MINUTES

OF

MEETING OF STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION RICHMOND, VIRGINIA November 20, 1969

The monthly meeting of the State Highway Commission was held at the Central Highway Office in Richmond on November 20, 1969, at 10 A.M. Mr. Douglas B. Fugate, Chairman, presided.

Present: Messrs. Fugate, Baughan, Chilton, Duckworth, Fitzpatrick, Glass, Hairston, Landrith and Weaver.

On motion of Mr. Duckworth, seconded by Mr. Fitzpatrick, Minutes of the meetings of September 25, 1969 and October 9, 1969 were approved.

Motion was made by Mr. Duckworth, seconded by Mr. Fitzpatrick, that permits issued from October 9, 1969 to November 19, 1969, inclusive, as shown by records of the Department, be approved. Motion carried.

On motion of Mr. Duckworth, seconded by Mr. Fitzpatrick, cancellation of permits from October 9, 1969 to November 19, 1969, inclusive, as shown by records of the Department was approved.

The Commission again considered bids received on October 22, 1969 for a section of the Shirley Highway, (Route 95, Project 0095-000-101, C502, B602, B603, B604, B605, B606, B607, B608, B610, B612), which had been approved by letter ballot for award to the low bidder. Mr. Fugate said he was reluctant to recommend acceptance of a bid which was 41% over the Department's estimate, but pointed out that the only bid received on first advertisement of the project had been rejected and though the low hid of three received on readvertisement was still 41% above the estimate, a third try would probably result in still higher bids, because of inflation and labor cost in the Washington area. The members of the Commission were of the opinion that their earlier approval by letter ballot should stand.

The chairman told the Commission he had been having informal meetings with members of the General Assembly in regard to the need for additional revenue, and that he hoped to meet with all members of the General Assembly before the 1970 session.

WHEREAS, proper notice was given in advance and all those present were given full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the proposed project as planned, their statements being duly recorded, and

WHEREAS, the economic, social and environmental effects of the location and design of the proposed project have been examined and given proper consideration and this evidence, along with all other, has been carefully reviewed; now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that the location and major design features of this project be approved in accordance with the plans, following generally the existing location except for new location at the intersection with Route 60, as proposed and presented at said location and design public hearing by the Department Engineers.

WHEREAS, under authority of Section 33-35.4 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, request is made by the City of Hampton for maintenance payments at the rate of \$1,100 per mile annually on additional streets meeting required standards; also for a deletion of street mileage no longer eligible for maintenance payments; and

WHEREAS, adjustment—for additions and deletions of street mileage is necessary due to re-developed areas and to eliminate overlapping mileage;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33-35.4 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, mileage adjustment for 14.13 miles of additions and 0.67 mile of deletions for a net addition of 13.56 miles of streets subject to payment at the rate of \$1,100 per mile annually is hereby approved for payment to the City of Hampton. The additions and deletions subject for payment are described on tabulated sheets dated September 3, 1969.

The additions, totaling 14.13 miles, and deletions, totaling 0.57 mile, increase the total mileage in the City of Hampton from 268.00 miles to 181.56 miles of approved streets, effective October 1, 1969, for the quarterly payment due after December 31, 1969.

Mr. Harwood stated that while he had authority to award contracts in emergencies, and after obtaining at least three quotations, he would appreciate approval. It was moved by Mr. Glass, and seconded by Mr. Hairston, that the Commission confirm the action of the Chief Engineer and approve the award of this work to 8. Vance Wilkins.

Mr. Beverley H. Bandolph, Jr. and Mr. William Usry appeared before the Commission to request that 12 ft. wide loads be permitted to use Route 17 between Bemington and Fredericksburg. This request was made in behalf of USCO. Inc. which was considering location between Remington and Bealeton of a plant for the manufacture of modular buildings. Letters from Fanquier County Economic Development Committee and the State Division of Industrial Development, recommending approval of the request, were presented. After some discussion, motion was made by Mr. Chilton, seconded by Mr. Fitzpatrick, that this section of read be added to the list of routes approved for movement of 12 ft. wide loads.
