MINUTES OF THE SEVENTH LEETING OF THE STATE RIGH-WAY CONMISSION HELD IN RICHMOND, DECEMBER

15 and 16, 1922.

The State Highway Commission, consisting of H. G. Shirley, Chairman, Wade H. Massie, Secretary, I. Walke Truxton, H. B. Sproul and R. K. Sanders, met in Michael on the morning of December 15th and proceeded by automobile to inspect the Route via King William Court House to West Point where a public hearing was given to all those interested in the location of Route 9 between Richmond and West Point, returning to Richmond that night by train.

On the morning of December 16th, the Commission, all members being present, assembled in the Commission's room at the State Highway Department, and held a business meeting.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman and the minutes of the last meeting read and approved.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that bid of H. A. Donald and Company, Lexington, Virginia, on the seven reinforced concrete bridges on the road leading from Bine Ridge Church to Tinkers Creek, Project 169B, Route S, amounting to \$37,654.50 be accepted provided they will agree to do the work by July 1st, 1925, and that 105 be added for engineering and contingencies, making a total of \$41,419.95 chargeable to this project.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the

Brak Slant Ho. H ant Working Co. Jemmission accept the bid of W. W. Boxley, Resnoke, Virginia, on P.95 miles of bituminous mecades road leading from Blue Ridge Jhurch to Tinkers Greek, Project F169B, Route S, at his bid of \$215,545.0E and that 10% be added for engineering and contingencies making a total of \$257,207.32 chargeable to this Project. Motion extrict.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Massie, that all bids on Project 8-205, Route 1, Bridges over My River and Massepenar River, be rejected and that this work be readvertised. Metion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Traxton, that the bid bf the Springs/Varia Construction Company, Highland Springs, Virginia, be accepted on Project S-805, Route 1, between Predericksburg and Spotsylvania C.H. at their unit prices, and that the work start at Fredericksburg and extend towards Spotsylvania C.H. as far as possible, not exceeding the \$285,000,00 allocation. Metion carried.

Nevel by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Massie, that a contract fer constructing the approaches to the bridge over the Appointtox hiver, Project 8-2155, Route 19, be smarded to 0. M. Sanderson, iartersville, Virginia, at his bid of \$25,752.61, and that 105 be added for engineering and centingencies, making a total of \$26,106." thergeable to this Project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the bids of the Pittsburgh-DeMoines Steel Company, Pittsburgh, Pa., be secopted on Project 8215, Route 15, bridge over the Appointtox River, at their bid of \$80.218.25 and that 105 be edded for engi-

Book Pout No. 647 mm Tabley Co. neering and contingencies, making a total of \$82,840.07 chargeable to this Project and that an additional allocation be made to cover the cost of the bridge and approaches which amounts to \$48,845.88. Notice carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Massie, that all bide on Project F1861, Route 18, from Sandy River to a point 6.88 miles west, be rejected as all bids received were too high, and that the work be immediately rendvertised. Metion carried.

Moved by Mr. Massie, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the Houte from West Point to Richmond be through King William County by or near King William C.H. thence to a point at or near Sharon Church and from there ever Koute No. 15 to Richmond. Ayes; W. H. Massie, H. G. Shirley, R. K. Sanders, H. B. Sproul. Noos; I Walke Truntum. Motion carried.

Meved by Mr. Truxtum, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the location of Houte 1, between Selemon's Store and Frederickeburg, be in the general direction of the Old Telegraph Read to a point in the vicinity of Jerrell's Mill, thence over the most feasible line to Spetsylvania G.H. and from there in the general direction of the Richmond-Maghington Highway to Fredericksburg.

Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Senders, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the Commission scoops an edvancement under the Robertson Act to build Route 20 through the Town of Victoria. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Shirley, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that an extension of time be granted to J. L. Pitts, Jr., and Bress, on

Dail: Mad 76, 67-7 40 Tolley Co Project 161, Route 17, Healing Springs-Falling Springs, to July let, 1925, as per Commissioner Colemn's recommendation in his letter of December 9, 1982. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Trustum, seconded by Mr. Sanders, that an allocation of \$8500 be made for maintaining a detour around Project 175, Route 1, Falling Greek-Butch Cap Road, while being constructed, as per recommendation of Commissioner Colemn. Notion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sproul, seconded by Mr. Senders, that an allocation of \$8750,00 be made for the purpose of replacing and widening the middle plan to the bridge over Holston River, Route 10, Section 9, near Greendale, so as to accommodate a 19 foot readway at a later date, as recommended by Commissioner Coleman. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Truxtun, seconded by Mr. Sproul, that the resolution of the Commission awarding Project 5186, Route 7, Wildermose Tavern-Lignum, to Rodes and Maugh at their bid of \$57,084.88 be rescinded on account of Mr. Maugh making a statement to the Commission that Mr. Rodes had changed the bid without his knowledge and had bid \$8000.00 less than the amount be advised him he should bid on this work and that due to an unfortunate accident which happened to Mr. Rodes greatly shocking his veryous eystem and temperarily affecting his ability to make a bid, he would sak to be relieved from the contract, and due also to the fact that there has been found gravel adjacent to this Road of very good quality to build sections of it which will greatly improve

hick Hard No. 16-7 and Tables Co. the wearing value and that the Project be immediately resovertised calling for gravel where this material is available. Motion corried.

Moved by Mr. Senders, sesonded by Mr. Truxton, that provided the Virginia Railway and Power Company will agree to pay for the additional expense to widen the bridge over the appointtox River near Petersburg so as to allow 28 feet clear roadway that the Commission would grant them a permit to lay tracks on the Fetersburg Turnpike. State Highway No. 1, from a point near Stop 65 Colonial Heighte south to the north abutment of the Bridge, provided further that they will agree to pay \$75,000.00 for this permit and de all the necessary grading and drainings for the approach fills and other points to properly drain the highest where necessary and that at all times if it should become necessary to raise or lower the grade of the highway that they will at their expense raise or lower the grade of their tracks to conform with the grade now established or which may hereafter be established by the Highway Department, also that the Commission will contribute an amount to be agreed upon between the Chairman and the City of Petersburg towards the construction of this Bridge, said emount not to become available until the agreement has been ratified by the Commission. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Fruxten, seconded by Mr. Shirley, that notice be given that the Commission proposed to Locate Bonte 25 from Pearlsburg west through the Marrows along the Valley of New River in the direction of Gleolyn to the West Virginia Line and that it Dent Start Ha 16-7 was Maddley Co. be published in the News Paper of Giles County as required by law. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Sanders, seconded by Mr. Truxtum, that there being no further business before the Commission that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried.
