 - (b) Federal Funds Provided: \$75,000
 - (c) Match: provided by Shenandoah Telecommunications Company
- Develop a Shenandoah Valley Public Mobility Project to develop a ridesharing, vehicle sharing, demand responsive, agency-based central dispatching system to enhance human service transportation in the Northern Shenandoah Valley.
 - (a) Project coordinated by Northwestern Community Services.
 - (b) Federal Funds Provided: \$80,867.
 - (c) Match: provided by participating human service agencies
- Develop a portable video teleconferencing application between local rescue squads and the Pegasus Flight emergency medical rescue helicopter at the University of Virginia.
- (a) Project coordinated by Pegasus Flight Program, University of Virginia Health Sciences Center
 - (b) Federal Funds Provided: \$40,000
 - (c) Match: provided by University of Virginia Health Sciences Center.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board hereby approves the Partnership Agreement with the Federal Highway Administration for the deployment of Intelligent Transportation Systems in the Northern Shenandoah Valley region.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board authorizes the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner to execute the Partnership Agreement for the administration of the projects and any amendments to the Agreement necessitated by their operation.
