November 11, 1971

MOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that applicable to Section 33.1-144 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, the portions of Route 314, totaling 0.743 mile and actually located in the Town of Blacksburg be discontinued as a part of the Primary System of Highways, described as follows:

Route 314 (Perry Street) - From the west corporate limits of Blacksburg to 0.20 mile east of the west corporate limits of Blacksburg.

MMEREAS, the University of Yirginia has agreed to construct a building to house the Yirginia Mighway Research Council on a long-term lease arrangement, and

MHEREAS, Dr. Tilton E. Shelburne was a valued employee of the Virginia Department of Highways, from 1944, when he was asked to head its research activities, until his untimely death in 1968, at which time he was Director of the Yirginia Highway Research Council, and

MHEREAS, while directing the Department's initial research effort, he worked with Department officials and with educators to select the site and organize a staff, activities which culminated in the establishment in 1948 of the Virginia Council of Highway Investigation and Research, sponsored by the Virginia Department of Highways and the University of Virginia, and

WHEREAS, throughout his career he laid great stress upon the role of the Council in training both practicing engineers and students in the fundamentals of highway engineering and took great pride in the accomplishments of his staff members and former students who developed under his tutelage as Director of the Council and Lecturer in the School of Engineering at the University, and

MHEREAS, recognition of the need for an interdisciplinary approach and application of scientific methods to the field of highways was a hallmark of Dr. Shelburne's guidance of the Council as evidenced by the early employment of economists, phychologists, and other disciplines, an approach to highway research which is now widely accepted and increasing, and

Shelburne as a well-deserved honor and a fitting memorial for his unique contributions to highway research in Virginia.
