Minutes of meetings of the State Highway Commission, held at Richmond, Appointtox and Buckinghom Court House, and an inspection trip over sections of State Highways Hos.13 and 10, and a proposed addition to the State System, November 4th and 5th,1930.

The State Highway Commission with Pessrs. H. P. Beck, Secretary, Hornor Hardaway, James A. Mundy, Jr., and F. V. Davie in attendance not in the rooms of the Highway Department at 116 South Third Street, Highwand, Virginia, on Thursday, November 4th, 1920, for a conference with the Righway Counterloser, C. P. Colemn, and for the transaction of general business.

In the efferment, Mesers. H. P. Beck, Rorace Hardaway, and P. V. Davis, together with Highway Commissioner Colsman, left the City and proceeded by automobile over Houte 13 to Farmville, where the night was epent.

Leaving Fermille on the morning of Hovember 5th, the Commission proceeded over Route 10 to Appenditor, where they attended and took part in a meeting of the citizens of Appenditor County with reference to the location of Route 10 between Fermium wills and Appenditor, and when to hear any remains concerning the addition of the highway running from Appenditor to Buckingham Court House to the present State Highway System.

The Commission made a trip over this suggested route and attended another meeting of representative citizens at Buckingham Court House, after which they returned to Richmond over Route 13.

On the evening of Nevember 5th; all mombers of the Righway Commission, namely Wade H. Massie, Chairman, Henry P. Beck, Secretary, James A. Rundy, Jr., Horace Hardaway, and F. W. Davie,

met in the Righmond Rotel and the following business was transmoted.

The policy of providing for detoure, as suggested by Commissioner Coleman, received the approval of the Commission.

The applications of the Peoples Hational Hank of Charlottesville and the National Bank of Charlottesville for permission to place sign posts on certain State Highways were rejected, upon motion of Mr. Davie.

The minutes of the meeting of Sotober 4th and 6th were read, and on motion of Mr. Hardway were approved and the Chairman authorized to sign the same.

On motion of Mr. Davie, R. D. Bryant was elected to the Traffic Police Porce.

Highway Combinstoner Coloman was authorized to purchase a quarry at Gulpener for a sue not to exceed \$4500.

Bond of the Morthern Virginia Power Company was reported by the Highway Commissioner to have been properly executed and on motion was received by the Commission, and ordered to be filed.

The contract for the Alexandria and Washington concrete road was laid before the Commission by the Highmay Commissioner. The question was generally discussed and it was the epinion of the Commission that the contract should be let.

There being no further business, on motion, the Commission adjourned.
