## MEETING OF STATE HIGHWAY AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION RICHMOND, VIRGINIA

**NOVEMBER 27, 28, 1922** 

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## STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION HELD NOVEMBER 27th & 28th,1922.

On the morning of Movember 27th, the Commission, consisting of Messre. H. G. Shirley, Chairman, Vada H. Massie, Secretary, I. Valke Truxtum, R. K. Banders, and Bulk B. Sproul, not at the office of the State Righway Department, Tenth and Marshall Streets at 9100 c'clock, and proceeded to inspect the Routes between Richmond and Spotsylvania Court House, returning to the office at 2:00 c'clock when a Public Hearing was given to the office at 2:00 c'clock when a Public Hearing was given to all those interested in the location of Boute No. 1, between Selemon's Store and Fredericksburg.

After the Public hearing the Commission had a meeting in the Commission's Rock where they heard a delegation from Petersburg and Representatives of the Virginia Railway and Pewer Company in regard to the proposed bridge over the Appointton River on Route No. 1, leading into Petersburg and granting the railway a right to lay tracks along and ever the highway to the proposed bridge. After a thorough discussion of the advantages and disadvantages it would be to have the Virginia Railway and Power Company's cars run over this bridge, it was decided that on Vednasday morning at 9:30 c'olook, the City Manager of Petersburg and the Engineer for the Virginia Railway and Power Company Should meet at the office of the Chairman of the State Righway

A delegation from St. Paul, headed by Er. M. Lyon, appeared before the Commission and made a protest against noving the Convict Camp from the section of Route 11 on which there is a contest in regard to the location of this Route, pending the decision of the Court. They were advised that the Commission was compelled to move this camp but that the Case would be pushed as rapidly as possible and should there be any unnecessary delay that a camp would be put back on this project.

A delegation from the Chamber of Commerce of Lynchburg bended by Mr. Bell and Mr. Thomas, case before the Commission to assertain what assistance could be given towards building the unscupleted sections of the road between Lynchburg and Fatural Bridge if they could raise a portion of the funds needed, under the Robertson Act. The Commission was unable to give the smount of funds that would be available on this Boute but advised that they would make allocations to this Project just as though me work had been done or advancements made and that allocations would be made in proportion to funds available.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the secting recess until the next morning. Motion carried.

The meetingwas called to order by the Chairman and the minutes of the last meeting read and approved.

Moved by Mr. Messie, seconded by Mr. Banders, that the Commission accept the advancement under the Robertson Act of \$275,000.00 to construct the section of the Lee Highway from Pairfax C.H. to the Arlington County Line. Motion Carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxtum, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the salary of Mr. G. P. Coleman, Commissioner, be reised from \$5,000.00 to \$7,500.00 per year and that the Chairman be authorized to take up with the Governor along with the salary schedule of the Department for his approval this question. Notice carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxtum, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the salary of Miss A. D. Calmes be increased from \$125.00 to \$150.00 per month, effective Movember 15th. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Senders, seconded by Mr. Trustum, that salary of Miss S. A. Borkeley be increased from \$100.00 to \$125.00 per month, effective Bovember 15th. Motionomyriad.

Moved by Mr. Massis, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that all the bids submitted for the bridge over Piscateway Creek be rejected and that the work be done by force account as recommended by Commissioner Column in his letter of Movember 25th. Motion carried

Moved by Mr. Sunders, seconded by Mr. Massie, that bid of Sanderson and Parker, Camp Lee, Virginia, for the construction of the bridge over Buffalo Greek in Prince Edward County, Project No. 76-A, Soute 10, be accepted at their price of \$15,518,60 and

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that the Chairman be authorized to investigate the responsibility of Ford and Harvey, of Lynchburg, Virginia, and if they are responsible contractors, let the contract for the construction of 5.5 miles of concrete road between Franklin and Carreville, Route 5, Project 160-A, to them at their bid of \$158,146.67 adding 10% for engineering and contingencies, making a total of \$173,961.34 chargeable to this Project, but if they are found not to be responsible contractors, to reject all bids on this Project and readvertise the work. Motion carried.

Noved by Mr. Truxtum, sedended by Mr. Sanders, that the contract for the construction of 1.74 miles of gravel read between Washington's Old Home and Intersection of Route 7, Westmoreland County, Project 216, Route 7-T be awarded to B. W. Momery, Oak Grove, Virginia, at his bid of \$11,171.85 and that 106 be added for engineering and contingencies making atotal of \$12,289.03 to be charged against this Project. Notion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sanders, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the bid of Egodes and Waugh, Raccoon Ford, Virginia, on 8.44 miles of soil road between Wilderness Tavern and Lignus in Culpeper and Grange Counties, Project 5-185, Route 7, amounting to \$37,084.28, be accepted and that 10% be added for engineering and contingencies making a total chargeable to this Project of \$40,792.70. Notice carried.

Noved by Mr. Senders, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Chairman be authorized to notify the Halifax Power Company that the Commission believes that the lighting of the bridge over the Dah River on Houte 18 is a local matter and that arrangements for its lighting will have to be made by the local authorities. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massix, seconded by Mr. Truxtum, that the Chairman be authorized to review the latter submitted by Mr. Truxtum to be sent out to the Shariffs and Judges of the Counties involved and take such action as he may deem best to organize the traffic police in the vicinity of Morfolk. Motion carried.

Haved by Mr. Massis, seconded by Mr. Truxtum, that Mr. R. L. Hall, be appointed traffic officer No. 172. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxtun, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that the location of Route 9 between Mathews C.H. and Gloucester C.H. be by What is known as the Southern Route running at or near North and Foster. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Truxtup, that the location of Route Fo. 7-X in Northumberland and Westmoreland Counties be by the most practical route from Calleo to a point at or near Hague, thence to connect with Route 7 at a point near Tampleman's Cross Roads. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxtum, seconded by Mr. Banders, that the date for a hearing on the Boute between Glade Springs and Saltville be on February 6th, 1923, at 10:00 A.M. in the Court House at Abingdon, Virginia. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxtum, seconded by Mr. Massie, that the Chairman be authorized to immediately take steps to start the work on Project P-165, Route 9, held by S. R. Curtis and if the contractor refused to proceed with the work to take such action as he deems proper to proceed with the work. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Truxtun, that Mr. Massic be authorized to take up with Mr. Bickford and Mr.Livesey the acquisition of the right of way through their property with suthority to settle same so that the work on Project F-165, Boute 9, can be proceeded with without delay. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxtum, seconded by Mr. Senders, that the Chairman be authorized to notify Senator Goolrick that if the Commission takes into the State System the section of road through the Town of Omenoock under the 24% Clause, that they will accept
