NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the State Highway and Transportation Commission hereby requests approval of the applications listed on the attached sheet by the Federal Highway Administration and the Urban Mass Transportation Administration; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that subject to federal approval of the Section 18 grant applications, the State Highway and Transportation Commission authorizes \$152,128 in state aid for capital assistance from Chapter 850, Item 621.10 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1978, as amended, to the following local jurisdictions in the amounts designated, which is ninety percent (90%) of the local share of the capital portions of their Section 18 grants.

DuPout De Memours & Company, Inc., is undertaking a multi-million dollar project which will necessitate the construction of pipelines from its Sprusnce Plant in Chesterfield County, and in so doing has acquired options for most of the right of way easements needed for this purpose; and
