

THAT the section of the proposed Blacksburg By-pass in Montgomery County, beginning at a point north of Blacksburg near the intersection with existing Route 460 and being shown on the plans for State Project 7460-060-102, RW-201, C-501, right of Station 1076 + 00 (EBL) and left of Station 1076 + 60 (WBL) and extending in a southerly direction approximately 7.0 miles to a point near the intersection of existing Route 460 south of Blacksburg, said point being shown on the aforementioned plans right of Station 1442 + 00 (EBL) and left of Station 1442 + 00 (WBL), including any necessary relocations, interchanges, ramps, connections, etc., be designated as a limited access highway in accordance with Article 3, Chapter 1, Title 33 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended.

Points of access permitted at grade under this resolution are as follows:

- A connection with existing Route 460 left of Station 1083 + 83.07 (WBL)
- 2. The intersection of Route 660 left of Station 1183 + 73.22 (WBL) and right of Station 1183 + 41.40 (EBL).
- 3. The intersection of Route 685 relocated left of Station 1259 +. 76, 79 (WBL) and right of Station 1260 + 54, 27 (EBL)

These points of access are to be made a part of the right of way transaction and record.

THAT the section of temporary Route 599 (Woodrow Wilson Parkway) in Augusta County beginning at a point at the intersection of Route 11 North of Staunton and being shown on the plans for State Project 0599-007-101. RW201, left of Station 541 + 45 (ultimate WBL) and right of Station 642 + 00 (EBL) and extending in an easterly direction to connect to the previously designated limited access points of interstate Boute 81 at the now proposed interchange of Routes 599 and 81, including any necessary relocations, interchanges, ramps, connections, etc., be designated as a limited access highway in accordance with Article 3, Chapter 1, Title 33 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended.

At-grade access is to be permitted under this resolution at the intersection of a proposed service road, left and right of Station 697 + 30.45 (E and WBL) until such time when a proposed interchange is constructed.

This access point is to be made a part of the right of way transaction and record.

Moved by Mr. Fitzpatrick, Seconded by Mr. Sciater, that

WHEREAS, § 46.1-171.1 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, authorizes the State Highway Commission to prohibit the use of the Interstate System and other controlled – access highways or parts thereof (as described in § 33-36.1 of the Code) by certain persons, animals and vehicles when necessary to promote safety; and

WHEREAS, engineers of the Highway Department have completed the study of Interstate Route 581 under its jurisdiction now open to the public and determined that it should be prohibited to the use of pedestrians, persons riding bicycles, horse-drawn vehicles, self-propelled machinery and equipment, and animals led, ridden, or driven on the hoof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that (1) pedestrians, (2) persons riding bicycles, (3) horse-drawn vehicles, (4) self - propelled machinery or equipment, and (5) animals led, ridden or driven on the hoof be prohibited from using interstate Route 581 from Route 81 to 0.098 Mile South of the intersection of Route 11 (Williamson Road) in the City of Rosnoke, a distance of approximately 5.8 miles.

THAT WHEREAS, by resolution the Board of Supervisors of Charles City County, Virginia has requested the State Highway Commission to name the hridge over the James River from Jordon's Point in Prince George County to Harrison's Point in Charles City County on Houte 156 the "Benjamin Harrison Memorial Bridge"; and

WHEREAS, The City Council of the City of Hopewell has concurred in this request; and

WHEREAS, the National Society, Daughters of Founders and Patriots of America has agreed to bear the cost and expense incident to the erection of appropriate plaques on the said bridge; and

WHEREAS, § 33-173 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, gives the State Highway Commission the authority to so name bridges on the State Highway System.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Commission hereby designates the bridge over the James River from Jordan's Point in Prince George County to Harrison's Point in Charles City County on Route 156, the "Benjamin Harrison Memorial Bridge" and directs that appropriate plaques be erected on said bridge.

MOTION CARRIED.

Moved by Mr. Holland, Seconded by Mr. Sciater, that

WHEREAS, the Federal - Ald Highway Act of 1962 amended \$9(a), Chapter 1 of Title 23, United States Code by adding Section 134, Transportation planning in certain urban areas to develop "long - range highway plans and programs which are properly coordinated with plans for improvements in other affected forms of transportation and which are formulated with due consideration to their probable effect on the future development of urban areas of more than fifty thousand population. After July 1, 1965, the Secretary (of Commerce) shall not approve under Section 105 of this title any program for projects in any urban area of more

than fifty thousand population unless he finds that such projects are based on a continuing comprehensive transportation planning process carried on cooperatively by States and local communities in conformance with the objectives stated in this section. If and

WHEREAS, the initial transportation plan identified as the Highway Transportation Plan, Volume II, has been developed for the Southeastern Virginia Regional Area and

WHEREAS, the Southeastern Virginia Regional Planning Commission and the Department have agreed in writing to a cooperative, continuing transportation planning process based upon the Highway Transportation Plan in accordance with the requirements of the Federal - Aid Highway Act of 1962, and

WHEREAS, the Highway Transportation Plan has been officially adopted by the governing bodies of the Cities of Chesapeake, Norfolk, Portsmouth, Suffolk and Virginia Beach, and the County of Nansemond.

NOW, THEREFORE, RE IT RESOLVED, that the aforedescribed plan or as the plan may be revised subsequently by cooperative action of the Southeastern Virginia Regional Planning Commission, the governing bodies of the Cities of Chesspeaks, Norfolk, Portsmouth, Suffolk and Virginia Beach, the County of Nansemond and the Department, is hereby adopted by the Department of Highways as a guide in the development of arterials and freeways incorporated in the plan as funds become available for this purpose.

MOTION CARRIED.

Moved by Judge Weaver, Seconded by Mr. Holland, that

WHEREAS, the State and Federal highway laws require that public hearings be held by the State Highway Commission under certain conditions prior to the establishment of a highway, and

WHEREAS, after careful study and investigation it is deemed advisable to set forth a general policy under which such hearings will be held, and WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission, on May 1, 1956, adopted a resolution setting forth a statement of policy on public hearings, which statement of policy is presently in need of amendment in order to meet the changing problems present by highway development;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the following policy on public hearings be and the same is hereby adopted by this Commission:

I For All Interstate System Projects -

- (a) A public hearing will be held.
- (b) Thirty days' written notice of the proposed public hearing, showing the time and place, shall be given to the Clerk of the Circuit Court of the county in which the road is proposed, in accordance with § 33-17 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended.

II For All Primary System Projects -

A public hearing will be held, or a notice of willingness to hold a public hearing will be stated in public advertisement. If a written request is received, the hearing will be held in accordance with Federal and State statutes.

III For All Secondary System Projects -

A notice of willingness to hold a public hearing will be stated in public advertisement, or a public hearing will be held on any project to be financed with Federal Aid Secondary funds, which involves the by-passing of, or going through, any city, town or village, either incorporated or unincorporated. If a request is received for a public hearing, the public hearing will be held in accordance with Federal and State statutes. The willingness to hold a public hearing may be advertised or a public hearing may be held on other projects where there is an unusual amount of public interest.

Moved by Mr. Solater, Seconded by Mr. Holland, that the Commission confirm letter ballot action adopting the following resolution

WHEREAS, Section 33-136.1 of the Code of Virginia provides a fund for fiscal 1966-67 of \$1,500,000 to ".... be expended by the Commission for constructing, reconstructing, maintaining or improving access roads within counties, cities and towns to industrial sites on which manufacturing, processing or other establishments will be built under firm contract or are already constructed."; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the town of Wytheville and the Board of Supervisors of Wythe County have by resolutions requested the use of industrial access funds for the purpose of providing access to the new plant being constructed by the Textile Realty Corporation, just north of the Norfolk and Western Railway and west of U. S. Route 11 in the town of Wytheville, estimated to cost \$15,000; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this request falls within the intent of Section 38-136.1 and has complied with the provisions of the Highway Commission's policy on the use of industrial access funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that \$15,000 from the industrial access fund for 1986-67 be allocated for providing proper access to the new facility of the Textile Reality Corporation, just north of the Norfolk and Western Railway and west of Route 11 in the town of Wytheville, in Wythe County, Project 9999-139-101, C501, contingent upon the necessary right of way and adjustment of utilities being furnished at no cost to the Commonwealth.

Seconded by Mr. Holland,

That the Road and Bridge Specifications, as revised, amended, and published in the revised edition, dated July 1, 1966, are hereby adopted as the specifications for the governing and administration of all contracts on construction projects advertised on and after October 15, 1966, on behalf of the Virginia Department of Highways, such Specifications superseding the Road and Bridge Specifications dated April 1, 1958.

MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Fugute explained the new 1968 Federal Aid Apportionments of \$129 Million. These apportionments include \$104 Million for the Interstate System, which Mr. Fugate said is less than needed for completion of the Interstate System by 1972 and will necessitate stretching out the program, probably to 1975. The Appalachian Program was also discussed in light of the present outlook on funds.
