MINUTES OF MEETING OF STATE HIGHWAY AND TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

Richmond, Virginia

December 15, 1977

The monthly meeting of the State Highway and Transportation Commission was held at the Central Highway Office in Richmond, Virginia, on December 15, 1977, at 10 a.m. The chairman, Mr. John E. Harwood, presided.

Mr. Harwood introduced the new member of the Commission, Mr. William T. Robinson, representing the Fredericksburg District.

On motion of Mr. Crowe, seconded by Mr. Glass, the minutes of the meeting of November 17, 1977, were approved.

On motion of Mr. Crowe, seconded by Mr. Glass, permits issued from November 17, 1977, to December 14, 1977, inclusive, as shown by records of the Department, were approved.

Motion was made by Mr. Crowe, seconded by Mr. Glass, that cancellation of permits from November 17, 1977, to December 14, 1977, inclusive, as shown by records of the Department, be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Crowe, seconded by Mr. Glass, that the Commission approve additions to the Secondary System from November 17, 1977, to December 14, 1977, inclusive, as shown by records of the Department. Motion carried.

Mr. Hassell stated that he and a business partner own about 65 acres of land near the proposed Great Bridge bypass. He has advised the City of Chesapeake that the property will be made available at no cost for possible use as a site for borrow material, and Mr. Hassell wanted the record to state his involvement in this matter.

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-223 of the Code of Virginia sets forth that the General Assembly of Virginia has found and declared that it is ". . . in the public interest that access roads and bikeways to public recreational areas and historical sites be provided by using highway funds . . ."; provides highway funds for such purpose; and further provides that "The State Highway and Transportation Commission and the Commission of Outdoor Recreation are hereby authorized to make regulations to carry out the provisions of this section."; and

WHEREAS, the Commission of Outdoor Recreation and the State Highway and Transportation Commission have adopted a joint policy to govern the use of recreational access funds pursuant to Section 33.1-223 of the Code of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Chesterfield County has by resolution requested the use of recreational access funds to provide access to the proposed Point of Rocks Park, located off Route 745 in Chesterfield County, estimated to cost \$470,000; and

WHEREAS, this request has been considered by the Commission of Outdoor Recreation and has been found to comply fully with the provisions of Section 33.1-223; and

WHEREAS, the Commission of Outdoor Recreation has recommended the construction of the aforementioned access:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that \$200,000 from the 1977-78 recreational access fund be allocated to assist in providing adequate access to the Point of Rocks Park, located off Route 746 in Chesterfield County, Project 0746-020-196, C-501, contingent upon the necessary right of way and adjustment of utilities being provided at no cost to the recreational access fund, and contingent upon the additional funds to complete the construction on Route 746 required over and above the maximum \$200,000 recreational access funds being provided from the Chesterfield County regular secondary improvement funds.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Henry County has by resolution requested the use of industrial access funds to provide access to Temple Machinery Incorporated, located off Route 220 southeast of Martinsville in Henry County, estimated to cost \$69,000; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this request falls within the intent of Section 33.1-221 and has complied with the provisions of the Highway and Transportation Commission's policy on the use of industrial access funds;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that \$69,000 from the industrial access fund for 1977-78 be allocated to provide access to Temple Machinery Incorporated, located off Route 220 southeast of Martinsville in Henry County, Project 1350-044-204, C-501, contingent upon the necessary right of way and adjustment of utilities being provided at no cost to the Commonwealth.

WHEREAS, under authority of Section 33.1-43 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, request is made by the City of Lynchburg for maintenance payments on additional streets meeting required standards:

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that quarterly payments be made to the City of Lynchburg on additional streets, totaling 33.83 miles, and meeting required standards under the aforementioned section of the Code, effective October 1, 1977, for quarterly payment after December 31, 1977. The additional streets and mileage eligible for payments are described on attached tabulation sheets numbered 1 through 22 dated October 1, 1977.

These "Other Streets" additions, totaling 33.83 miles, increase the total "Other Streets" mileage in the City of Lynchburg from 216.95 piles to 250.78 miles of approved streets subject to payment.

WHEREAS, Section 33.1-221 of the Code of Virginia provides a fund for fiscal 1977-78 to ". . . be expended by the Commission for constructing, reconstructing, maintaining, or improving access roads within counties, cities, and towns to industrial sites on which manufacturing, processing, or other establishments will be built under firm contract or are already constructed."; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Frederick County has by resolution requested the use of industrial access funds to provide access to the proposed new facility of Ron McDole, Incorporated, located off Route 1322 in the North Frederick Industrial Park in Frederick County, estimated to cost \$19,000; and

WHEREAS, it appears that this request falls within the intent of Section 33.1-221 and has complied with the provisions of the Highway and Transportation Commission's policy on the use of industrial access funds:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that \$19,000 from the 1977-78 industrial access fund be allocated to provide adequate access to the proposed new facility of Ron McDole, Incorporated, located off Route 1322 in the North Frederick Industrial Park in Frederick County, Project 1322-034-145, C-502, contingent upon the necessary right of way and adjustment of utilities being provided at no cost to the Commonwealth.

WHEREAS, the Commission on July 14, 1977, by resolution allocated \$50,000 from the 1976-77 industrial access fund to provide access to the new facilities of Nordac Manufacturing Corporation, Tempco, Incorporated, and W. C. Gray Contracting Company, to be located in the Spring Knoll Industrial Park in Stafford County, Project 0618-089-155, C-50Z, contingent upon the industries' entering into firm contracts for the construction of their facilities, and the necessary right of way and adjustment of utilities being provided at no cost to the Commonwealth; and

WHEREAS, the designated industries have not as yet satisfied the contractural requirement; and

Mr. Wray, Director of Operations, reported on the bids received for the construction of a new ferry to be put into use on the Jamestown-Scotland Ferry System. Five bids were received, the low bidder being Wiley Manufacturing Company, Port Deposit, Maryland, a subsidiary of AMCA International Corporation of Newark, Delaware. Their bid was \$3,267,076, well below the Department's estimate. Coast Engineering Company of Norfolk, our naval architects, as well as Mr. Newby, Purchasing Agent, and Mr. Wray, recommended that the Commission accept the low bid. Motion was made by Mr. Hooper, seconded by Mr. Hassell, that the low bid be accepted and the contract be awarded. The ferry will be completed in the fall of 1979 and will be in operation by the end of that year.

The Commission heard a presentation from the Reverend Bernard R. Shrader, requesting an extension of Secondary Route 1210 to the Route 460 Bypass in Tazewell County and acceptance of the extension into the secondary system as an addition. This would require a break in the limited access features in order to provide access to a proposed new church, the Full Gospel Temple. The church proposes to bear all expenses involved in constructing the road to state standards. After some discussion, the chairman, upon suggestion of Mr. Hall, appointed a committee consisting of Mr. Hall, chairman, Mr. Fralin, and Mr. Landes, to look into this matter and report to the Commission at its next meeting, if possible.

The chairman related the latest developments regarding the wage rates and the construction of I-66 in Northern Yirginia.

The next meeting of the Commission will be held on January 19, 1978.
