## Minutes of the Meeting of the State Highway Commission of Virginia, Held in Lexington, November 12, 1948.

On Friday, Ecvember 12, the State Highway Commission met for lunch at 12:20 P.M. at the Robert E. Lee Hotel, Lexington, Virginia, Immediately after lunch the Commission held an executive meeting and transmoted the following business. Present - Massre. J. A. Anderson, E. P. Barrow, Geo. P. DeHardit, J. P. Harpine, Wayles R. Harrison, S. W. Rawls, J. B. Wampler and J. F. Wysor.

Moved by Mr. Mampler, seconded by Mr. DeBardit, that the Commission confirm the minutes of the September 10 meeting. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawle, seconded by Mr. Harpine, that the Gommission approve the permits issued from September 10 to Movember 12, inclusive, as recorded in the Auditing Division. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Hawls, seconded by Mr. Harpine, that the permits cancelled by the Commission since the September 10 meeting, as sutherized June 25, 1947, and recorded in the Auditing Division, be approved. Motion carried.

of these requests, the Commission is of the opinion that plans should be prepared with the estimated cost and other plans showing the location of the sidewalk through Backingham Court House on the present alignment of Route 60 together with estimate of cost, and that these plans with all of the facts should be referred back to the Beard of Supervisors of Buckingham County; that the Board should then call a meeting of all interested citizens for a thorough discussion of the various suggestions and arrive at a final decision; and that furthermore a qualified representative of the Highway Department should be present at this meeting to explain fully to the Board of Supervisors and the people what the proposals are.

Mr. J. R. Armstrong of Churchville, Augusta County, appeared before the Commission in company with Mr. A. S. Mattex, Associate Right of Way Engineer. He presented the problem of his property and Route 250 immediately in front of it. After carefully considering the matter the Commission decided that it should hold to the recommended line and that Mr. Armstrong should be so notified.

A report on the restudy of the Clarement Forry was presented to the Commission, as requested at its meeting December 15, 1947. The Commission decided, after carefully considering the matter, that it was not feasible at this time to operate a State-owned forry at this location.

A letter of Movember 11, 1948, from Mr. G. Loslie Hell, President of the Tidewater Automobile Association, relative to the Virginia Ferry Corporation's case regarding the Cape Charles Ferry, was read to the Commission. The Commission instructed the Chairman to let the Court decide the matter in its entirety.

On motion made and seconded the Chairman was instructed to forward to the Governor the Annual Report of the Commission for the fiscal year July 1, 1947-June 30, 1948, a copy of which had been mailed to each member of the Commission. THEREAS The Honorable George Preston Coleman died at his home in Williamsburg, Virginia, on June 17, 1948; and

WHEREAS Mr. Colomon was the second Highway Commissioner of Virginia, and an outstanding pioneer in highway development in Virginia and in the Mation; and

MHEREAS during the years he served as Highway Commissioner he established the firm foundation for the improvement of Virginia's highways and by personal example endowed the Highway Department with the highest ideals of service and devotion; and

tained a deep interest in the Bighway Department, its accomplishments and its personnel: Now therefore be it

HESOLVED that the Highway Department has suffered a devastating loss in the death of Kr. Coleman, that his entire career is an cutstanding example of the loyalty and devotion Virginia has received from her illustrious sons and his death is an irreparable loss to his native State; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to Mrs. George Fresten Colomon.

Moved by Mr. DoHardit, acconded by Mr. Harpine, that the Commission make the following changes in Route numbers as recommended by its engineers:

- 1. Remarker the portion of Route 128 between Route 297 in Compbell County, and Route 460 in Bedford County to carry new Route Mumber 126 (shown in red on map attached to file).
- 2. Extend the marking of Route 297 from its present terminus at the intersection of Route 128 northeast, to the intersection of Route 29 in Lynchburg, eliminating Route 128 between these points (shown in green on map attached to file).
- Eliminate Routo 128 overlapping Route 29 (shown in yellow on map attached to file).

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Harrison, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that the location description of the re-routing of U. S. Route 250 and Virginia Route 20 as proposed by the City of Charlottesville and requested in City Manager J. E. Bowen's letter to General J. A. Anderson dated September 18, 1948, in the City of Charlottesville, be as follows - the total mileage to remain the same:

## U. S. Route 250 Westbound

Beginning at the Eest City Limits of Charlottesville at the west end of the Rivama River Bridge proceeding west to the intersection of High Street (High Street is shown on the map as Free Bridge Read from Long Street to Lexington Avenue), left on Righ Street westerly to Preston Avenue, thence over Preston Avenue westerly to Grady Avenue, left and westerly along Grady Avenue to Rugby Read, left and southerly ever Rugby Read, to University Drive (Nest Main Street) right and westerly on University Drive (Nest Main Street) to Ivy Read thence along Ivy Read to the West City Limits of Charlottesville.

## U. S. Route 250 Eastbound

Beginning at the West City Limits of Charlottesville on Ivy Road and easterly along Ivy Road to University Drive (West Main Street), easterly along University Drive (West Main Street) to West Main Street, thence easterly ever West Main Street to Water Street, right and easterly along Water Street to East Seventh Street at C & O Compass, left and northerly along Mast Seventh Street to High Street, right and easterly along High Street to Long Street, right and easterly along High Street to Long Street, right and easterly to the East City Limits at the west end of the Rivanna River Bridge.

## Virginia Route 20

Beginning at the intersection of 7th and High Streets and southerly along 7th Street to the C & C Overpans, (this section overlaps a portion of U, S. Route 250 castbound) over the C & C Overpass and southerly along Monticello Road to the South City Limits. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. DeHardit, and seconded by Mr. Hampler, that a proposed Primary Construction Program for work through June 28, 1949, be accepted as presented, and that the following transfer of funds be approved -

From Route 1, Richmond District, Malthall Underpass Revision - 3660,000.
To Route 1, Richmond District, at Alberta.

From Balance of the 10% Fund of the 1945-1947 Federal Aid - 3 71,000.
To Routes 25 and 58, Cate City-South, Bristol District.

From Route 360, Goodes Bridge over Appearattor River = 3 27,000.
To Route 144, Bridge over Hamlin Creek, Richmond District,
Chesterfield County. Motion carried.

The Chairman brought to the Commission the executed agreement between the Department of Highways and the University of Virginia, covering the establishment and operation of laboratories, etc. for highway research. On motion of Mr. DeMardit, seconded by Mr. Tysor, the Commission approved of The Virginia Council of Highway Investigation and Research as covered by the agreement. Motion carried.

The Commission attended the Highmay Conference held at V.M.I. November 11-13 and was pleased and delighted with every phase.

The Commission was advised that The Revenue Bond Act, which is before the Supreme Court for a decision as to its constitutionality, has not as yet been noted on.

A statement as to the Financial Control of the Department as of October 51, 1946, was given to the Commission.

Hears. Mysor and Harrison, and other members of the Commission, expressed the feeling that highway revenues were not keeping pace with costs. The Commissioner explained to the Commission that a study was underway which should show us by July 1, 1948, whether or not our revenues would keep us reasonably abreast of our schedule set up in the Twenty Fear Plan. The Commission also asked that our Five up in the Twenty Fear Plan. The Commission also asked that our Five Year Program for allocations on the Primary System be ready by March 15, 1949.

It was decided that the next meeting of the Commission be tentatively set for the latter half of March 1949, at which time the tentative allocations for 1949-1950 will be made.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned at \$100 Pak.
