WHEREAS, The Virginia Department of Highways entered into a contract with the Atlantic Bitulithic Company, A Division of Warren Brothers, Richmond, Virginia, on March 29, 1965 for the construction of a project on Boute 64, described as Project 0064-127-071-C502, B607; 0064-043-101, C501, B661, B662, B653, B654, C502, B656, B656, B667, C503, B658, B659, B660, from 0.354 Mi. West of U. S. Route 360 to 0.061 Mi. West of Labarraum Avenue Extension, and

WHEREAS, This project was to have been ready to be opened to traffic on December 1, 1966 and completed in its entirety on July 1, 1987, and

WHEREAS, the project was not ready to open to traffic until July 7, 1967, and to date the project has not been completed, and

WHEREAS, in the opinion of our engineers, the contractor is not making the necessary effort to proscoute the work and his progress is most unsatisfactory, as evidenced by the above, and

WHEREAS, This has been called to the attention of the nontractor on numerous occasions, but no appreciable improvement has been noted; and

WHEREAS, The Chief Engineer advised the contractor on November 9, 1967 that unless the project was completed by December 1, 1967, he would recommend that action be taken to disqualify his firm from bidding on future work, and

WHEREAS, the project was not completed on December 1, 1987, and it has not yet been completed, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Atlantic Bitulithic Company, a Division of Warren Brothers, Richmond, Virginia, be disqualified from bidding on all State Highway Department work effective this date and continuing for a period of ninety days following the date of the actual completion of the project described above and the acceptance thereof by the Department.

WHEREAS, the Virginia Department of Highways entered into contracts with Alfred H. Smith, Branchville, Maryland, on Pebruary 8, 1965, for the construction of two projects on Route 84, described as --

- (2) Project 0064-408-001, C502, B661, B662, From 0, 316 Mt. W. Parham Road to 0, 706 Mt. W. Route 250, and

WHEREAS, These projects were to have been completed by November 1, 1966 which date was subsequently extended to August 1, 1967 on the C502 project; and August 15, 1967 on the C-503 project, and

WHEREAS, both projects were opened to traffic on July 19, 1967, at which time a decided slowdown in the work on the part of the contractor was first noticed, and

WHEREAS, the projects have nowbeen opened to traffic almost five months, and the completion date has been exceeded by almost four months, and

WHEREAS, In the opinion of our engineers, the contractor is not making the necessary effort to complete the work, and his progress is most insatisfactory, and

WHEREAS, this has been called to the attention of the contractor on numerous occasions and no appreciable improvement has been noted, and

WHEREAS, the Chief Engineer advised the contractor on November 9, 1967 that unless the project was completed by December 1, 1967, he would recommend that action be taken to disqualify his firm from bidding on future work, and

WHEREAS, the projects were not completed on December 1, 1967, and have not yet been completed, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the firm of Alfred H. Smith, Branchville, Maryland, be disqualified from bidding on all State Highway Department work effective this date and continuing for a period of ninety days following the date of the actual completion of the projects described above and the acceptance thereof by the Department, subject to review at the January meeting of the State Highway Commission, at which time Mr. Smith will be heard by the Commission.

MOTION CARRIED.

Moved by Mr. Baughan, seconded by Mr. Solater, that,

WHEREAS, by virtue of Chapter 263 of the Acts of Assembly of 1932, roads within grounds of state institutions were included in the Primary System of Highways; and

WHEREAS, under authority of Section 38-26 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, the Highway Commission may add such additional roads, bridges and streets as it shall deem proper to the Primary System of Highways; and

WHEREAS, request is made by Mr. Douglas Pence, Business Manager, Blue Ridge Community College in Augusta County for addition to the Primary System of certain newly constructed entrance road within the grounds of the college; and

WHEREAS, upon inspection by our Highway Engineers, the requested road addition has been constructed by the College to conform with standards required for acceptance as a part of the Primary System of Highways;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the newly constructed entrance road from intersection of Route 11 east 0.142 mile to the parking area, all within the grounds of the Blue Ridge Community College, be added to Primary System of Highways, and the new addition to be designated as New Boute 363.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 128 of Title 23 - Highways, United States Code, a Public Hearing was held in the Douglas Freeman High School Auditorium, Richmond, Virginia, at 9:30 a.m., on October 11, 1967, concerning the proposed construction of Route 6 from 2.027 miles west of the West Corporate Limits of Richmond to the Henrico - Goochland County Line, in Henrico County, State Projects 0006- 043-103, C503, C505 and Federal Project 8-528, and

WHEREAS, proper notice was given in advance and all those present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the proposed development as planned and their statements being duly recorded, and

WHEREAS, the economic effects of the proposed improvement have been examined and given proper consideration, and this evidence, along with all other, has been carefully reviewed. BE IT RESOLVED, that the construction of this project be approved in accordance with the general plan as proposed and presented at the Public Hearing by the Department Engineers. This proposed improvement generally consists of expanding the existing two-lane facility to four lanes symmetrically about the present center-line. The proposed construction will be confined to the existing right of way wherever it is practical to do so.

The additional mileage eligible for payment, described as follows:

Megdowview Lane - From Kenmar Drive to Mulberry Road - 0.79 Mile

The above addition of 0.79 mile increases the total mileage in the City of Martineville from 75.23 miles to 76.02 miles of approved streets.

North Mason Street - From Wolfe Street to East Rock Street - 0.06 Mile

The above addition of 0.06 mile increases the total mileage in the City of Harrisonburg from 43.39 miles to 43.45 miles of approved streets.

Bowles, Contractor, Richmond, Virginia, on October 30, 1964 for the construction of a project on Route 64, described as Project 0054-043-001, C504, B663, B664, B665, B643; 0064-127-070-C501; 0064-127-101, C501, in the City of Richmond and Henrico County, from 0.484 Mile West of Route 33 to the Richmond-Petersburg Tumpike, and

WHEREAS, these projects were to have been completed by November 1, 1966, which time was later extended due to conditions beyond the control of the contractor, to September 12, 1967, and

WHEREAS, the project was opened to traffic on July 19, 1967, and has not yet been completed and,

WHEREAS, it appears that the contractor is not making the necessary effort to complete the work, and his progress is most unsatisfactory, and

WHEREAS, the Chief Engineer advised the contractor on November 17, that unless the project was completed by December 8, 1967, he would recommend that action would be taken to disqualify the firm from bidding on future work, and

WHEREAS, the project was not completed on December 8, and has not yet been completed, therefore be it

RESCLVED, that the firm of E. G. Bowles, Contractor, Richmond, Virginia, be disqualified from bidding on all State Highway work effective this date and continuing for a period of 80 days following the date of actual completion of the project described above and the acceptance thereof by the Department, with the understanding that an exception will be made for those items of work which are off of the right of way and will not interfere with the movement of traffic over the project, and those items of work which were added to the contract at a late date and which the contractor can show that he has been held up in attempting to obtain materials for these specific items.

WHEREAS, during the course of construction it became obvious that a larger than anticipated amount of saturated soil unsuitable for embankment purposes was encountered; and

WHEREAS, additional efforts were required to secure suitable embankment material both from regular excavation as well as borrow excavation, together with other work relating to the stabilization and drainage of the saturated area; and

WHEREAS, these efforts and materials were provided at the unit prices as originally established in the contract; and

WHEREAS, the cost of such efforts together with other incidental items caused the contract to overrun by approximately \$64,000.00 or 38%.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Sate Highway Commission hereby authorizes the State Highway Commissioner to enter into, on behalf of this Commission, such supplemental agreements as may be necessary to cover the additional work.

WHEREAS, a Public Hearing was held on March 8, 1967, at 10:00 a.m., in the Circuit Court Room, Suffolk Municipal Center, Suffolk, Virginia, concerning the proposed ansatz attic : c. the Suffolk By-pass (South) from the intersection of Route \$3) ... 3 males south of the South Corporate Limits of Suffolk) to an intersection with Route \$37 (northeant of Spifall :, in Is semont County, and

WHEREAS, following the March 8, 1967 Public Hearing, the Highway Commission, on April 20, 1967, approved the general plan as proposed and presented at said hearing by the Department Engineers. This proposed improvement being on new location to the south and east of the City of Suffolk, and

WHEREAS, due to further considerations and developments, as the more detailed surveys were made, it was found that a revision in a portion of the location presented at the public hearings would result in a considerable savings in cost and this revision was sufficiently different from the original location to justify another Public Hearing, and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 128 of Title 23 - Highways, United States Code, a Public Hearing was held on October 3, 1967, at 10:00 a.m., in the Department of Highway's Suffolk District Office, Suffolk, Virginia, concerning the above mentioned Revision in the Proposed Suffolk By-pass from 0.8 mile east of the intersection of Route 10 (North of Suffolk) to 1.7 miles south of the intersection of Route 13-58-460 (East of Suffolk) in Nansemond County, and

WHEREAS, proper notice was given in advance and all those present were given a full opportunity to express their opinions and recommendations for or against the proposed Revision as planned and their statements being duly recorded, and

WHEREAS, the economic effects of the proposed relocation have been examined and given proper consideration, and this evidence, along with all other, has been carefully reviewed, now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that this Commission rescinds its actions of August 18, 1966 and April 20, 1967, concerning the section of the Proposed Suffolk By-pass covered by the Revision mentioned herein, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the construction of this project be approved in accordance with the revised plan as presented by the Department Engineers at said public hearing held on October 3, 1967. This proposed improvement is on new location to the north and east of the City of Suffolk.

Moved by Mr. Sclater, seconded by Mr. McWane, that,

WHEREAS, under authority of Section 33-35.4 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, request is made by the City of Lynchburg for maintenance payments at the rate of \$1,000 per mile annually on additional streets meeting required standards for maintenance payments;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments at the base rate of \$1,000 per mile annually be made to the City of Lynchburg on additional streets totaling 1.63 miles that have been constructed to meet standards set by this section of the Code, effective beginning October 1, 1967, with the first quarterly payment due after December 31, 1967.

WHEREAS, the economic effects of the proposed improvement have been examined and given proper consideration, and this evidence, along with all other, has been carefully reviewed, now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that the construction of this project from the east end of Chatham Bridge to 0.940 mile east of the east end of Chatham Bridge he approved in accordance with the revised plan as presented by the Department Engineers at said public hearing held on November 15, 1967, and the remainder of this project from 0.940 mile east of the east end of Chatham Bridge to 3.582 miles east of the east end of Chatham Bridge be approved in accordance with the general plan as presented by the Department Engineers at said public hearing held on February 18, 1966. This proposed improvement is on new location to the north of existing Route 3 from near the intersection of Route 218 to just east of the R. F. & P. Railroad crossing. For the remainder of the project the proposed improvement is generally along the existing alignment and consists of expanding the existing two-lane facility to four (4) lanes.

Mr. Kenneth S. White, Attorney and Mr. John Birch, CPA for J. R. Ford Company, appeared to urge immediate reinstatement of the company to the list of qualified bidders. Following their presentation Mr. McWane moved that the J. B. Ford Company be reinstated immediately. The motion failed for lack of a second and on motion of Mr. Landrith, seconded by Mr. Fitzpatrick, the following resolution was adopted.

WHEREAS, the State Highway Commission at its meeting on May 11, 1967, removed the J. R. Ford Company, Inc. from the list of qualified bidders for highway construction for bestowing gifts and favors on a Department employee, who was in charge of a contract the company had with the Department; and

WHEREAS, since the disqualification, the J. R. Ford Company, Inc. has taken certain steps to prevent a reoccurrence of the action which prompted the disqualification and has discharged the employees who were involved in the action; and

WHEREAS, the steps taken by the contractor have been reviewed and it is felt that these steps will reduce the possibility of any recocurrence; and

WHEREAS, the contractor has petitioned the Commission to be reinstated and the engineers of the Department have recommended such reinstatement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the J. R. Ford Company, Inc. is hereby reinstated on the list of qualified bidders effective January 1, 1968, and effective that date is qualified for bidding on future contracts with the Department.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such reinstatement is being made on a probationary basis and the engineers of the Department are directed to closely supervise the operations of this contractor to assure themselves that the contractor is complying with all of the directives and orders of the Department, Representatives of the mobile homes industry appeared before the Commission to ask that restrictions regarding movement of 12 ft. wide mobile homes, half houses, and bosts, be lightened. Those appearing included Mr. Beverly H. Randolph, Jr., Mr. Fred Henry, of South Carolina, Vice President of Safety for Transit Mobile Homes, Mr. Neff, President of Mobile Homes Association, Harrisonburg, Va. Mr. Al Underwood, Mobile Homes Dealer, of Blacksburg, Va., Mr. Ivon L. Hanenstein, Genl. Manager, Magnolia Homes, South Hill, Va., and Hon. C. W. Cleaton, of South Hill, Va. Mr. Fugate stated he would have data and recommendations presented to the Commission studied by the permit section of the Department and would then report to the Commission as to action taken.

Mr. Paul Johnson, Supt., Hydro Generation, and Mr. A. J. Dowd, Assistant General Counsel, of Appalachian Power Company, reported to the Commission on progress on the company's Blue Ridge Development Project, which is holding up proposed improvements by the Highway Department on Route 58 between Independence and Galax.

Mr. Fugate stated that the Highway Commission started making allocations for the improvement of this route about ten years ago and that about the time the Department was ready to begin construction the Appalachian Power Company moved to obtain a permit for a hydroelectric project in the area which would inundate practically all of the section of Route 58 which was proposed for construction. He said dalay after delay had been encountered by the power company in securing Federal approval of its project and that he felt the time had come when the Commission must make a decision as to whether or not it could longer delay the highway improvements for which the money has been accruing for some while and for which the residents of the area are becoming impatient.

Following the presentation of the Appalachian Power Company, motion was made by Mr. Sciator that the Commission defer action to go shead with the highway program on Route 58 until a progress report by the power company is made to the Commission in May, 1968. Motion was seconded by Mr. Fitzpairick and carried.

On motion of Mr. Landrith, seconded by Mr. Fitzpatrick, the Commission approved agreement of May 25, 1966 between the Commissioner of the Virginia Department of Highways, the Director of the National Park Service, and the Engineer Commissioner of the District of Columbia, providing for a Three Sisters crossing of the Potomac on Interstate Route 266 at the Spout Run Parkway location.

On motion of Judge Weaver, seconded by Mr. Landrith, the Commission voted to deny request of Henrico County for prohibition of truck traffic on Chamberlayne Avenue from Route 1 to Route 95.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:30 P.M.
