MINUTES

MEETING OF STATE HIGHWAY AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

Natural Bridge, Virginia

November 16, 1983

The monthly meeting of the State Highway and Transportation Commission was held in the Directors' Room of the Natural Bridge Hotel, Natural Bridge, Virginia, on November 16, 1983, at 3 p.m. The chairman, Mr. Harold C. King, presided.

Present: Messrs. King, Bane, Brydges, Davidson, Forrester, Guiffre, Humphreys, Quicke, Smalley and Vaughan.

Absent: Mr. Smith.

Mr. L. P. Baker of the Department's Risk Management Office gave a brief overview of the safety program. Each year the Highway districts with the best record in motor vehicle crash prevention and personal injury accident prevention are presented awards. Mr. W. R. Davidson, District Engineer at Lynchburg, accepted the personal injury safety award on the District's behalf for the fourth time in the last six years; and Mr. H. L. Chryssikos, District Engineer at Fredericksburg, accepted the motor vehicle crash prevention award.

WHEREAS, the Highway and Transportation Commission is authorized to make certain payments to cities for street purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Highway and Transportation Commission has selected certain streets within the corporate limits of the City of Richmond for such payments; and

WHEREAS, due to mileage adjustments within the City of Richmond;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 33.1-41 and 33.1-43 of the Code of Virginia, as amended, the additions and deletions of mileage for payment on the Primary Extensions and "Other Streets" within the City of Richmond be approved as follows, effective July 1, 1983, for quarterly payments due after September 30, 1983:

Orleans Street	From 35th Street to Main Street	0.10 Mile
Main Street	From Orleans Street to Nicholson Street	0.19 Mile
	Primary Extension - Addition	(State Route 5)

The Primary Extension mileage, due to these additions and deletions, has a net decrease of 0.06 mile in the City of Richmond from 82.88 miles to 82.82 miles of approved streets subject to payment.

The "Other Streets" mileage has an increase of 0.26 mile in the City of Richmond from 696.21 miles to 696.47 miles of approved streets subject to payment.

WHEREAS, under authority of Section 33.1-80 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, request is made by the Town of Salt-ville for maintenance payments on additional streets meeting required standards;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments be made to the Town of Saltville on additional streets, totaling 1.85 miles, and meeting required standards under the aforementioned section of the Code, effective July 1, 1983, for quarterly payments due after September 30, 1983. The additional streets and mileage eligible for payments are described as follows:

Alleghany County - Route 615 - From Int. Route 18 to 0.50 0.50 Mile Mile West Route 18

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 128 of Title 23 - Highways, United States Code, and FHPM 7-7-5, a Location and Design Public Hearing was held in the Harrisonburg Electric Commission Building, Harrisonburg, Virginia, on September 7, 1983, at 7:00 p.m., for the purpose of considering the proposed location and major design features of the planned safety improvement at Port Republic Road Interchange on Interstate Route 81 in the City of Harrisonburg, State Project 0081-082-114, C-501, B-627; Federal Project AC-I-81-3()250; and

WHEREAS, proper notice was given in advance and all those present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the proposed project as presented, and their statements being duly recorded; and

WHEREAS, the economic, social and environmental effects of the proposed project have been examined and given proper consideration, and this evidence, along with all other, has been carefully reviewed;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the location and major design features of this project be approved in accordance with the plan as proposed and presented at the said Location and Design Public Hearing by the Department's Engineers.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING DBE Program

MEMORANDUM

To: Honorable Andrew B. Fogarty

As per our discussion with members of my staff, your office, and Secretary Diener and Carolyn Jefferson-Moss this day, we are asking your concurrence in the Special Provisions.

Under the Department of Highways and Transportation's current Special Provisions covering contract requirements for the utilization of DBEs, the contractor is obligated to furnish a plan for utilizing DBEs during the various phases of operation shown on the Schedule of Operations. The DBE Plans and Schedule of Operations are required to be submitted subsequent to award of the contract and within thirty days after the date of the Notice to Proceed. Names of DBEs, specific work that they are to perform and the dollar amount to be paid to DBEs are to be submitted prior to beginning the phase during which DBE utilization is to occur.

The U. S. Department of Transportation regulations implementing the Surface Transportation Assistance Act of 1982 require that DBEs to be utilized on a contract be named prior to award of the contract. Inasmuch as there is a slight discrepancy between the Department's Special Provisions and the DOT regulations concerning the time for submission of DBE names, it has been determined that the Department should request, through the Federal Highway Administration, a variance from this part of the regulation to permit submission of DBE names subsequent to award of contract.

It has further been determined that in order to obtain DBE names earlier than is required under current Special Provisions, the Special Provisions will be revised to require submission of such names as a part of the plan for utilization of DBEs within thirty days after the date of the notice to proceed. Sanctions for failure to carry out the plan will remain as currently required in the Special Provision.

The request for variation will include a request that the proposed changes in the Special Provision be accepted on an interim basis in order to allow for continued advertising until such time as the final DOT approval of the variance can be obtained.

In an effort to provide as much information as possible to Contractors concerning available DBEs, the Office of Minority Business Enterprise will develop a directory of DBEs for distribution in December 1983. The directory will contain as much information as can be obtained from DBE firms concerning their capability, experience and capacity.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the COMMISSION POLICY AND PROCEDURES FOR DEBARMENT OF CONTRACTORS, Asphalt Service Company, Inc. was debarred from the Virginia Department of Highway and Transportation's list of prequalified bidders in June, 1983, based on its plea of guilty to violations of the Sherman Antitrust Act in Maryland, pursuant to Rule IV(A)(1); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the COMMISSION POLICY AND PROCEDURES FOR DEBARMENT OF CONTRACTORS, American Paving Company was debarred from the prequalified bidders' list on July 5, 1983, based on its affiliation with Asphalt Service Company, Inc. and the guilty plea of its President, Donald Kary, to violations of the Sherman Antitrust Act in Maryland, pursuant to Rule IV(A)(1); and

WHEREAS, Asphalt Service Company, Inc. has reached a civil settlement with Maryland, has cooperated with the appropriate law enforcement authorities in the bidrigging investigation, and, based on the testimony and representations to Mr. King, has not been involved in any collusive activity in Virginia since 1977;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Rule IV(D), it is in the public interest that the debarments of Asphalt Service and American Paving be modified to permit reinstatement to the bidders' list at this time based on the above-related factors; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such reinstatement be probationary for a period of five years ending November 16, 1988.

Motion carried.
