## Minutes of Hesting of the State Highway Commission of Virginia, Held in Richmond November 25, 1957

At 9:00 o'clock, Tuesday morning, November 25th, the Commission met in the Central Office Building, Richmond, Virginia. Present - Messre, F. A. Davis, Acting Commissioner, E. P. Barrow, S. S. Flythe, S. D. May, Burgess E. Helson, S. W. Rawle, Tucker C. Watkins, Jr., and Wm. A. Wright.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Davis.

Mr. Bavis expressed his appreciation for having the privilege of being associated with the Members of the Commission even on a temperary basis for which he was appointed; expressing his feeling of inadequacy to holding a position which had been so ably handled by former Commissioners Coleman, Shirley and Anderson. Mr. Flythe replied to Mr. Davis' statement to the effect that he personally had absolute confidence in his ability and in that of Mr. Fugate. Mr. Rawls and other members of the Commission stated they were in full accord with Mr. Flythe's statement.

Mr. Davis read to the Commission a letter received this morning from Mr. G. Wallace Carper, who is unable to attend the meeting because of being hospitalised.

Hoved by Mr. Rawle, seconded by Mr. Barrow, that the minutes of the meeting of October 24th, 1957, be approved. Motion carried.

Howed by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Barrow, that the minutes of the secting of Howember 7th, 1957, be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. May, seconded by Mr. Barrow, that the Commission approve the parmits issued from the Hovember 7th meeting to date, inclusive, as recorded in the Auditing Division. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. May, asconded by Mr. Berrow, that the permits cancelled from the 7th of November to date, inclusive, be approved, as suthorized June 25, 1947, and recorded in the Department's records. Motion carried.

Hoved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. May, that the Commission confirm its letter ballot action awarding contract on Project 7250-104-070 (New), Route 250-A, 0.106 Mile E. of Int. of St. Clair Avenue-NCL of Charlottesville, Albemarle County, to the low bidder, S. L. Williamson Company, Inc., Charlottesville, Va., at the bid of \$29,919.54, that 106 additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work and \$440.00 for work by State Forces, making a total of approximately \$35,550.00 chargeable to this project: financed \$16,450.00 Federal, \$8,450.00 State and \$8,450.00 Charlottesville funds. Motion carried.

Moved by Senator Wright, seconded by Mr. Rawle, that WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 116(c) of the Federal Aid Highway Act of 1955, a public hearing was held in the Town Hall at Colonial Beach, on September 10, 1957, concerning the proposed reconstruction of Route 205 from 5.451 Miles East of Intersection of Route 301 to 0.322 Mile West of the West Corporate Limits of Colonial Beach, Virginia, in King George and Westmoreland Counties, State Projects 0205-048-005, 0205-098-005-007, Federal Project 9-940(2); WHEREAS, proper notice was given in advance and all those present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the construction as pleaned, their statements being duly recorded and WHEREAS, the economic effects of the location and the proposed improvements have been examined and given proper consideration, and this evidence, along with all other, has been carefully reviewed, now therefore HE IT RESOLVED, that the construction of this project is approved in accordance with the plans as proposed and presented by the Engineering Division of the Department of Highways, except that due to the great amount of local opposition and at the request of the Town Council of Colonial Beach, that portion of the project within the Corporate Limits of Colonial Beach has been deleted from the plan for the present proposed construction. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. May, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that WMERRAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 116(c) of the Federal Aid Highway Act of 1956, a PUBLIC HEARING was held in the Court House in Marion, Virginia, on November 15, 1957, concerning the proposed reconstruction of Route 11 and Interstate Route 81 from 0.11 Mile East of Holaton River Bridge (Bast of Seven Mile Ford) to Intersection Route 11 1.0 Mile East E.C.L. Marion, Smyth County; WHEREAS, proper notice was given in sovence and all those present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the construction as planned, their statements being duly recorded and WHISHEAS, the aconomic affects of the location and the proposed improvements have been exemined and given proper consideration and this evidence, along with all other, has been carefully reviewed, now therefore BE IT RESOLVED, that the construction of readway along the location shown and designated as Line "A" (South of Marion) on the map of the Department entitled "Proposed Interstate Highway Development Route 11, Interstate Route 81, Smyth County," be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawle, seconded by Senator Wright, that as provided under Article 6.1, Section 55-76.5 of the 1950 Gode of Virginia, as smanded, and upon recommendation of the Acting Commissioner, the following section of old Route 64 in Russell County, being no longer necessary for uses as a highway it be abandoned to the extent of alteration: Section 1 shown on plat dated May 14, 1957, Project 4665-04-06. Forther, as provided under Article 2, Section 55-27 of the 1950 Code, Amended, Sections 2, 3 and 4 shown on the plat referred to be transferred from the Primary System to the Secondary System. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Remis, seconded by Senator Wright, that as provided under Article 6.1, Section 85-76.5 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, Amended, and upon recommunication of the Acting Commissioner, the following sections of old location of Route 860 in King Millian County being no longer necessary for uses as a highway, they be abandoned to the extent of alteration: Sections 1, 4, 5 and 14 shown on plat dated June 7, 1957, Project 2550-01-02. That as provided under Article 2, Section 53-27 of the said Code, Amended, Sections 2, 3 and 6 be transferred from the Primary System to the Secondary System. Further, as provided under Article 2, Section 53-141 of the 1950 Code, Amended, Sections 9, 10, 11 and 12 be added to the Secondary System as connections. Also, as provided under Article 2, Section 55-26 of the 1950 Code, as smended, Section 15 be added to the Primary System as a connection; all as shown on the plat dated June 7, 1957, Project 2550-01-02. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Flyths, that, WHEREAS, by proper resolutions the various Boards of Supervisors have requested the discontinuance of certain roads in the Secondary System, and Whereas, the Resident Engineers representing the Commission, did post notices and hold hearings in the respective counties to ascertain whether or not such roads should be discontinued, the proposed discontinuances meeting no valid opposition; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the following roads be discontinued as parts of the Secondary System as provided by Section 53-76.7 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended; effective this date: CAMPBELL COURTY - Old location of Route 788, Project 1515-20: Section 5, from Ste. 60/60 north 0.100 Mile to Sta. 65/20 Section 6A, from Sta. 82/40 to 0.055 Mile north Section 7, from Sta. 105/40 northwest 0,160 Kile to Sta. 115/70 Section 84, from Sts. 115/80 to 0.084 Mile north . . . . 0.562 KING WILLIAM COUNTY - Section 2 of old location of Route 518, 0.21 from Sta. 29/20 to Sta. 59/25, Project 1350-15 MEDICAL PROPERTY - Section 3 of old location of Route 712, from 0.08 8ta, 178,80 to Sta, 182,770, Project 1558-36 TAZEMALL COUNTY - Section 1 of old location of Route 651, from 0.06 Sta. 16/75 to Sta. 19/45, Project 1392-09-15 . . . . . . Motion carried.

Hoved by Mr. Flythe, seconded by Mr. Barrow, that, WREREAS, under authority of Section 85-115.2 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, request is made by the City of Hopewell for payment at the base rate of \$500 per mile annually on additional streets meeting the required standards; NOW, THEREFORE, HE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly maintenance payments at the base rate of \$500 per mile annually be made to the City of Hopewell on additional streets totaling 1.521 miles; effective beginning the third quarter, January 1, 1958. Motion carried.

Moved by Senator Nelson, seconded by Mr. Berrow, that, WHEREAS, a portion of Route 2945 in Fairfax County running westwardly from its intersection with Route 7 has been abandoned by the Board of Supervisors of Fairfax County by resolution adopted at its meeting on June 5, 1957, in accordance with the provisions of Section 55-78.8 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, and WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 55-78.11 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, the State Highway Commissioner has certified in writing to the State Highway Commission and to the governing body of Fairfax County that its use is no longer deemed necessary NOW, THEREFORE, as provided in Section 55-76.11 the conveyance by deed of quitolaim to the owner or owners of the adjoining lands is hereby approved and the State Highway Commissioner is authorized to execute such a deed accordingly. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Flythe, seconded by Mr. Sarrow, that, WHEREAS, under authority of Section 55-115.2 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as seemed, request is made by City of Buena Vista for payment at the base rate of \$500 per mile annually on additional streets meeting the required standards; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly maintenance payments at the base rate of \$500 Per Mile annually be made to the City of Buena Vista on additional streets totaling 2.865 Miles, effective beginning the third quarter, January 1, 1958. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Flythe, seconded by Mr. Barrow, that WHEREAS, under authority of Section 55-50.2 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, request is made by the Town Council of Fairfax for additional mileage on streets meeting required standards and subject to payment at the base rate of \$300 per mile annually; NOW, THEREFORE, HE IT RESOLVED, that the eligible streets totaling 1.891 Miles be added to the designated streets for payment to the Town of Fairfax, affective beginning the third quarter, January 1, 1958. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawle, seconded by Senator Helson, that, WHEREAS, Boute 168 is designated via the Bridge-Tunnel crossing Hampton Roads and through Morfolk and South Morfolk replacing present Route 170, and whereas due to this routing of Route 168 through the cities it is also practicable to continue Boute 168 over present Route 170 in Norfolk County to the Morth Carolina Line, and whereas present Route 170 continuing from Virginia into North Carolina has been approved by the Morth Carolina Highway Commission on Movember 4, 1957 for its designation as Route 158; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESCLVED, that present Route 170 in Morfolk County be renumbered to carry Route number 168, from the south corporate limits of Fouth Morfolk south to the North Carolina State Line; also the portion of present Route 168 leading from the east corporate limits of Norfolk east to an intersection with Houte 60 in Princess Anne County be renumbered to carry Route 170. Motion carried.

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Norfolk-Portemouth Ferry was closed to traffic effective July 1, 1955,
and houte 450-A (Tidewater Drive) was opened for traffic effective July.
1, 1956, and WHEREAS, adjustment in maintenance payments to the Gity of

other streets, now, therefore BE IT RESOLVED, that under authority of

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Senator Welson, that WHEREAS, the Highway Commission is authorised to make certain payments to cities for street purposes, and WHEREAS, the Highway Commission has selected certain streets within the Corporate Limits of the City of Norfolk for such payments, and WHEREAS, the construction of the Hempton Roads Bridge-Tunnel Facility and other construction render it necessary to smend the selection of such streets and having the concurrence of the City of Norfolk, now, therefore HE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 55-115 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as emended, the primary route extensions Within the City of Morfolk be re-established as follows: U. S. Route 58 - Beginning at the ECL of Morfolk, center of Broad Creek Bridge; thence westerly on Virginia Beach Boulevard to Tidewater Drive; themse, southerly on Tidewater Drive to City Hall Avenue; themse westerly on City Hall Avenue to Elisabeth River Tunnel Commission Bridge and viaduot; thence, south on disabeth River Turnel Commission Bridge and viaduct to south and of Bridge. . (Tunnel Commission maintains route to City of Portsmouth.) Not Length for payment 4.25 miles; V. S. Route 58 continues south from the south end of Klisebeth River Turnel Commission Bridge southerly through the Turnel into Portsmouth; State Route 166 - Beginning at the SCL of Morfolk, (State Route 166) overlaps V. S. Route 460, northerly along Wilson Road, Campostella Road, Brumblaton Avenue to Park Avenue, (end overlap); thence northeast along Park Avenue to Princess Anne Road; thence east on Princess Anne Road to Military Highway; thence overlapping U. S. Route 15 and continuing east along Princess Anne Road to ECL of Morfolk, center of Bridge over City of Norfolk Water Works Lake. Net length for payment 4.04 miles: U. S. Route 15 - Beginning at ECL of Norfolk, center of Bridge over City of Morfolk Water Works Lake; thence, westerly on Princess Anne Soad to Military Highway; thence, south on Hillitary Highway to SCL Norfolk. Net length for payment 0.68 miles; U. S. Route 60 - Beginning at AL of Horfolk; thence, northwesterly on

U. S. Route 60 - Beginning at ACL of Horfolk; thence, northwesterly on Ocean View Avenue to the Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel project. Het length for payment 5.00 miles;

State Route 557 - Beginning at the intersection of Taussig Boulevard and Hampton Boulevard, thence, south on Hampton Boulevard to 21st Street; thence, easterly on 21st Street to Monticello Avenue; thence, overlapping U. S. Boute 460 southerly on Monticello Avenue to Virginia Beach Boulevard, (end overlap); thence easterly on Virginia Beach Boulevard to Tidewater Drive; thence, southerly overlapping U. S. Route 58 on Tidewater Drive, City Hall Avenue, Elisabeth River Tunnel Commission Bridge and visduct crossing the Eastern Branch of the Elizabeth River to State Street (end overlap); thence, southeast on State Street to Liberty Street; thence, southeast on Liberty Street to South Main Street; thence, south on South Main Street to Buinbridge Boulevard; thence, southeast on Bainbridge Boulevard to ECL of Morfolk. Net length for payment 8.51 miles; Southbound traffic on State Route 587, routed over Walnut Street from Elizabeth Biver Tunnal Commission project to Liberty Street;

Alternate U.S. Route 450 - Beginning at south end of the Elizabeth River Tunnel Commission Bridge over Eastern Branch of Elizabeth River, Alternate U.S. Route 460 overlaps U.S. Route 58 northerly on Elizabeth River Tunnel Commission Bridge and violut to City Hall Avenue (end overlap); thence, westerly on City Hall Avenue to Monticello Avenue; thence, northerly on Monticello Avenue to Bank Street. Net length for payment 1.14 miles;

Northbound traffic on U. S. Alternate 480 is routed north over Bank Street from City Hall Avenue to Monticello Avenue; State Route 188 - Beginning at SCL of Norfolk; thence, northerly on

Campostello Road to Wilson Road; thence, northerly, overlapping, U. S. Route 460 on Campostello Road, Brambleton Avenue to Tidewater Brive (end overlap); thence, northeasterly overlapping U. S. Route 58 on Tidewater Brive to Virginia Seach Boulevard (and overlap); thence, northeasterly on Tidewater Brive to beginning of Hampton Roads Tunnel Approach, (205' W. of north right of way line Stanley Street). Net length for payment 5.16 miles;

HAMPTON ROADS TURNEL APPROACH ROADS: Beginning 206' north of north right of way line, Stanley Street on Tidewater Drive; thence, running northerly on Tidewater Drive to West Ocean View Avenue; thence westerly on West Ocean View Avenue to south end of Bridge, (beginning of Heapton Roads Bridge Tunnel structure). Length 5.485 miles;

State Route 170 - Beginning at SOL of Norfolk; thence, westerly on Little Creek Road, overlapping State Route 185, from Military Highway to Taussig Boulevard; thence, northwesterly on Taussig Boulevard to Hempton Boulevard. Not length for payment 4.02 miles;

State Route 194 - Beginning at the intersection Little Creek Road and Chesepeake Street; thence, southerly on Chesapeake Street to Sewell Point Road; thence, southerly on Sewells Point Road to Princess Anne Road. Net length for payment 5.46 miles:

State Route 185 - Beginning at south ECL of Norfolk; thence northwesterly on Kempsville Road to Princess Anne Road; thence westerly overlapping U. S. Route 15 on Princess Anne Road to Hilitary Highway (end overlap); thence, northwesterly on Hilitary Highway to ME.C.L. of Norfolk; thence, northwesterly on Hilitary Highway in Princess Anne County for a distance of 1.65 miles to SE.C.L. of Norfolk; thence, northwesterly on Military Highway to Little Creek Road, (Route 170); thence, westerly on Little Creek Road, Route 557. Net length for payment 5.670 miles;

U. S. Route 460 - Beginning at Ocean View Avenue, Route 60, at intersection of Duffy Street; thence, southerly on Duffy Street; thence, southerly on Granby Street; thence, southerly on Church Street to Honticello Avenue; thence, southerly on Monticello Avenue to Bank Street; thence, southerly on Bank Street to Brambleton Avenue; thence, southerly on Brambleton Avenue; thence, southeasterly on Brambleton Avenue to Campostella Road; thence southerly on Wilson Road; thence southerly on Wilson Road to SCL of Morfolk. Het length for payment 10,26 miles;

Southbound traffic on U. S. Route 450 will be routed southerly over Alternate U. S. Route 450 from Bank Street to Brambleton Avenue; thence, west on Brambleton Avenue to reintersect U. S. Route 460 at intersection of Bank Street.

The mileage for the City of Norfolk, due to this re-establishment of route extensions is 55.455 miles, % ses 5.465 miles of Route 168 to be maintained under separate agreement with the Hampton Roads Bridge-Tunnel Facility, giving a net total of 49.97 miles to be eligible for maintenance payments at the base rate of \$4,000 per mile effective January 1, 1958. Notion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Barrow, that WHERAS, the designating of Route 168 to follow the proposed Hampton Roads Bridge-Tunnel facility and re-routing of other existing routes in the Warwick, Mewport Hows and Hampton area, now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that, the section of Route 168 in the City of Newport News between its present intersection with Route 167 and the Morfolk-Hewport News Ferry Landing, a distance of 0.94 mile, to be dropped from the allocation of mileage subject to payment for maintenance at the base rate of \$4,000 per mile sumually as provided under Section 55-115 of the 1850 Code of Virginia, as smended, effective October 51, 1857. Also, that the section of Route 168 dropped from the primary route extension, a length of 0.94 mile, be added for maintenance payment at the base rate of \$500 per mile as provided under Section 53-115.2 of the Code of Virginia, as smended, effective October 51, 1957. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawle, seconded by Mr. Barrow, that, WHEREAS, Virginia State Route 168 is to be rerouted over the new Humpton Roads Bridge-Tunnel facility and will necessitate adjustments in rerouting of other primary route extensions within the Cities of Warrick, Newport News and Hampton, now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the route redesignations be made as follows: Route 188 - from a connection with present Route 188 in the City of Warnick southerly along the proposed Hampton Roads Bridge-Tunnel approach route through the Cities of Warwick and Hampton, eliminating its present routing between its connection with the Hempton Roads Bridge-Turnel approach route in the City of Warwick and the present Norfolk-Newport News Ferry Landing in the City of Newport News. Route 187 - from its connection with present Route 188 northerly along present Route 168 to connect with Route 145 in Newport News. Route 143 - beginning at the Old Point Ferry Landing in the City of Rempton and replacing Route 80 to its connection with the Hampton Roads Bridge-Tunnel approach route, and continuing westerly to overlap Boute 60 to its commection with present Route 145, thence over present Route 145 to its present intersection with present Routs 168 in the City of Newport News, themes northerly, replacing present Route 168 to its connection with the Hampton Roads Bridge-Tunnel approach route in the City of Warwick. Also, due to this easterly extension of Route 145, present Route 60 is to be dropped between its connection with the Hampton Roads Bridge-Tunnel approach route and the Old Foint Ferry Lending in the City of Hampton. Motion carried.

MHEREAS, on October 8, 1957, under the Emargemay provisions of Section 9-6.5 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, the State Highway Commission of Virginia adopted rules and regulations covering the use of Hampton Roads Bridge-Tunnel Project, which emargemay proceedings are hereby superseded; and WHEMEAS, on October 5, 1967, the Hotica concerning the holding of a Public Hearing to discuss these rules and regulations required by Section 9-6.4 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as mended, was given; and WHEMEAS, on Hovember 7, 1957, a Public Hearing was held by the Commission at Lexington, Virginia; and, WHEMEAS, all parties present were given an opportunity to submit objections, amendments, evidence and arguments; and, WHEMEAS, the matters which were presented have been considered; HOW THEMEFORE, HE IT RESOLVED, that the smended rules and regulations identified as "Commonwealth of Virginia, Department of Highways, Richmond, Virginia, Rules and Regulations Covering the Use of Hampton Roads Bridge-Tunnel Project" be adopted.

Noved by Mr. Rawla, seconded by Mr. May, that the Commission award contract on bids received November 20 for the construction of Projects 2748-05; 2796-05-07, (New 0205-048-005; 0205-096-005-007), Route 205, 5.451 Miles E. Int. Route 501-WCL Colonial Beach, King George and Westmoreland Counties, to the low bidder, C. H. Lawson, Inc., Williamsburg, Va., at the bid of \$149,407.25, that 105 additional be set saide to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, \$1,551. for work by State Forces and \$27,600.00 for Right of Way, making a total of approximately \$195,500.00 chargeable to this project; to be financed with \$97,525.00 State and \$95,975.00 Federal Funds. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawle, seconded by Mr. May, that the Commission eward contract on bids received Hovember 20 for the construction of Project 7081-01-02, (New 0252-081-001, B-1), Route 252, Bridge and Approaches Hayes Oreek (Brownsburg), Rockbridge County, to the low bidder, Donald H. Selvage, Amberst, Va., at the bid of \$67,958.00, that 102 additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work and \$687.50 for work by State Forces, making a total of approximately \$75,450.00 chargeable to this project; to be financed with \$37,075.00 State and \$57,575.00 Federal Funds. Motion carried.

A discussion of prices being received on contract bids followed; the fact that bids were being received as low as 55% under the Department's estimate in some instances brought some interesting statements.

At 10:00 o'clock the Commission proceeded to the Anditorium for a public hearing on the location of a section of the Interestate System in the vicinity of Woodbridge, described as Project 0401-076-028 (old 8076-8029), Intersection of Houte 1 South of Triangle-Intersection of Route 550 Worth of Woodbridge, Prince William and Fairfax Counties.

Hr. Davis stated the purpose of the hearing and introduced to those present the Members of the Commission. Mr. Fugsts reviewed the situation briefly and those who wished to be heard were given the opportunity.

after hearing all those present who wished to be heard the group was advised that the Commission would give full and careful consideration to the problem and would make its decision at a later date.
