Minutes of Meeting of the State Highway Commission of Virginia, Held in Richmond, October 8, 1967

At 9:00 A.M. Tuesday morning, October 8th, the Commission met in the Central Office Building. Present - Nussrs. J. A. Anderson, E. P. Barrow, G. Wallace Carper, S. D. Nay, Burgess E. Nelson, S. W. Rawls, Tucker C. Watkins, Jr., and Wm. A. Wright. The meeting was called to order by the chairman.

General Anderson warmly thanked the Commission for being present and being on time. He advised them that there would be a meeting in Lexington on Thursday, Movember 7, during the V.M.I.-Highway Conference. It was further stated that the conference this year would be of particular interest to the officials of the counties, towns and cities. He saked for suggestions for improvement of attendance.

It was moved by Mr. Rawle and seconded by Mr. Carper, that the minutes of the meeting of September 4-5, 1957, be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Senater Wright, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that WHEREAS, by \$55-252 of the Gode of Virginia of 1950, as amended, the State Highway Commission is authorized to establish rules and regulations ogvering the use of the Hampton Roads Bridge-Tunnel Project; and WHEREAS, \$9-5.4 of the Code of Virginia of 1950 provides that in an emergency the Commission may adopt rules and regulations necessary for the immediate preservation of the public safety which rules and regulations shall become effective immediately upon adoption; and WHEREAS, the project is to be opened to the public on or about Movember 1, 1957, and it is necessary for the safety of the public using the project that rules and regulations be effective upon its opening; NOW THEREFURE, HE IT RESOLVED, that the rules and regulations identified as "Commonwealth of Virginia, Department of Highways, Richmond, Virginia, Rules and Regulations Covering the Vee of the Hampton Roads Bridge-Tunnel Project" are adopted to become effective immediately. Motion carried.

Noved by Mr. Hawls, seconded by Mr. Barrow, that WHEREAS, by Section 46-540 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, the State Highway Commission is authorized to establish speed limits less than those prescribed by Title 48 of the Code of Virginia of 1950 on sections of roads constituting a part of the State Highway System and Secondary System of State Highways; and WHEREAS, a reduction in the speed on the sections of roadway upon which maintenance and survey operations are being performed will promote the safety of travel on such roadways; NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the speed limit on all sections of roadway upon which maintenance and survey operations are being performed is reduced to twenty five (28) miles per hour and that signs be posted on both ends of such sections designating the speed limit as herein established. Motion carried.

Letter of October 2 to the Governor and the Budget Advisory Committee, Re - Suggested Budget 1958-160, was read to the Commission, each member being given a copy.

The Members were each asked for suggestions and comments and any new business and miscellaneous matters they wished to discuss. Mr. Carper referred to the problem of location of Routes 29 and 211. A resume of what has taken place was given the Countssion, the Department having decided to consider. .m. alternate line. Mr. Carper will contect Mr. John Rust and other interested parties looking to working out a satisfactory solution to the problem.

The VAIC Study and report was referred to. Mr. Mills, Traffic and Planning Engineer, stated that the Council was in session today to consider at the request of the Governor two problems - automobile grave-yerds and readende development; Mr. Boaturight having requested a representative of the Department be present. Miscussion and comments followed.

Mr. Quade of Parsons, Brincherhoff, Hell & Macdonald, consulting engineers, appeared before the Countesion as requested, with reference to the opinion of his company regarding the proposed Chesapeake Bay crossing. He discussed at length the Revenus Bond Projects, the revenues collected and the funds on hand at the end of the fiscal year; and his interpretation of the law regarding the problem and the responsibility of the Highway Countesion. It was stated that the problem involved for the Countesion only one question - the North-South Boute. The Countesion has for consideration only the route selected by the Cheespeake Bay Ferry Countesion.

Letters received from several officials and citisens relative to the location of the project, most of them favoring the East-West Route, were read to the Commission together with the replies. Senator Melson, a member of the Chesapeake Bay Ferry Commission, gave his views on the benefits to be derived from the Morth-South route. A report by the Department's engineers was read to the Commission by Mr. D. B. Fugate, issistant Chief Engineer. A full discussion followed. It was stated that any further hearings would have to be requested by the Chesapeake Bay Ferry Commission. The meeting was declared open for questions, suggestions and remarks partinent thereto.

It was noved by Mr. Rawls and seconded by Mr. Carper that the Commission approve the North-South route as selected by the Chesapeaks Bay Ferry Commission and grant a permit accordingly. After such discussion it was as an alternate moved by Mr. Barrow and seconded by Mr. Watkins that the opinion of Consulting Engineers be made public and that written comments and suggestions be received by the Commission before October 25; that such comments and suggestions as may be received be considered at a future Commission meeting, and the alternate motion carried,

It was then moved by Mr. Rawls and seconded by Mr. Carper that the Commission meet on October 24 to consider the problem in the light of any written comments and suggestions reserved by October 25rd. Motion carried.

There being no further business before the meeting the Commission adjourned at noon and proceeded to lunch.
