MEETING OF STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION

Lexington, Virginia

October 25, 1973

The monthly meeting of the State Highway Commission was held in Alumni Hall at Virginia Military Institute in Lexington, Virginia, on October 25, 1973, at 1 p.m. The Chairman, Mr. Douglas B. Fugate, presided.

On motion of Mr. Crowe, seconded by Mr. Glass, minutes of the meeting of September 20, 1973, were approved.

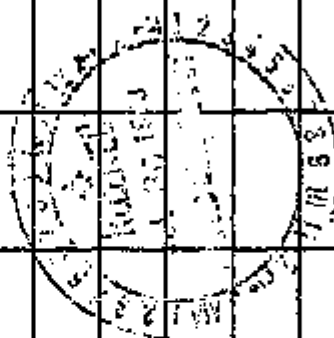

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WHEREAS, this Commission deploras apparent improper conduct in state-consultant relationships in other states as reported in recent weeks, and is determined that such wrongdoing shall not occur in the highway program in Virginia.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the State Highway Commission hereby reaffirms its existing policies related to employees, contractors, engineering consultants, suppliers, and all others employed by the Department in any way and emphasizes its requirement for complete compliance to insure continued high standards of integrity and performance by the Department and its employees, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any new contractor or consulting engineer seeking to do business with the Highway Department be sent a copy of this confirming resolution.
