer under ammideration and he had no knowledge as to why Mr. Blakemore was attempting to get these rights of way. He suggested, however, that Mr. Blakemore might feel that if he had secured the rights of way that he could have some arguments to back up the people who apparently have a preference for the north line.

Resolution dated Cotober 27 from the Portsmouth Chamber of Commerce, was presented to the Commission relative to a four-lane bridge over the Western Branch of Elisabeth River. The Commission carefully studied the report of engineers of the Department and is of the opinion that a two-lane structure will serve traffic for several years and that the two-lane bridge can be made a part of a four-lane bridge when conditions justify a four-lane structure. The Commission directed that the two-lane structure be built as soon as practical.

The Chairman and Chief Engineer, Mr. Mullen, brought the Commission up to date on the proposed York River Bridge at Yorktown.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.
