The State Highway Commission, with Menry P. Book, Secretary, James A. Bear, F. W. Davie, and Herace Hardaway in extendence, met in the rooms of the State Highway Department, 116 South Third Street, Richmond, Vizginia, on Tuesday morning, Dovember 29th, 1921.

On motion Mr. James A. Bear was deelgnated the acting chairman.

A delegation, headed by Ur. C.S. Likek of Ranover County, with the officials of the Town of Ashland, appeared before the Commission to advocate the adoption of the revised Negro Foot Route, as shown by recent surveys as the proper location for State Road No. 1.

Bernard C. Goodwin and George O. Green, representing Clifton Forge, and certain Wath County citizens expensed to advocate a State Read from Hillboro to Clifton Forge, via the Compasture Airer.

Go notion of Pr. Davie, encouded by Mr. Hardamay, the firm of Harmon and Harmon, and Harmon Gillespie are authorized to file, on bohalf of the State Righesy Commission, a plea, denying the jurisdiction of the Circuit Court of Taxewell County, in a certain bill in Chancery, exhibited against the Commission by John C. St. Chair, and others, and said attentoys are further anthorized on behalf of the Commission to defend said Chancery suit and file an enswer upholding the jurisdiction of the Commission in the location and establishment of the Highway in controversy, but it is understood that the Commission is not to pay any attorney fee in baid matter.

On motion of Wr. Davie, additional allocations were made to the following projects as enumerated below, vis;

Project 86. Route 14. Denville to Chathen, \$ 12,968.56

Project 861. Route 20. Skinquarter-Goods's Bridge 4,383.62

Project 99. Route 12. Realing to Vermon Hill 4,363.38

Project 149. Route 3. Tinker's Creak-Cloverdale, to cover cost of increased width from 12 to 16 feet 5,981.36

On project 75, Route 10, Bush River-Rice, the deficit of \$3601.55 is to be taken out of the balance of \$15,000 set made for the underpass at Rice.

The Commissioner reported that the actual cost of construction of Project 89, Route 2, Brems-Fork Union, (Raines Construction Company) had about equalled the revised

approximate estimate of the cost of construction of \$53,236.71, and was covered by the original allocation to this section of road.

The Highway Commissioner reported that on account of unforceson foundation troubles, the cost of the retaining wall, Project 97, Route 11, Big Stone Cap to Appalachia, had increased 150 per cent, but that the allocation as originally made to this section of read was sufficient to over the increased cost.

The Highway Commissioner recommended that Burgess and Atkisson be allowed to complete the work of grading and building the drainage etructures, and to put on the soil surface an far as soil is available on Project on the soil surface an far as soil is available on Project on 55. Route 12, Stuart, east, and that a convict camp be placed on the project to break stone by hand for the base. On motion of Mr. Davie, the Highway Commissioner's recommendation was approved.

On motion of Mr. F. W. David, R. L. Rell. Foreman, was sleeted a member of the State Traffic Police Force.

At Front Royal the Commission was joined by Chairman Wade H. Fassie.

Narren and Clarke Counties, the State Highway Commission with Commissioners Massis, Back, Boar, Davis and Hardney, in attendance, accompanied by George P. The Commission them adjourned and proceeded by automobile over Route 1 to Fredericksburg, where they bearied a train for Richmond.

Pi speed, Saturday, December 3, 1921;

The State Highway Commission, with Wade R. Enssie, Chairman, Henry P. Beck, Secretary, James A. Bear, Y. W. Davie, and Hornes Hardaway in attendance, met in the rooms of the Righway Department, 216 South Third Street, Richmond, Virginia, on Saturday morning, December 3, 1921.

After careful consideration, the Highway Commission decides that the appeal of the Board of Supervisors of Texawell County, the Road Board of Jeffersonville District, and cortain fresholders of Tasswell County, protesting against the location of that portion of Route Ho. 11
between the end of the improved read near Burkes Garden
Biding and the Town of Tasswell, following the route turning
to the last at the end of the present macedam near Burkes
darden Siding, thence in into Tasswell, following appreximately the Burkes Garden road, as determined by the Highway
Genericationer, George P. Coleman, is sustained, and the

The Commission than resumed the consideration of its biennial report to the Governor, and late in the day, after considerable deliberation, on motion of Mr. Bear, the following report and recommendations were adopted, the Chairman and Secretary being authorised to sign the same for the Consission:

Pursuant to Section 4, Chapter 31, Acts of 1919, we, the State Highway Commission, have the honor to submit this, our second bismisl recort, together with our recommendations.

The wembership of the Commission, and its organization, is the same as it was at the time of the filing of its first report, except the personnel has been changed by the appointment, September 22nd, 1921 of James

A, Bear of Rosnoke City, to encound the late James A. Mandy, Jr. of Matural Bridge.

At the time of the filing of our first report, the Commission had been in existence only a few weeks, and that time was, almost exclusively, devoted to such work as organization, and the holding of a series of open hearings at the State Capitol, to afford the public an opportunity to present to it dising for disuges in and additions to the System. These hearings were followed by the allocation of funds to the several State road projects. There was no time available to view the various routes conposing the 3800 miles of designated highways, or to porsomelly eximine the numerous legislative changes and additions brought to our attention at these hearings; or to go into the organisation of the Highway Department itself. or the laws under which the reads were to be constructed. sperated and mainteined; the scope of our sysort was thesefore necessarily limited.

since that report, for the purpose of becoming thoroughly convergent with the inquirquents of the
various sections of the State, from the local view point,
as well as from the broader sutleak of the needs of the
Ptate, as a whole, the Conwistian has visited every portion of the State and merconally inspected practically
every route embraced in the State Highway System, and
hundreds of piles of County roads secking admission thereto through legislative enactment.

The Commission, up to Rosmber 1st, 1921,

covering a period of more than two years, has devoted one hundred and eight days to highway work, at a total cost to the State of \$13,106,89, of which amount \$4780,00 hus been paid as a per dies, \$7306.26 sovering expanses, and \$1020.63 for clarical help. We have held thirty-seven meetings, numercus hearings, and twelve appeals from locations between designated points, of which appeals four have been sustained. Hach appeal has inveriably been held at the County peat of the contestants, or at the most convenient and accessible place to interested parties, and have been public hearings in every sonse of the word. When visiting the different sections of the Otete the Commission notified the public of its itinerary, and whenever it was suggested, hearings covering legislative changes and additions, allocations of funds, losses under the Robertson act, and many other watters apportaining to reads have cheerfully beam arranged. These tours, the hearing of appeals as to locations and legislative changes and additions, together with the uncossing cry for highways and better highways, have given the Cambiesian exceptional opportunities for noting the tremendous demand from every corner of the State for an intolligent, vigorous, and enlarged highway program.

The Highway Department, as at present constitried, consists of a State Highway Commission of five members, and a Highway Commissioner, all of whom are associated by the Generator; and an Assistant Commissioner, who, with the Commissioner, acts as Thief Augineer, a Second Assistant Commissioner, in charge of Accounts, an Engineer of Comstruction and Vaintenance; a State Ald Sugineer in charge of County work, an Engineer of Bridges, an Engineer in charge of curvoys, plans and estimates, a Mechanical Sugineer, in charge of repair shops and equipment; eight Division Engineers, located in different sections of the State, in charge of the work in their respective divisions; under these are project engineers, Inspectors, clerks, etc. A general drafting office is maintained at Richard.

We consider this organization adequate to take core of the present requirements of the Department, and with the secessary enlargement of the case, is prepared to proceed with a more extensive road building program, with efficiency and economy.

At the time this Commission was exceed the Highway Department had taken over for maintenance, approximately 1900 miles of the State System. The greater part of this milesge, however, had been constructed by Counties with State Aid and bond issues, and for the most part was of very light construction and in many instances poorly lugated as to mignesse, with excessive grades. Since that time there has been taken over for maintenance 765 miles, making a total of 1985 miles under maintenance; and 444.01 miles are being built which should be completed before the end of 1922.

In allocating the funds available for road construction, the Commission has endeavored to give due consideration to all sections of the State, at the same time, connecting up as many gaps as nossible; pursuing this molicy

it was necessary to provide for a great busier of small projects.

Desiring to preserve any asset contained in the improved stretches of roads, the Commission has advocated that they be rebuilt, and a suitable and durable top surface be placed on some as rapidly as the funds as vailable would permit, thus saving as such of the original cost as possible, and at the same time providing a good road expeditiously for moving traffic with dispetch.

The patrol system of maintenance has been adopted. Upon the completion of a read project, patrols are placed on it, and they are held responsible for its uphoop. This plan has proven very effective, and the results highly gratifying to the Department.

proved warsh 15, 1920, commonly known as the Robertson Act, various Counties, Districts, corporations and individuals have advanced to the Commission the sum of \$1,700,000, for the construction of certain highway projects; these funds have enabled the Commission to temporarily facilitate the construction of improved high-ways, as none of the money advanced has been returned.

During the greater part of 1920 sourcity of later and read building material and the excessive cost of same, coupled with continual embargoes and restrictions as to the use of railway equipment, greatly retarded the highway program. Unsettled conditions resulted in bids for highway work which appeared prohibitive, and frequently

they were all rejected and the work restructived only to have the offers rejected again. During this veried funds accomplated until the sum available for 1920 and 1921 emounted to ?11,110,790,54; the greater nortion thereof was available for 1921 projects, at prices at least 25% under those estainable during 1920. All of this fund has actually been spent or allocated to projects under construction, due to be completed in 1922; so that the Commission finds itself without funds to carry on the 1922 program, and is entirely dependent upon the recourses provided under the present laws, and such appropriations and provisions for additional funds as may be supplied by the Commissions for additional 1922 program. The funds that will be available under existing laws for 1922 construction are as follows:

RECONVENDATIONS:

<u>Piret</u>. The Highway Department has been greatly inconvenienced on account of delays in securing rights of way, resulting in loss of much valuable time,

and in many instances has been competted to pay enormously excessive decages for rights of way:

We therefore recommend and urge that the present condennation law be amended, if possible, so that the flighways can first be constructed and the damage, if any, essenced after the completion of the highway. This provision should be in addition to the present condensation laws.

<u>Second</u>. To resonmend that the Commission be given the right to design location of router between design nated points, in part or whole, should conditions justify ears.

Third. In many sections of the State, County authorities, feeling that unimproved rocks, embraced within the State Highway System will ultimately be improved by the State, he provision need to made by them for their improvement or maintenance:

We therefore recommend that all of the State Highway System be immediately taken over for maintanence, and that adequate funds be provided for this purpose.

Fifth. We recommend that no contracts for bighway construction be awarded until approved by the Highway Consission.

Fighth. In the construction of the Highway System, whose detours are necessary,

florenth. Being fully advised of tremendous sentiment for improved highways in every section of the State, and believing that the benefite derived therefrom far exceed the sent thereof, and pay a handsome dividend on the amount expended,

We recommend that the legislature provide the necessary funds for the completion of the Highway Syem ten in a period of six or seven years; It is the opinion of the Commission that the present organization of the

Highway Dopartment, with additions, can locate and construct the System in that period of time, with far greater efficiency and securosy than if constructed over a longer period.

To openifically recommend that at least six to seven millions of dollars per annua be provided in addition to the funds now evallable.

In regard to proposed changes in Moutes and additions thereto, the Commission recommends as follows:

ROUTS 1:

(a) That from this route the words "Eegro and Chilashurg" be eliminated, and that it proceed from Richmond via Selemen's Store by a revised location, passing through or mear the western limits of Achland; thence by the most feasible route to a point at or mear Spotsylvania Court House, and thence on to Fredericksburg.

From information furnished by the Department, taken from preliminary surveys, it appears that this route will be shortened by about eight miles over the present Begro Foot location, and will make unnecessary an extension of Route 9 for a considerable number of miles, which would have been necessary should may other route be adopted.

(b) That the word "Warfield" be eliminated and "Smaky Ordinary" be substituted therefor, as this is a more direct route and combines with Route 12 for a distance of about four wiles.

ROUTS 21

That the word "Palmyra" be striken out, in order that the Commission may consider and pass upon suggested changes of location between Fork Union and Gordonsville.

ROUTS 71

That there be added to this Route a sour to "Wakefield", Westmereland County, the birth place of Washington; a distance of less than two miles.

ROUTE 8:

Strike out the word "Mathews"; and in lies thereof adopt the resonmendations (b) and (c) under Route 9.

ROUTS 9:

- (a) After the word "Williamsburg", insert the following "Previdence Forge", a point near Sexbury", this being known as the Central Route and being more direct and a such shorter distance between Ridmond and Williams-burg.
- (b) After the word "Salada" add "to the Bridge at Urbanna", that accous may be given to the prineight boat landing in this vicinity at Urbanna.
- (e) Add "Gloucester Court House to Wathews Court House", to furnish the people of Mathews County a direct route to Rickmond, Desport Hows, and Morfolk, this

also being the principal mail route to Mathews County.

ROUTS 11:

- (a) Change this route to read "Graham, North Taxenell, Claypoole Hill, Rosedale".
- (b) Add a spur from Claypoole Kill via Reven to Grundy.
- (e) Add a spur from North Taxetell to
- (4) Eliminate that portion of this route from Fromont to Grandy.

As this will provide a more direct and better routh through Taxouell County, and an easterly outlet from Buchanan County; which is greatly needed.

ROUYE 12t

Add a spur from Franklin to a connection with the North Carolina State Rightsy System North of Muzfreesboro, to take once of traffic going South.

ROUTE 16:

Visitate the word "Stanley" and substitute therefor "Sperryville", as this will eliminate a very difficult and expensive crossing of the Blue Ridge at Wilne's Cap, and also gives a direct connection with the Les Highway at Sperryville.

ROUTE 17:

(a) Add a spur from Luray, via Stanley and

Shemandown, to a connection at or near Sixton, that a northern outlet may be provided for this valley.

(b) Himinate the word "Deerfield" and insert the words "Graigeville, Gosben", as we are of the opinion that this best serves the interests of this section.

SOUTE 20:

Add to this route a direct connection

from or near Burkeville to Regardle, as this provided
the shortest route from Richmond South to the Worth
Carolina line, with a very small additional mileage, and
will also take care of a large portion of the traffic
from Richmond to Lynghburg and the west.

ROUTS 21:

Change this to read "Tashington (Va), Verrenton, Fairfax, Key Bridge", as this coincides with the location of the Les Highway, and also provides a more direct route between the designated points.

ROOTS 261

That this route reasin as at present designated by the Legislature, as we are of the opinion that this best serves the interests of Bland County.

On motion of Mr. Davie, the minutes of the mentions of November 19, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, and 26, 1921,

after being read, were approved, and the Guirman and Secretary authorized to sign them as correct.

On motion of Mr. Bear the Socretary was inetructed to write Mr. C. H. Shepherd, Success, Virginia and to advice him that the State Highway Compission, after viewing, on December 1st, 1921, the suggested routes as set forth in his petition of October 13, 1921, decides that it would be imadvisable to change Soute No. 7 as now located from Front Royal to the Bouble Tell Cate, and therefore they cannot recommend such a change to the Legislature.

The Commission, on motion of Wr. Dayle, then adjourned to meet at the call of the Chairman.
